Popular Recipe

ON CHILLY DAYS, pack something hot into the lunch box. Cocoa or chocolate are morale builders for the noon meal, and they'll stay hot in a thermos. On other days, fill the thermos with soup, easy to put in with a wide

Sandwiches in the lunch box are always moist if they're made properly. Contrast them with something crisp like carrot sticks, celery pieces, crisp cookies or even lettuce, wrapped separately in waxed

When you have lunches to pack for several people, bake your cake They're easy to in paper cups. pack and won't get messy.

Something sweet in the lunch box is a nice surprise, and gives good eating satisfaction. If you don't have cakes or cookies, what about some tarts, coffee cake, candy or dried fruit?

RECIPE OF THE WEEK Potato Pancakes (Serves 4-6)

2 cups finely grated raw potatoes

2 eggs 1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon salt 1 tablespoon flour 4 cup lard

Combine all ingredients except lard. Drop by spoonfuls into hot lard. When brown, turn with pancake turner. Continue cooking until brown on other side. (The mixture may also be baked in one large pancake in a hot oven (425°F.) for 15 minutes until each side is brown and crisp.) Serve with pot roast of beef.

Lunch boxes should contain something colorful to add appeal to their contents: olives, red or purple grapes, radishes, oranges, bright red apples or tomatoes.

Small jars with tight fitting covers make wonderful lunch box containers for such appetizing foods as puddings, sauces, salads and pickled fruits.

Thermos bottles for the lunch box stay sweet and clean if you wash with baking soda and hot water. Scald just before filling with hot foods. Leave the cork off when they're not in use.

Texas Automobile Property Damage Law

Place de la Concorde Never Too Peaceful

After nearly three centuries of fame, excitement and conflict, a beloved bit of Paris has just had its face lifted.

The new look on the Place de la Concorde is less glamourous than practical-a firm surfacing of stone blocks instead of the wooden paving trod by citizen, soldier and

sight-seer for the past 50 years. This innovation, however, is not likely to change the character of the celebrated quadrangle that has often failed its name as a place of peace and agreement, thereby playing a prominent part in the history of Paris and France.

The square was first laid out in 1763 when King Louis XV, was pleased to have an equestrian statue of himself set up in an uncultivated field west of the Tuileries. The field was accordingly tidied up and given the name: La Place Louis Quinze.

Tragedy struck there seven years later when a large crowd gathered to celebrate the marriage of the Dauphin, later Louis XVI, to Marie Antoinette. A rocket misfired during a fireworks display and the resulting stampede killed some 1,200 people, injuring another 2,000-a bitter omen of the blood-letting that was to come in little more than two decades.



THIS is as true of nations as of individuals. The story of the Hebrews in Egypt is one case in point. They had it hard, about as hard as any people who ever lived. They became slaves, and remained slaves for hundreds of years.

Humanly speaking, God's total plan would not have succeeded unless the Hebrews had gone through that "furnace of affliction." If Jacob and his family had stayed on in Palestine, there never would have been any Hebrew nation any more than there was an Ishmaelite

Somewhere, some time, those Israelites had to be forged into tempered steel, a sweet for God. And the slavery in Egypt was the first stage of the forging. It was a hard life: no doubt many died under the lash. But the hardy ones lived.

If Moses, when the time came, had had to take out into the wilderness a caravan of luxury-loving Egyptians, they would have wilted on his hands. It was because the Hebrews had lived hard in the slave-pens of Goshen that they could live hard in the wilderness when they were free.

Life Goes On

THIS is not the whole story, of course. Life, even the hardest kind of life, is not merely a preparation for battles to come. It can be worth living for its own sake. The trainee may find friends and happiness even in a very tough camp. And down in Egypt, in all the years of Hebrew hardship, life went on. People fell in love and were married, children were born, were brought up somehow, were taught the difference between right


