

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 6

proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas amending Article III, Section 51a, providing that the Legislature shall have the power to provide assistance to and provide for the payment of same to residents of the State of Texas who are needy aged persons over the age of sixty-five (65) years, needy blind persons over the age of sixteen (16) years; needy children under the age of sixteen (16) years; needy children under the age of sixteen (16) years; removing the Thirty-five Million Dollars (\$35,000,000) limitation upon expenditures for such purposes and providing for a limitation of Forty-two Million Dollars (\$42,000,000) upon such expenditures; providing a maximum payment of Thirty Dollars (\$30) per month from State funds for old age assistance; prohibiting payment of assistance after disposition of property under certain conditions; providing for acceptance of financial aid from the Government of the United States of America for such assistance; providing that the payment of such from State funds shall never exceed the payments from Federal funds; providing for the necessary election, and providing for the necessary election, and providing for the form of ballot, proclamation, and publication.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Section 51a of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended, and the same is hereby amended so that the same shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 51a. "Any applicant for or recipient of assistance, including the spouse in each instance, who shall dispose of any property after June 1, 1952, and any person who initially applies for assistance after June 1, 1957, who has disposed of any property water June 1, 1952, and any person who initially applies for assistance after June 1, 1957, who has disposed of any property was disposed of by bona fide sale and conveyance, and for value commensurate with the actual market value thereof, such disposition shall not affect eligibility for assistance if it be shown that all proceeds from such sale have been used by such person and spouse for normal living expenses, or for the purchase of other real property, neither such recipient nor spouse shall thereafter receive assistance until all net proceeds of said sale have been expended for normal living expenses; and in case of disposition of such property by gifts or for an amount less than its actual market value, such person and spouse shall not thereafter receive assistance until the expiration of the purchase of the property of an amount less than its actual market value, such person and spouse shall not thereafter receive assistance until the expiration of the period of time during which the net proceeds of said sale would have paid their normal living expenses had the actual market value been realized therefrom.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 37

proposing an Amendment to Article VII of the Constitution of the state of Texas by adding a new section after Section 11 thereof to be designated as Section 11a, providing for the investment of the Permanent Uni-versity Fund in additional secur-ities to those now enumerated in Section 11 of Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Texas; providing for the neces-sary proclamation and publication, and calling of an election

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Texas shall be amended by adding after Section 11 thereof a new section to be designated Section 11a, which shall read as follows

"Section 11a. In addition to the bonds now enumerated in Section 11 of Article VII of the Constitution of the State Texas, the Permanent University Fund may be invested in such other securities, including bonds, preferred stocks and common stocks, as the Board of Regents of the University of Texas may deem to be proper invest-ment for said fund; provided, however, that not more than fifty per cent (50%) of the said fund shall be invested at any given time in stocks, nor shall more than one per cent (1%) of the said fund be invested in seurities issued by any one (1) orporation, nor shall more than ive per cent (5%) of the voting tock of any one (1) corporation be owned; and provided further that stocks eligible for purchase be restricted to stocks of impanies incorporated within the United States which have paid dividends for ten (10) concutive years or longer immediately prior to the date of purchase and which, except for bank stocks and insurance stocks, are listed upon an ex-change registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission or its successors. This amendment shall be self-enact-





Bradley Gets Riled

Korea to Japan.

GEN. OMAR BRADLEY, who doesn't get riled easily, was pretty sore when he heard how one of his own army spokesmen had blurted out to a press conference the name of an airborne division which had been transferred from

The incident took place in a press conference at which the army was explaining how Chinese Communists had built up their strength in North Korea while we had weakened ours. What happened was that General Ridgway had cabled Washington for permission to transfer the airborne division in question to northern Japan because of the fact that the Russians had two airborne divisions poised on the island of Sakhalin, threatening northern Japan. While the two Russian divisions have only enough airplanes between them to move one division at a time, Ridgway wanted to be on guard against a surprise airborne

ttack on Japan. Washington accordingly gave permission to transfer the American airborne division back to Japan. Such a troop movement is highly secret. But the Pentagon briefing officer, anxious to prove that the Chinese have used the truce talks to build up their strength, blurted out the movement of this particular division to a roomful of newsmen to which foreign cor-

respondents are admitted. When General Bradley heard c this, he tried to call army chief of staff, Gen. Joe Collins, but couldn't reach him. So he summoned as sistant chief of staff Maj. Gen. C. L. Bolte and ordered a full investigation of who pulled the boner.





Youths Are Neglecting To Register

The number of 18-year old Texans failing to register under the federal draft law is increasing, Brig. Gen. Paul L. Wakefield state Selective Service director stated this week.

State draft headquarters records indicate that registration has been falling off since the end of March. Gen. Wakefield estimated that 2,000 to 2,500 18-year olds currently are unregis-

"We've been watching this situation closely since late spring with the hope that the trend would stop," the state draft distance of the state of the rector said. "We've asked the local draft boards to act under a provision of the regulations whereby a letter will be sent to men in their communities suspected of being delinquent under the law."

Gen. Wakefield reminded males subject to registration of penalties if convicted of failure to comply with the law. He quoted from a section of the law croviding maximum penalties of fine up to \$10,000 and imprisonment up to five years.

Under the draft act, all 18year old males are required to register with the nearest draft board on their 18th birthday or within five days thereafter.
