Continued from A1 In its ranking among area communities, this month's numbers place Muleshoe above eight other communities in the monthly numbers, and in seventh place in year-to-date totals.
In YTD actual dollars, Mulesho remains in second
place at $\$ 444.104 .70^{\prime}$ behind Littlefield with $\$ 752,342.18$ and on top of Fiona with \$311,126.74. the monthly totals, after Littlefield and Muleshoe, Bovina took third place with a 7.24 percent increase, and Olton took fourth with 7.09 percent.

For that matter, great nutrition is not my prime motivator when I want a Big Mac® or Quarter Pounder with cheeseat McDonald's ${ }^{\mathrm{TM}}$. couldn't care less about the fat content in the fries, though I care deeply about their taste.

double dip? Neither label helps much.
Labels. They can be frustrating and silly, confusing and dangerous.
Nowhere are labels more confusing than on church signs.
