It can also make you better nourished, more physically fit, richer and ever smarter as you learn how


to outwit gardeners' enemies - from drought to potato bugs," says Robin Powers, who's paid — and expected to give advice.



Last permit granted for pipeline

California air quality agency gives its OK after 25 months

A unanimous vote by AQMI) board members to issue the air quality permit was interpreted as "some progress" by Sohio vice president Richard Donaldson, but he refused to make a clear cut statement about the company's plans. We have had no time to assess the matter turther, he said

Sohio has flashed off and on about its intentions since March 13, when its board chairman. Alton Whitehouse, announced that it was abandoning the Long Beach terminal because regulatory delays had made the facility no longer economically attractive to the company

Since then, after receiving promises of state and federal aid to move the project forward, the company has softened its position to say there is a glimmer of hope that it would go ahead with construction of the west east crude oil pipeline

In order to win permission to build the terminal and pipeline, the company had to agree to compensate for its air emissions by installing abatement device at other firms

This arrangement, called a trade off, was the first such compromise for a project of such magnitude in the country

The AQMD board at its meeting in Long Beach Friday gave Sohio two

It could install an \$80 million scrubber on a Southern California Edisor plant near the port terminal. The scrubber is a large and complex piece of equipment intended to clean sulfur oxides, nitrogen oxides and particulates from flue gases as they leave through the large stacks of the Edison plant

Or the oil company could guarantee the plant a 20 year supply of ow sulfur fuel, which would have the same abatement effects

The AQMD left the choice up to Sobio and the state Air Resources Board Both have indicated a decided preference for the scrubber. The

Normally, public hearings concern ing planning and zoning items are held early in the afternoon

Magnates is requesting zone changes on 57 398 acres of land on the southeast corner of FM 868 and Mid kiff Road from 1F L single family district, to LR 2 local retail district; Planned District for a housing devel opment and LR L local retail dis

The preliminary plat reflects more than 15 acres of land for retail and 9.7 acres for a townhouse development to serve as a transition area between the commercial portion and a housing subdivision to the south and east of the project

The developer has been working since January to get the proposed project through the Planning and Zoning Commission, with a recommendation on the preliminary plat not coming until last Monday

But that plat was sent on to the City Council subject to various condi-

Residents to the project have op posed it during Planning and Zoning Commission sessions, objecting to the space being devoted to retail and claiming not enough attention had been paid to drainage or a buffer

This shopping area would be locat ed directly across Midkiff Road from the Midland Park Mall, on which construction is beginning

A storm sewer installation project on Midkiff Road will be reviewed with the focus on whether or not the work should be completed under the curtent highway project

Quiet (so far) runoff election may heat up in last week

Midland's relatively quiet runoff campaign between school board in cumbent Ed Runsan and retired teacher Alice M. Greer may be about to liven up

Both candidates, interviewed by phone Saturday, agreed the last week of the election would see increased efforts to woo voters to the polls next

Without other races or the Plan O referendum to entice the electorate to the booths, the candidate with the largest personal pulling power next Saturday is likely to get the Place 6

The runoff was set up April 7 when

one-term incumbent Runyan led a field of three opponents, pulling 40 percent of the vote with Mrs. Green close behind with 36 percent.

Both candidates acknowledged run ning fairly low key campaigns during the initial election period with the hopes of having resources — both fiscal and physical - left for the runoff

With only a week to go, there's no need to hold back any longer

While Runvan laid out three major issues he plans to hit during the last week, Mrs. Greer said she feels the voters already know what each candidate stands for.

Everything I stood for has already been voted on in the first election. Now it's just a matter of who the people come out to vote for," she

Runyan's main issues, he said, are academic excellence, fiscal responsibility and board independence The most emotional of those issues

seems to be independence of the board If Mrs Greer were elected, he noted, there would be three ex-employees of the school district sitting on

the board Joyce Sherrod, who defeated in cumbent Ann Page for the Place 7 seat April 7, was sworn into office at the last board meeting just after her resignation as a Lee High School

The three ex teachers could form a coalition that easily might control the board, Runyan said

"I don't see anything wrong with having three teachers on the board. Mrs. Greer countered "There would still be four businessmen with more money than they know what to do with. I don't see how we could do any

More seriously, Mrs. Greer asked 'what's wrong with having teachers who have children's interests at heart? After all, the schools are teachers and children.

Any perceived conflict between Midland's teachers and the school board may be the deciding issue in the

campaign, Runyan said, since teachers historically have had stronger turnouts for special elections than the general public

While he has been painted as "antiteacher" by some, Runyan said, "I have been one of their strongest supporters. The only complaint they should have with me is that I sit on the purse strings a little tighter than the

He pointed to his support of the merit pay plan for teachers as an example of his support.

"I want our teachers to be compensated well for their work, but I want the most money going to our best

He said Barron intended to upgrade a temporary injunction to a perma nent order prohibiting anyone from ever discussing or making public the "in camera" or secret testimony and exhibits. That was the straw that broke the

camel's back," Strickland told The Associated Press broadcasters' convention

Strickland struck quickly and with no advance warning in seizing the

'The district attorney's office subpoenaed the in camera testimony and subpoenaed all the secret exhibits That, of course, was when Judge Bar ron had his temper fit," Strickland

"We discussed the fact that we were butting heads with a district judge, and that's not a particularly pleasant thing to have to do," Strick land said



affiliate companies," said Winston Barclay, district manager for TESCO in Midland.

Some 18 months ago, Barclay said, TESCO, Texas Power & Light and Dallas Power & Light upped the interest charged Texas Utilities Generating Co. for advance payments on electricity purchases. While the PUC had allowed 7 percent, the com-

panies charged 9½ percent.
"We felt that better reflected the current costs of the money," Barclay explained.

Under the order, TESCO will have to refund \$1.6 million to its customers, TP&L will give back \$1.15 million and DP&L will refund \$400,000.

Assuming TESCO chooses not to appeal the decision to the courts — a decision it is "too early to know," Barclay said - the refund would show up in the next two billing cycles in a reduced fuel adjustment charge.

For the average residential customer with a \$30 to \$35 electric bill, the refund would reduce the two bills by a total of 85 cents, Barclay said.

Most of the other items reviewed by the commission in the order favored TESCO, Barclay noted.

While TESCO will no longer be allowed to sell its sister utility TP&L electricity generated by its cheap natural gas, the practice in the past was ruled to be "in the best interests of the

customers," Barclay said. The exchange between the two companies was arranged when TP&L sold about 25 percent of its interest in a lignite power plant near Henderson to TESCO

The commission staff had recommended TESCO be ordered to refund more than \$17 million to its customers

because of the arrangement. "We were basically pleased" with the ruling as it turned out, Barclay

Higher interest rate seen as plus

WASHINGTON (AP) — The maximum interest rate of government-insured mortgages is rising to a record 10 percent, but the move could help many lower and middle-income fami-

lies trying to buy homes.

The half a percentage point increase, effective Monday, involves single-family houses covered by Federal Housing Administration and Veterans Administration insurance programs.

The increase should aid many buyers because more home owners will be willing to sell to those needing VA or FHA loans with their relatively low interest and down payment requirement, realtors and federal officials said Friday.

That willingness would stem from the sellers having to pay less money in "points" - a one-time premium charge imposed by commercial lenders to offset the loss they would incur lending money at the lower government-backed rates rather than at the going private rate.

The seller pays the points in this situation. The buyer pays a loan-origination fee to a financial institution, equal to 1 percent of the mortgage, to cover processing the loan applica-

The Department of Housing and Urban Development said the rate rise will substantially reduce the number of points charged. The savings to someone selling a \$50,000 home in Washington, for example, could be \$1,500 to \$2,000, said John Moening, a local realtor. "This will definitely widen the market," he said.

But government and private experts warned that the interest rate rise could hurt some borderline buyers whose incomes no longer will be large enough to qualify for the somewhat higher monthly payments required by loans carrying a higher interest rate. In other economic news Friday:

-The U.S. Court of Appeals ruled illegal several new plans that let commercial banks, credit unions and savings and loan associations, in effect, treat savings accounts as checking accounts. -Federal Reserve chairman G.

William Miller warned that the nation's economy is at a "very difficult turning point," and urged caution lest policy makers "trigger the recession we want to avoid. He said the next few months will be

critical in avoiding both a worsening inflation and a severe downturn. Speaking at George Washington University, Miller said he would be satisfied with overall economic growth between 2... percent and 3 percent in

the first half of the year. It grew only 0.7 percent during the first three

American Legion speaker salutes Vietnam veterans

Saluting the Vietnam-era veterans the war and the protesters as as "possibly the best patriots this country has produced," former American Legion state Commander Harvey Holcomb told members of the American Legion Saturday night the veterans of that era were finally ridding themselves of the stigma attached to the war.

Holcomb gave the address to some 100 Legionaires at the annual American Legion Spring Fling at the Legion Hall in Midland.

'They had to think about their decision for a long time after they made it," he said. "Patriotism didn't come as automatically as it did in other times.

It has taken a while, but the veterans of that war are separating themselves from the stigma thrust on them by a news media manipulated by and biased toward the anti-war left, Holcomb said.

"The news media presented the Vietnam veteran as responsible for

heroes," Holcomb said.

The protesters' logic that "a war that was politically wrong was also personally wrong" robbed the Vietnam veteran of the dignity of his service, he opined.

Since returning home, the veteran has fought the stigma attached to the war, been pelted with slogans like "hire the veteran and ex-offender." but is now pulling his way back to a normal life.

Employment problems faced by the veterans after Vietnam were caused by a recession, he said. Veterans who had been pulled directly from school with no job to go back to and government program that encouraged hiring non-veterans such as women and minorities faced other difficulties, he

But they are a class act, and they are doing the things needed now to overcome any problems they may face," said Holcomb.

Whalen Lake decision due May 7

AUSTIN - The Railroad Commission of Texas will decide on May 7 whether to re-open the 330-acre Whalen Lake near Andrews for the continued disposal of brine refuse from producing oil wells, in the Andrews

The commission's staff has once again recommended that the lake be open to brine, although the elected RRC members repeatedly have refused to re-open the lake.

The lake was closed under RRC clean-up orders last October following complaints lodged by a U.S. Department of the Interior agent and environmentalists that oil and sludge running into the salt lake was killing migrating waterfowl.

Though Whalen is at least temporarily closed, oil production has not been affected. Most brine produced from wells is injected to depleted wells. In its recommendations, the RRC

staff, including a geologist and a legal adviser, has offered this stipula-

-That the Dallas-based Whalen Corp., which operated the lake leased by Lamesa rancher Olin Nix, be in compliance with RRC rules on disposal of brine.

-That proper modifications be made of Whalen Corp.'s skimming facility to reduce (to nil, if possible) amount of oil and other sediments running along with the brine to the

-That skimming and dumping of filtered brine be carrying out during set "business hours" and the gates to the lake, 15 miles west of Andrews, be locked at other times to prevent outand-out dumping of non-filter (raw) brine from the oil patch.

-That the oil and grease content of the brine not exceed certain limits.

-That no raw crude oil, basic sediments and unskimmed salt water be discharged into the lake.

-That Whalen Corp. personnel report any line breaks or any unauthorized dumping into the lake to the

-That Whalen Corp. continue its clean-up operation at the sludge-polluted lake.

Stephen Fife tells different story

ODESSA - Stephen Patrick Fife, taking the witness stand in 244th District Court late Friday, told a different version of what led him to show officers the location of the body of Catherine Ann "Fifi" Murphy, than was told earlier in the day by law

Fife testified on his court-appointed attorneys' motion to have a statement he made concerning Miss Murphy's July 20, 1978, death suppressed as evidence in his trial on a charge of murdering the 19-year-old Miss

The attorneys, Royal Caswell and Cynthia Clack, during the nine-hour hearing which began at 1 p.m. and continued into the night following a two-hour dinner break at 5:30 p.m., called several witnesses in their attempt to show that Fife's confession was not voluntarily given.

The hearing concluded shortly before midnight Friday with Connally indicating he might make a ruling on the motion to suppress Fife's statement prior to the beginning of the man's jury trial at Fort Worth on

Connally ordered the trial moved to Tarrant County Criminal District 4 following a March 19 hearing on a motion for a change of venue.

The judge said Friday night that while he might make a ruling on the motion to suppress the statement, he could still change his mind any time prior to the start of the trial. The judge also reported Friday night he will probably rule Monday on

Anti-terrorism bill

Sen. Lloyd Bentsen has expressed outrage at sentence reductions for four Croatian terrorists who killed one policeman and disfigured another. He and every other American have every right to be outraged at this particular act.

The senator has called for early hearings on his bill to make terrorism a federal crime. This is something which simply must be done.

The Bentsen anti-terrorism bill would make crimes by terrorist organizations - such as kidnapping, sabotage, destruction of federal property - punishable by the normal sentence for the offense in question plus an additional two-to-10 year sentence. Two years additional would be the minimum with no possibility of probation or parole. In cases. where the victin of a terrorist act dies the death penalty could be invoked.

"I am outraged at the reduction of sentence recently made by New York Federal Judge John Bartels, in the case of a group of Croatian terrorists involved in bombing, killing and highjacking," Bentsen said in a letter to Sen. Edward Kennedy, chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee.

"As a result of this unjustifiably excessive leniency, these criminals could be out on the streets as early as Dec. 31 of this year. The sentence reduction is a mockery of justice and an open invitation to future acts of violence.'

Bentsen said further that he did not believe Congress ever intended to allow such leniency for terrorists who have caused death.

Terrorism is something which simply cannot be condoned in America. More power to Sen. Bentsen in his efforts in this regard.



Others targeted for political extinction next year - and already being probed for weak spots by conservative research groups appear to be Sens. John Culver of Iowa, Birch Bayh of Indiana, John Durkin of New Hampshire, Patrick Leshy of Vermont, Gary Hart of Colorado and Richard Stone of Florida, all Democrats.

The reactions of the intended victims have been mixed, though most of the incumbents profess to be unworried by the conservative challenge. More pugnacious politicians, such as Culver, are expected to face up to their right-wing critics and slug it out toe-to-toe.

But those who are less aggressive or less confident - have already begun shifting to the right, which in itself constitutes a victory of sorts for the conservatives.

Many of the liberals are also anxiously putting distance between themselves and President Carter.

Few talk about it openly, but the fear among Democratic liberals is the outside chance that they may do as badly as their former colleagues did last year, when such liberal stalwarts as Dick Clark of Iowa, Wendell Anderson of Minnesota and Thomas McIntyre of New Hampshire fell before the New Right's onslaught.

If the unexpected happens, and the Republicans manage to capture the Senate next year for the first time since 1954, the result would be a triumph of sweeping proportions for the right wing. Consider the committee chairmanships that would fall into the hands of arch-conservatives: Strom Thurmond, R-S.C., would take over Judiciary; Agriculture would be chaired by Jesse Helms, R-N.C., a longtime foe of food stamps and federal nutrition programs; John Tower, R-Texas, a Pentagon friend. would head the Armed Services, and a right-wing favorite, Jake Garn, R-Utah, would take over Banking.

As we have noted, there seems little likelihood of a Republican majority materializing in the Senate next time out. But if it occurred in 1982, as seems at least possible, such an arch: conservative lineup of Senate committee chairmen could effectively hamstring either a Democratic president or a Republican moderate president.

On the other hand, if a conservative Republican should win the presidency next year, his allies in the Senate could help him change the political direction of the country dramatically.

High and low offices are filled with jerks these days because in our media-dominated society the qualities of a successful campaigner bear no relationship to either character, virtue, intelligence or accomplish-

It's odd that some people who recognize that products of little intrinsic value can be successfully marketed do not also understand that the same thing can be done with people - not only politicians but entertainers, writers or whatever.

The irony of our age is that people trained to be entertainers or salesmen have been propelled by the happenstance of advancing technology into positions of awesome responsibility. We in the communications industry play a large role in determining not only public taste in books and ideas, but in deciding who the public will admire or what the public will worry about

The ability to communicate instantly with great masses of people was an old dream. How our forefathers must have agonized over the slowness of communication as they attempted to rally the nation to revolution. Lonely teachers must surely have dreamed of a day when knowledge could leap mountains and penetrate forests to find the children of isolated hamlets.

As happened in other areas, however, when the dream became reality, we were not prepared for it. We still aren't. By and large, we in the communications industry have simply grafted onto the new technology the same traditions, definitions, customs

and concepts we used in the 1920s. Welwere struggling and there are exceptions but for the most part the events which compose the world view presented by daily news on television and in the newspapers were selected by people trained to make judgments on the basis of the event's entertain-

Television executives who decide which people get access to millions of Americans to peddle ideas or books are making their decisions on the basis of the entertainment value of the guests, not on the merits or significance of the ideas or the books.

The only thing wrong with this situation is that we have inadvertently conditioned the public to regard the words "news" and "important" as synonyms and the public, on its own, has convinced itself that anybody who is "on TV" must be significant.

Thus, in the spring of 1979, we are confused, not by conspiracies or bad intentions, but-by our technology which, while it is neutral, has the power to invest importance and significance on anybody or anything on which it randomly focuses its energy.

Life has many paradoxes, however. I sit here bemused by my neighbor's sycamore tree, employing technology to write about technology, and all the while, I am scratching mosquito bites exactly the same way my cave man ancestors did and with no better re-

Though they're not as bad as we feared, Republicans still dangerous

AUSTIN - Republicans sure are a sneaky lot, and Bill Clements may top the list in that regard.

For years, most Texans "knew" Republicans practiced cannibalism, grinned over the eviction of widows and orphans into the snow, and probably didn't really like football.

And they knew that if a Republican ever became governor, all the gas and oil would dry up, every mockingbird in the state would moult and be struck dumb and the Dallas Cowboy cheerleaders would be put into costumes acceptable to the Ayatollah

Then Bill Clements was elected governor, and actually sworn in, and moved into the Governor's Mansion, and those events didn't happen (although the Railroad Commission reports oil and gas production has been

dropping).
Some folks are beginning to suspect that the explanation may be that Clements really isn't a Republican, suggesting that the real Bill Clements was spirited away, perhaps sold to a band of Romanian gypsies, and an imposter substituted in the gover-

Consider what the man in that office has done lately.

Oh, sure, he went down to Corpus Christi and visited evangelist Lester Roloff's homes, and restated his opposition to having them licensed by the state (making light of the fact that the facilities are being operated in

violation of current law).

But anyone could have done that. And he has cut a couple of hundred folks from off the state payroll (with some 24,300 or so more to go), but there are some Democrats (like Sen. Lloyd Doggett of Austin and Babe Schwartz of Galveston) who want to do away with whole agencies, even the State Bar. So that doesn't prove anything, either.

He has made it clear he doesn't think a lot of folks in Washington are playing with full decks. In charity, we'll let that one slide past.

In fact, Clements - assuming the gypsy theory is wrong - has been doing a lot of things a Democrat might do.

Admittedly, a Democratic governor wouldn't be likely to appoint the head of the Texas GOP to the Highways and Public Transportation Commission, as Clements did for Ray Barnhart. Probably no state GOP chairman would have taken the appointment from a Democrat.

But then, the man turns around and vetoes a bill which the truckers, bus companies and railroads are alleged to want, to make sure some smartypants Department of Justice lawyer doesn't come in and sue them for anti-trust violations.

What can that mean? Is he against free enterprise?

Then comes the capper — Clements tells an impromptu press conference that he'll veto an interest rate increase bill if lawmakers are so ill-advised as to send him one.

Now, does that sound like a Republican who's supposed to be friendly with bankers and savings and loan executives and such-like?

No, that puts him on the same side with Texas AFL-CIO President Harry Hubbard and the Texas Consumer

Many American families suffer from strain of changing times

On a speaking trip I met a man I hadn't seen for some time. Usually bursting with vitality and the joy of living, I noticed that he was really depressed. Upon inquiry he told me that his life was all messed up and he felt he was a failure.

"I'm having a barrel of trouble with my two teenagers," he lamented. "They have become completely alienated from us. Our 20-year-old daughter left home in order to 'find herself,' and my wife and I are worried sick since we haven't heard from her in weeks.

"Our 18-year-old son is a complete far-out. He insists on going barefooted all the time and wears dirty clothes. For one solid month he didn't take a bath. He smells to high heaven. It's a problem living under the same roof with him. We don't communicate anymore. Where in Heaven's name did I fail?" he asked brokenly.

There are quite a few families with similar problems. Young people are roaming around in search of some meaning that seems to be missing in their own families. Bewildered parents are shaking their heads in despair asking, "What can be done?"

One of the chief reasons for this situation is the radical change in background that has taken place during our lifetime — and the consequent changes in point of view

Most members of the older generation were brought up, if not under conditions of actual hardship, at least in times of economic austerity. We knew we had to fight for survival or starve. So our standards of success naturally become perhaps somewhat self-centered and materialistic.

Today's young people think in different terms. They want to reform the world right now. They have been raised, most of them, in an atmosphere of permissiveness that has left them highly allergic to authority.

This era of permissiveness is a reaction against the cruelty and brutality of corporal punishment in an earlier day. But it appears to have gone too far. Now we need a counterreaction - all the way from the nursery to the campus. And I think we are going to get it.

Many in this new so-called "now" generation are going to raise their children with a firmer hand. Of course they will give them love and a sense of security. And they will want their children to have concern for other people and an enthusiasm about

They will work at keeping the lines of communication open, and the generations will try to understand each other. There is always a swing of the pendulum. The generation of permissiveness will be succeeded by a generation of discipline.

Robert F. Kennedy said, "In my judgment one of the basic reasons we have had crime, lawlessness and disorder in the United States has been the breakdown of the family unit." And Felix Adler puts it this way: "The family is the miniature commonwealth upon whose integrity the safety of the large commonwealth

Much is being written these days about the American family. Where is it headed? Is it becoming obsolete? What abouth the moral decay of our

A nation can recover from its ills if the home fires are kept burning. The foundations of the kind of world we live in are laid in the home. It is there that we face together birth, death, disappointments and love. As a family we share our joys and our sor-

When we pour our hearts out to each other, we can be ourselves. In the home there is no need to feel self-conscious or be ridiculed, and we can even grumble a bit if we want to.


We need this home-style permanence more than ever today. In temporary relationships we miss the ripening and the harvesting of the joys and struggles that one shares in a

Because of changes in our economy and the mobility of families, there are too many temporary relationships today. Friendships are lost. People change jobs often. In former years families had roots. Grandparents and relatives lived nearby. Children were exposed to the tempo of an orderly neighborhood.

Today there seems to be less contact between parents and children. Many mothers work, at least parttime, and fathers are away all day. Children spend most of their lives in school with other children whose parents have similar incomes and live the same lifestyle.

Adults must be brought back into the lives of children and children into the lives of adults. Grandparents and other oldsters must get involved with youngsters and all must try to understand each other. They will find they can learn much from each other.

All must give of themselves, recognizing meanwhile each other's differences. Only in this way can the family survive, and survive it must for the family still in the foundation of a democratic civilization.

It's simple—dump the sludge in New Jersey

WASHINGTON - Almost every body (well, maybe 53 percent of everybody) wants nuclear energy, but nobody wants nuclear waste dumped in his own back yard. Just the other day South Carolina refused to accept the waste from the Harrisburg Three Mile Island Plant. Gov. Hugh Carey of New York, who originally agreed that his state would take nuclear sludge, has now changed his

mind. And so it goes. Most states will take the energy, but not the radioactive garbage that goes with it.

When I queried people about where the stuff should be dumped, the consensus of opinion was New Jersey.

"Why New Jersey?" I asked a New "Because New Yorkers always

dump everything in New Jersey. We've been doing it for years.' "Trash is one thing," I said, "but nuclear waste is another. I don't think it's nice for people who live in New Jersey to have all that nuclear matter piled on their shores.

"How would they know?" the New Yorker said. "They never go through their trash to see what's been dumped there. We built them the Lincoln Tunnel in exchange for letting us throw anything we wanted into their marshlands. New Jersey owes it to us. "All you say may be true, but I

know people who live in New Jersey. and they're adamant about not wanting other states to put nuclear refuse on their junk piles.

bling, and the price they have to pay for that is to put up with atomic tests right outside the city limits. If you're allowed to build gambling casinos, you should be willing to put up with a little fallout."

"I hadn't thought of that. But let us suppose New Jersey says no to accepting any nuclear waste, and even passes a law that anyone dumping it would be fined \$100. What would you

'They wouldn't dare! New Jersey needs New York. Why do you think they've let us dump our garbage there for so many years? Don't get me wrong. I have nothing against the people who live there, but we have to be practical about this. If states like South Carolina are balking about accepting nuclear sludge, the only place

left is across the Hudson River. I found that Pennsylvanians felt the same way about it as New Yorkers. A man from Philadelphia said, "We've suffered enough in this state. You can't expect us to live with this contaminated material forever."

"Where do you want it to go?" "What's wrong with Trenton?" "But that's the capital of New Jer-

sey!" I protested. "All right, then Princeton. They were one of the first to come up with the idea of nuclear energy. Let them figure out what to do with the

'That may be true," I said, "but don't you think each state should be responsible for its own sludge?'

In Washington I called the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to ask if it would permit New Jersey to become a dumping ground for the other 49 states' nuclear garbage.

'Only temporarily until we can find a safer graveyard for it."

"But isn't it dangerous?" Not if you put the nuclear waste in Glad Bags. They last forever."

Nurses reply

As registered nurses who work in the surgery department at Midland Memorial Hospital, we would like to express our feelings concerning our hospital in reply to recent publica-

First, let us consider costs. Supplies for the operating room are expensive. Suture, for example, is \$3 to \$10 per package. An average surgery case requires approximately 35 of these packages. This is just one example of many items that are not considered patient chargeable. Its cost is included in the operating room charge. According to our last annual report, the average charge per procedure was \$160.47; the actual cost was \$267.65 per procedure. In many instances, each surgeon has his own preferance in brand names of supplies. Administration has allowed the OR to stock several different brands in an endeavor to satisfy the medical staff; yet, the hospital must absorb this added expense. We must also remember that until last year, our hospital was funded by operational renvenue and private donations. This is the first year to receive tax funds.

Since our department is under administration, our working conditions have greatly improved. The amount of staff we have is adequate for our surgery load, and its quality has greatly increased. To reduce call-back expense and working hours we

are now staffed 24 hours a day, with a skeleton crew on the 3 to 11 p.m. and 11 p.m. to 7 a.m. shifts. They handle any emergency quickly and efficiently. Overtime expense has been greatly reduced except for weekend emer-

Administration maintains close communication with our surgery department. Our administrator and surgeons are in the department daily to personally see that each of our needs are adequately and quickly met, assuring there will be no interruption in patient care due to lack of supplies or equipment.

DIRT, SQUIRT & QUIRT Lack of rainfall dimming prospects

CHARLES W. GREEN Midland County Extension Agent-Agriculture

There still has been no significant and general rainfall in the Midland area this spring and each passing week without such moisture dims agricultural prospects for the coming season. The thunderstorms predicted on several occasions last week did not produce much precipitation over the total West Texas area. Some local areas did receive an inch or more of rainfall but most of the farm and ranchlands had only traces.

Those producers with irrigation water available are irrigating cotton land over for the first time, hoping that less wind and possibly some rainfall between now and planting will insure planting moisture. Pastures are beginning to dry and the lush weed growth that has furnished good grzing for livestock the past several weeks is beginning to taper off. Rangeland needs some good rainfall to bring on grasses for summer grazing.

As planting time approaches cotton producers should be aware of planting seed quality. Weather conditions last fall at harvest time caused some problems in getting good quality on seed saved for planting purposes by seed breeders and growers. Wet weather during the fall causes seed quality pro-

When cotton opens during wet weather, there is some danger of free fatty acid developing in the seed: Immature seed are often low in vigor even though they show satisfactory germination. High quality planting seed is basic to getting a cotton crop off to a rapid start, so every effort should be made to secure the best quality seed possible.

The cost of planting seed represents only five percent or less of total production cost. So, trying to cut cost here by purchasing so-called bargain seed can be more costly in terms of poor stands, replanting and finally low yields.

In some instances producers may have no choice but to plant lower than desired quality seed. In this case the best quality seed should be planted first when weather condition during early spring are more unfavorable for seedling emergence.

As the planting season advances and soil becomes warmer, the grower can use lower quality seed after the other seed has been exhausted. A good rule of thumb is to allow the soil temperature at the eightinch depth to average 60 degrees F. for 10 days before planting. A significantly higher percentage and more rapid emergence of seedlings will be obtained if this soil temperature is reached at planting. This is even more critical if lower quality seed are

In using low quality seed, the planting rate may be increased by five to ten percent depending on the level of seed quality. Growers should make sure that seed are treated with a recommended fungicide.

Cool, wet soils this spring are causing a number of gardening problems, a major one being a disease complex known as damping off. Damping off involves several soil-borne fungi which attack both seeds and young seedlings. Symptons of damping off include rapid death of young plants, seed decay in the soil, and dead seedlings before they emerge from

Close examination of damaged plants will reveal a water-soaked zone at the soil line. Other plants may be damaged less but will break over with the first

So gardeners should not plant until the soil temperature is right for the crop. Seed packets contain information on when to plant.

Applying the fungicide Captan prior to planting can help stop damping off. Apply Captan at the rate of two to five ounces per 1,000 square feet and incorporate it into the soil to a depth of three to four in-

Two vegetable crops that are particularly susceptible to damping off are green beans and okra. These two should not be planted until soils have thoroughly warmed.

Woman finds water by witching

Grandmother's wire rods lead to 500 wells

Don't call Ona Moore a witch...she'll agree. The grandmother, horse-breeder and owner of the Blue Acres Arena south of Midland locates the most

valuable resource in the west that way. Ona Moore is a water witch. For more than 30 years, she has followed the wire rods across the West Texas soil finding - by her own estimate more than 500 wells.

How does it work? "I have no idea," the grandmother confessed. 'But it works. We've tried it too many years for it not

Mrs. Moore first became interested in witching about 30 years ago after a relative located a water well less than 10 feet from a previously dry hole. She tried it herself when a friend sought to locate frozen pipes underground.

It worked, and by 1956, she and her husband (who has since passed away) had entered the water well-drilling business.

She says she has been successful on more than 99

percent of her expeditions. 'I've never gotten but one dry hole that was completely dry," Mrs. Moore notes. "I thought at the time that the driller stopped on a false red bed (a layer of clay located as deep as 100 feet beneath the surface, often marking the lower boundary of the water table). Whether it was dry or false red, I don't know," Mrs. Moore said.

According to Mrs. Moore, the power to locate water is in the hands of the witch. While some people. use the forked limb of peach trees, others use glass.

CORPUS CHRISTI, ing a "reckless campaign to destroy our schools" by Gov. Bill Clements, representatives of Texas' 15 largest urban school districts announced plans Saturday for a grassroots campaign to battle for a 9.8 percent pay hike for teachers in the state.

Rita Potter, president of the Corpus Christi Classroom Teachers Association, was appointed coordinator of the statewide political campaign.

A drive will begin Monday to gather signatures on petitions to Clements asking him to support the higher raises, she said. Teachers' rallies will be held, and a candlelight vigil will be staged outside the governor's mansion "at an appropriate time, she added.

Clements has said teachers should receive only a 5.1 percent pay increase, the same as state employees, and the House Appropriations Committee has made that recommendation, at a cost of \$315 million over

the next two years. The full House efied Clements on Friday, however, and voted to raise teachers' pay by 7 percent, in keeping with President Carter's voluntary wage guidelines.

"Our efforts are designed." Mrs. Potter said, "to impress on members of the Legislature that we will support any effort they decide to make to prevent the governor from continuing his reckless campaign to destroy our schools.

That could include mobilizing for the first override in 40 years of a gubernatorial veto in Texas, she said.

Mrs. Potter said she does not know what kind of a compromise can be worked out in the Legislature, but that teachers are seeking a 9.8 percent pay raise.

The announcement came during a press conference during a daylong "summit conference" in Corpus Christi of Texas State Teachere Association presidents representing urban districts.





Phychotherapist-writer shares dyslexic childhood in book

NEW YORK — Illiteracy is a form of blindness that Americans seem more and more willing to live with, and if they want it, they are welcome to it. But consider the predicament of the individual who has the will and the intellectual capacity to be a reader, but who suffers from a frustrating malfunction of the brain that makes reading difficult or

This is the problem of the dyslexic, an otherwise normal human being whose brain circuitry has a flaw that interferes with the power to sort out digits, letters and words in their proper order. It is a condition about which much too little has been written although, startlingly enough, some of the world's great writers suffered from it in youth. Flaubert, Yeats and Hans Christian Andersen were dyslexic, as well as Woodrow Wilson, our last literary president.

For the unafflicted, it is hard to conceive that the trouble exists, let alone imagine what it is like. In Eileen Simpson's new book, "Reversals" (Houghton Mifflin, \$8.95), we are told what it is like with heartrending effect.

The author, who was once the wife of the poet John Berryman, has written a confession (dyslexics tend to be ashamed of their problem) that vividly describes the torment of an intelligent child treated by family and teachers as a dunce. Later on, the story carries her through the humiliation of concealing her secret while moving in the high academic and literary circles to which she was admitted as the wife of Berryman.

Today, Simpson - recently widowed by the death pist and writer, whose short stories and articles have appeared in a wide variety of magazines. She is also the author of a novel, "The Maze," which many took to be based on her marriage to Berryman. Blonde and stylish, poised and very articulate, she seems to be talking about somebody else when she speaks of the child who grew up feeling that books existed to make her miserable.

It wasn't until she was in college, Simpson was saying in her Manhattan apartment the other afternoon, that she mastered the skill of reading enough to find out that books could be a great joy. "If I compare myself to the natural reader," she said, "I still have to be a good deal more attentive, and I need a dictionary about four times as much as you do. Apart from this, the only residue of her old trouble is a tendency to panic if asked to read aloud.

As a psychotherapist working mainly with children, she does not treat dyslexia. This is partly because working with dyslexics is a pedagogical specialty and partly because being close to the

problem wakens her old anxieties. When she was growing up in the 1930s, the scientific investigation of dyslexia had begun, but its findings were not generally known.

An orphan, she was reared by an unmarried aunt, who was a school teacher. The aunt meant well enough, but she treated the child's problem as an affront to her own professional skill. "To the parent, a child's inability to read is frightening,' Simpson said, "and fear makes the parent severe."

Through much of her school days, she got by on her wits, picking up what she could by attentive listening. To a degree, she was able to absorb printed words by tracing them with her hand and memoriz-

ing the feel, as though reading braille. When at last the world of books opened up to her in her college days, it was only because her intelligent curiosity was strong enough to make her keep struggling against the difficulty. Oddly, one of the first books to captivate her attention was Joyce's 'Ulysses." To her, the unorthodox style was no more peculiar or demanding than "Little Women" had once seemed.

The first one to let her know what was wrong with her was John Berryman, then an instructor at Harvard. Just before they were married, he received from her one of the strangest letters ever written by an intimate to a distinguished intellectual. "Deare," it read, "Time for olny a hurried note. M. and children well. Swimiming every day despite gary skies. Tomorrow we calabrent M's birthday. See you Thursday." On the evidence of this botch, Berryman diagnosed her trouble. Overjoyed to learn that it had a name, she tried to repeat it: "Lysdexia?"



"Still," said his ex-wife, "it was a very rewarding marriage for 11 years. He always read what he wrote reviewers, when it was published four years ago, to me. I heard every version many times." Here again, her background as a dyslexic was a sort of advantage. Berryman's eccentric way with language and leaps of logical sense were no problem to one from whom all language had once had the same difficulties. "In his last years," Simpson said, "we started to correspond again.'

Judging from her own experience, the best thing the parent of a dyslexic child can do, Simpson said, is read aloud to him, conveying the fascination of a story without forcing him to struggle through it

'What would have happened if I had been born later," she guessed, "is that I would have seen 'Little Women' on television and been tempted to find out more about the four girls by reading the book. We are so involved with the printed word that we forget how much was done in the past by people who couldn't read. I have an idea that there is a high incidence of dyslexia among architects. They find their lives happily fulfilled through their perception of forms and spatial relationships.

"The really remarkable dyslexics," Simpson said, "are the ones who became great writers. Yeats never got over his feeling of inferiority about his early backwardness. He always had an exaggerated regard for learning. The usual way for popular."

Debate on spending bill to continue this week

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) - Three days of bombast have put on a good show for the gallery, sent some state agencies "a message" and fattened the House's \$20.2 billion appropriation

Speaker Bill Clayton's hope of sending the 1980-81 state budget bill to the Senate by the end of the week vanished as fatigue, indifference and a desire to party or go home emptied the House floor Friday night.

Debate resumes Monday morning. The \$370 million left "on the table" for tax relief or special expenditures shrank to about \$213 million as the House logrolled and took care of the

A 93-25 vote Friday showed Gov. Bill Clements the difficulty of holding teachers to the same 5.1 percent annual pay raise as state employees are programmed to get.

The House upped the 5.1 percent teacher salary increases recommended by the House Appropriations Committee to 7 percent a year at a cost of \$106 million.

Teacher lobbyists in the gallery smiled but must have known the House vote would not translate into fatter paychecks unless the same pay levels are contained in a separate school finance bill.

And that bill must help school districts cope with rising utility and transportation costs. The alternative, one knowledgeable official said, might be local property tax increases that would be blamed on the Legisla-

House passage of the appropriation bill next week will just be a jumping off point for the rest of the process. Senators still must act. Then a joint conference committee will attempt to blend the two chambers' products into a single bill. And that bill - with no amendments allowed on the floor must win approval of the House and Senate before the Legislature adjourns May 28.

Clements could veto it, and that would mean a special session would have to start the process all over again.

House action Friday not only increased the teacher pay item but also restored \$8 million cut from The University of Texas at Austin's budget for faculty salaries.

Rep. Bill Hollowell, D-Grand Saline, said professors weren't working hard enough. If the University wants to restore the cut, he said, it could use its \$50 million-a-year kitty called the Available University Fund.

The Legislature, not the university, should control the fund, Hollowell said, "but the Legislature never had the courage to stand up against the rich fat cats who get appointed to the board of regents of The University of

Rep. Wilhelmina Delco, D-Austin, said UT professors teach an average of 13 hours a week, "comparable to other institutions and more than

Clements repeats pledge to veto interest increases

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) - Gov. Bill Clements says he will stick by his pledge to veto any bill passed by the Legislature to raise home mortgage interest, despite complaints from home builders.

"I hear no hue and cry from the electorate that they cannot find any houses to buy," Clements told a news conference Friday. "On the other hand there are a lot of people out there against raising the interest rate - about 85-90 percent according to a poll just made.

He said the poll was paid out of "my political funds," and did not cost the state anything.

Clements said he did not know the results of the poll until after he announced Monday he would veto pending legislative proposals to up home interest rates from 10 to 12 percent.

Published reports Friday quoted Dallas home builders and mortgage bankers as saying they can not get mortgage money from out-of-state investors because of Texas' 10 percent interest limit. The reports said national mortgage bankers were channeling million of mortgage dollars out of the state.

"I haven't talked to builders in Dallas and Houston but I have not received any communication they are in any crisis situation," he told a news conference.

"We will keep track of this on a monthly basis and if indicators show a crisis in Texas we will take appropriate action, if necessary call a special session. As I have said, I see no

crisis at this time," Clements said. Clements said he has directed his Office of Budget and Planning to monitor housing construction closely

in Texas during coming months, based on statistics compiled by the Texas A&M Real Estate Research Center. He said the center's figures on single-family housing starts in January increased 2 percent over January, 1978. Apartment house starts declined 18 percent.

Clements vetoes pawnshop bill

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) - Gov. Bill Clements vetoed a bill Friday that would have made it harder for new people to enter the pawnshop busi-

He said the bill "ostensibly started out as a 'law and order' bill' to curb fencing of stolen property but became "anti-free enterprise and special interest legislation."

As passed by both houses, the bill (SB166) would have required new applicants for pawnshop licenses to have \$50,000 in liquid assets while existing owners only needed \$25,000.

at Columbia today. Water stood knee-deep in neighborhoods within two blocks of the Marion County Courthouse on the town square. Health officials said they feared that the flood could sabotage the city's sandbagged sewage pumping station.

About 30 miles upstream at Monticello, the river began to recede. It stood at 33.5 feet Saturday morning, down from the crest of 34.1 feet on

Late Friday, highway officials carved a trench through Highway 98, the main road into Columbia from the east, to free floodwaters dammed by the road. The waters gushed across hundreds of acres of farmland to the south. Main roads to the south and east of the city were

closed and roadblocks ringed the town. Cleanup operations at Jackson, where 17,000 people were forced from their homes, continued Saturday. Jackson Mayor Dale Danks charged that the National Weather Service and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers gave inadequate predictions of the

Heavy thunderstorms rolled across much of south Texas early Saturday, accompanied by near-hurricane force winds, hail and heavy rainfall. Strong currents in the San Jacinto River forced authorities to permit only one-way traffic on a one-mile stretch

of the Houston Ship Channel. Damage along the San Jacinto will reach \$100 million, according to Dick Hawkins, Harris County flood control district coordinator.

CLOGHER, Northern Ireland (AP) - Bridie Cassidy, a 23-year-old schoolteacher of Mullaghmore, Tyrone County, and Leo McKenna, a 25-year-old painter from the village of Aughnacloy, six miles away, are up early that day.

It is their wedding day, Monday, April 16, 1979. Bridie spends the morning finishing the preparations and putting final touches on her wedding dress to make ready for the noon ceremony in St. McCartan's Roman Catholic Church at Clogher, Tyrone County, about five miles from the border with the Republic of Ireland.

The sun is shining as Bridie leaves for the church. It is an unusually warm Easter.

Her fiance is already at St. McCartan's, named for a local Irish saint who was a disciple of St. Patrick. Inside the old church are 100 guests.

One is Bridie's brother, Michael Cassidy, 32, a six-foot prison officer at Belfast's Crumlin Road jail. where members of the outlawed Irish Republican Army are confined. It's a dangerous job; 11 prison officers in Ulster's jail have been killed by the IRA. Last Christmas a gunman fired a shot through a window of Cassidy's house in Belfast. The bullet narrowly missed his 3-year-old daughter Rosa-

Michael, one of the relatively few Roman Catholics who work for Northern Ireland's security forces exact numbers are not given out — sits in one of the front pews with his wife Mary, 27, and Rosalynn, a flower girl at the wedding.

Michael's widowed mother, Mrs. Bridget Cassidy, 57, sits a few yards away in the same pew.

At 1 p.m., the Rev. John McKenna, the parish priest, finishes the ceremony and the happy newlyweds march down the aisle. The sun is still shining as they emerge from the church with their guests.

The wedding party poses for photographs, and Bridie and Leo enter their car for the four-mile ride to the Four Seasons Hotel, Monaghan, across the border in the Irish Republic, where a wedding cake and full reception await.

Michael, holding his little daughter's hand and followed by his wife, walks down the church path toward his car that is parked along the the roadway wedding dress now. lined with hedges It is just after 1: 15 p.m.

A two-toned orange and yellow Bedford truck with Republic of Ireland license plates drives up. To men wearing hooded parkas and carrying armalite rifles, approach Cassidy.

Seconds after the shooting, the gunmen leap back into the truck and drive off. They are seen going toward the border to the Republic of Ireland.

Rosalynn, some guests recall, falls across her father's body, her wedding day dress spattered with

Horrified relatives and friends cluster round the body and Cassidy's wife breaks into loud screams.

A guest rushes to the priest's house and telephones the local police station, some three miles distant. Father McKenna, who had returned to his house straight after the service, administers the last rites

Cassidy. 'I immediately went to the scene but there was nothing I could do except administer the last rites,' the priest says later.

At 1:30 p.m., police cover Cassidy's body with a blanket and then place it in their truck.

Cassidy's wife and daughter are taken to Bridget Cassidy's farmhouse where a doctor puts Mary Cassidy under heavy sedation. Grief-stricken relatives gather at the farmhouse, the reception and the newlyweds' planned honeymoon in Malta are can-


'He must have known me," she says. She did not witness the actual shooting, and in the first seconds afterward mistook the sounds of gunfire for "some kind of wedding prank."

At 3 p.m., newspapers receive a statement puporting to be from the Provisional IRA, which claims responsibility for the killing and says a prison officer is considered a "legitimate target" as part of the British security services.

Canadians to elect Parliament

By CHARLES HANLEY

TORONTO (AP) — Canadians choose a new Parliament next month in an election Prime Minister Pierre Elliott Trudeau says may determine whether Canada stays whole or loses Quebec. But voters seem to care more about inflation, unemployment and a tax proposal that could put more dollars in their pockets.

Much of the debate is over a tax break Americans have enjoyed for decades — the right to deduct mortgage interest from income taxes. A proposal by opposition leader Joe Clark to allow it in Canada is popular with the middle class.

But the 39-year-old Clark has an image problem. His style, voice and jowly looks recall former President Richard Nixon, and his inexperience troubies many Canadians.

"Trudeau's got to go," retired steamfitter Ronald Edwards told a reporter on a Toronto street, "but I don't think Clark

could stand up to the big-money

Most political specialists predict neither party will win a majority of seats in the May 22 election for a new, expanded 282-seat House of Commons. In that case, the party with a plurality will try to govern as a minority in Parliament.

It will require the support of a smaller third party, the strongest of which is the New Democrats, a socialist party that wants to pull Canada out of

The latest Gallup poll gives both the Liberals and Conservatives 41 percent of the decided vote, with 15 percent going to the-New Democrats. But 35 percent of the voters say they are unde-

Trudeau's Liberals now have 133 of the 264 seats in Com-

Trudeau, 59, has led the Liberals to victory in three previous elections and has been in office longer than any incumbent leader of a major Western nation. He

has the admiration of many, and even a book by his estranged wife, Margaret, packed with revelations of marital and personality problems in the Trudeau household, seems not to

have hurt him politically. When Trudeau dissolved Parliament March 26 as its maximum five-year term neared an end, he said the principal issue would be the fight to keep Canada whole in the face of Frenchspeaking Quebec's push for secession. Conservatives, who have virtually no following in Quebec, could not deal well with the issue, he said.

The campaign plodded along dully until Clark made his proposal to give tax breaks to homeowers, an idea that has caught the imagination of countless middle-class voters.

It would allow taxpayers to deduct up to \$5,000 a year for interest paid on a home mortgage, and up to \$1,000 a year for property taxes.

Clark contends the plan, which would cost \$1.6 billion, would make it easier for Canadians to own homes and would stimulate the sluggish econ-

Trudeau says it would help the rich at the expense of the poor and economists say it would worsen Canada's 9 percent inflation rate.

Alone of the three leaders, the New Democrats' Ed Broadbent daily criticizes a major influence on Canadian life - American control of industry, resources and culture. "We have got to cease being tenants in our own land," he told a crowd last

Clark blames Trudeau for unemployment andinflation and says the prime minister's tough attitudes on keeping Canada whole have fractured society. Trudeau says Clark's reluctance to assert federal power over autonomy-minded provinces would make him a "headwaiter taking orders for the

DUBLIN, Ireland (AP) - House Speaker Thomas P. "Tip" O'Neill and a congressonal delegation flew to western Ireland on Saturday as a furious reaction to his remark that the British treat Northern Ireland as "a political football" swirled about them.

Q'Neill refused to comment on the controversy as he left Dublin for a private weekend at Dromoland Castle, famed for its cuisine.

Egyptian elections set

CAIRO, Egypt (AP) - President Anwar Sadat dissolved the Egyptian Parliament on Saturday, clearing the way for the country's first multiparty elections in more than 25 years.

Sadat's decree, reported by the official Middle East News Agency, outlined the election process and also stated that 30 seats in the new Parliament must be held by women.

Parties must be formed by May 5 and candidates chosen two weeks later, when campaigning begins. The elections are scheduled for June 7. The 360 new members of Parliament, with 10 appointed by Sadat, will convene June 23, the agency said.



TEHRAN, Iran (AP) — Soldiers in the western town of Kermanshah are refusing to turn over to executioners a fellow enlisted man condemned to death for shooting anti-shah demonstrators, newspapers reported Satur-

In the first reported incident of serious resistance to a summary decision by Iran's Islamic courts, the soldiers demanded that Tajali Gorganli not be executed, saying he was merely carrying out his commanding

officer's orders, press reports said. In the two months since the Islamic revolution toppled the government appointed by Shah Mohammad Reza Pahlavi, revolutionary tribunals have tried and ordered executions of 149 men who served in the shah's re-

An Islamic court convicted Gorganli on Thursday. The soldier asked for and received a 24-hour stay of execution so his parents could be brought from his hometown for a last visit, the reports said.

After the visit Friday, the soldiers at Salehabad barracks where Gorganli is imprisoned refused to turn him over for execution and staged protest demonstrations. Authorities pleaded for the release

of the convicted man to avert bloodshed, but the soldiers reportedly refused

The army was the backbone of the

shah's power before it retreated to the barracks during the February uprising. Soldiers serving in it now also

served under the shah. In Tehran, meanwhile, three people were killed and four wounded in a shootout between revolutionary militiamen and former militiamen, according to press reports Saturday. The reports said the shootout erupted Thursday when members of the mili-





Major company reports to fuel tax bill debate

Like a string of fireworks, the latest profits of the oil companies are about to flash across the business pages of the nation's newspapers.

Occidental Petroleum's first-quarter profits soared 174 percent. Arco's are expected to jump more than 60 percent. Exxon's will probably be up 50 percent. Standard Oil of Ohio's may triple. And quarterly earnings of all the others are expected to average 40 to 50 percent over last year.

With President Carter declaring earlier this month that "unless we tax the oil companies, they will reap huge and undeserved windfall profits," this latest round of explosive profit gains is sure to prove an embarrassment of

As part of his plan to phase out domestic oil price controls beginning this June, Carter wants Congress to approve a new tax on the extra money most oil companies will now get as their existing oil reserves are pumped from the ground and sold at the higher prices. Abandoning the 51/2year-old complicated system will allow U.S. oil prices, which average about \$9.45 a barrel, to rise during the next two years to the level set by the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries' cartel. World prices are already at least \$14.55 per barrel and are certain to rise even more in the years ahead.

Although the profits the oil companies will be reporting in the next couple of weeks have nothing to do with Carter's future décontrol plan, they will fuel the congressional debate over whether to impose the 'windfall tax' and how the estimated \$14.2 billion in tax revenues over 3 years should be used.

'You tell me how high the profit figures will be," says James Flug, director of Energy Action, a Washington-based consumer lobbying group, 'and I'll tell you who will win the political fight over decontrol."

What the president sees as a windfall, however, the oil companies see as a reward for their diligence and a necessary incentive to drill further in search of more petroleum.

A study by Chase Manhattan Bank shows that during 1976 and 1977 a group of 28 multinational oil companies earned \$13.1 billion and \$14.4 billion, respectively. During those same years the companies laid out \$26.9 billion and \$28 billion for capital expenditures, of which \$14 billion and \$15.6 billion went to crude-oil and natural-gas exploration.

Another \$12.9 billion and \$12.4 billion was spent on pipelines, refineries, and other investments. According to Chase, only about 10 percent of the funds went to non-energy projects.

What's behind the rise in profits?

Are they big enough to attract capital to the oil industry in sufficiently large amounts to fund the increasingly expensive search for new oil sources? Are there better uses for that money than plowing it back into industry coffers? These questions lie at the heart of the debate over oil profits. The recent spurt in profits is largely

due to the shift in the oil market last year from glut to shortage. Oil supplies were tightening even before Iran's output was cut off during the revolution, industry analysts say, primarily because of the worldwide economic e coansion.

Since last summer Americans have been on a gasoline "binge." driving up the demand for low-sulfur, light





Liberian ship stirs up ruckus

A Liberian ship called the Hercules caused quite a ruckus in August, 1977, when it showed up in the Alaskan oil port of Valdez.

To the astonishment of the crews of American ships loading oil from the Trans Alaskan Pipeline, the Liberian ship also asked to be loaded up with Alaskan crude. The Hercules said it would then take the crude to the Amerada Hess Corp. refinery in the American Virgin Islands.

There was the equivalent of a chorus at Valdez saying: "Hey, they can't do that. That's against the Jones Act. A foreign ship can't carry American cargo from one American port to another. It's against the

But the chorus of protesters turned out to be wrong, at least so far.

The U.S. Treasury Department, which enforces the Jones Act, ruled that foreign ships like the Hercules could indeed carry Alaskan crude as long as the destination was the American Yirgin Islands. A federal district court and a U.S. Court of Appeals agreed.

The American Maritime Association has appealed the case to the Supreme Court, but unless the high court acts on the matter and overturns the lower court decisions, foreign ships can continue to haul Alaskan crude to the Amerada Hess refinery on St. Croix.

This unusual oil situation came about because the Jones Act, passed in 1920 to boost the sickly U.S. shipping industry, has one large loophole: It excludes the American Virgin Islands.

Because the New York City-based Amerada Hess has its largest and most important refinery on St. Croix in the American Virgin Islands, that oil corporation is now the envy of all the other petroleum companies.

Most foreign shipping costs are considerably less than U.S. flag vessels. And since high transportation costs are the big problem with Alaskan crude, many energy experts say that Amerada hess has come up roses with its legal way to use cheap foreign shipping.

Amerada Hess isn't disclosing how much it is saving by using foreign flag

A company official, when contacted by the Los Angeles Times, also refused to verify how much Alaskan oil it is refining. "The federal Maritime Administration says Amerada Hess may be hauling as much as 100,000 barrels a day of Alaskan oil - onefourth of the daily Alaskan total moved beyond the West Coast.)

Amerada Hess has long specialized in refining "sour" crudes, and its St. Croix refinery thus had no problem in taking the high-sulphur Alaskan

Company officials at Amerada Hess refused to discuss the matter, but some oil experts say Amerada, a onetime sizable refiner of Iranian crude, is making up the loss of that oil with the Alaskan crude.

Amerada's refined products go to markets mainly on the eastern seaboard. Although the corporation is little known and deliberately keeps a low public profile, it is among the 50 largest U.S. industrial corporations. (1978 sales: \$4.7 billion)

With its ability to use foreign ships, Amerada can choose among the international assortment of supertankers - the VLCCs (very large crude carriers). Some VLCCs are already in use by Amerada and are being sent from Valdez and around the tip of South America through the Straits of

Magellan. While this is a much longer route, the "round-the-Horn" shipping saves offloading and toll expenses through the Panama Canal - something that other oil companies now must absorb with their eastbound Alaskan crude.

The American Maritime Association has asked the U.S. Supreme Court to rule against Amerada Hess, Virgin Islands shipping loophole. The U.S. solicitor general is scheduled to make his recommendation sometime next month as to whether the Superior Court should take up the question.



into higher profits. The international oil firms just pass along higher costs imposed by the OPEC suppliers, analysts say, rather than widening profit margins. Unlike 1974, when the quadrupling of OPEC's oil prices did the same for the companies that owned shares of the OPEC crude, today most of the firms in the Mideast and many other OPEC countries are limited in the money they make per barrel.

But the higher prices set off reverberations elsewhere in the vast petroleum supply system. Alaskan oil, for example, isn't controlled by the Department of Energy, so those firms owning oil in the North Slope field benefit immediately from rising world prices.

The main effect, though, of rising prices on the income statements and balance sheets of the oil companies results from accounting reevaluations of inventories. Every major oil producer and refiner stockpiles supplies of crude oil and these phantom "inventory profits," as oilmen disdainfully call them, swell whenever oil bought earlier at a lower price now can command a new, higher price.

Inventory profits are only a temporary phenomenon, industry officials argue, because these stockpiles must be replaced soon with the highpriced oil that forced up the inventory values in the first place.

"Inventory profits are more trouble than they're worth," says one industry executive. "They inflate your earnings but drain your cash because you've got to pay real taxes on this phantom value.

What doesn't even show up on the bottom line, however, is the boost to the reserves of oil a company owns underground. As prices rise, the values of oil holdings rise with it. These increased values will only show up as profits when the oil is finally pumped out.

Domestic price controls held down the value of already-discovered oil in the United States, which is why there is such a storm brewing over what to do now that Carter has proposed lifting the controls. With some oil prices held as low as \$5.75 a barrel, decontrol rapidly converts the oil coming out of an old well drilled prior to May, 1973 from its low price to whatever price it can fetch on the open market competing against all other barrels of oil. Other oil wells will benefit to a lesser degree from decontrol.

That is what is meant by "windfall profits," for the company that owns the well gains simply through an administrative change rather than any effort on its own part. Some people claim that the control system was cheating oil producers out of what was rightfully theirs anyway or simy making refining the beneficiary of lower crude prices, but most industry officials concede that lifting controls provides an unanticipated windfall.

Nonetheless, oil executives from most companies argue that they should be allowed to keep these gains anyway. Even though they will come mostly from wells they drilled when the old prices were good enough to promise a substantial profit, the higher profits and revenues possible from decontrol will, they say, support further exploration for new oil.

Exploration for new oil is far costlier than it once was, since the world's supply of "easy" oil has in large part been discovered. Howard Bell, financial vice president of Standard Oil Co. of California, says his company last year spent \$21 million on a dry hole on Alaska's North Slope. Each of the unproductive holes drilled in the Baltimore Canyon costs about \$8 million, Bell estimates.

"The president's tax plan," a Mobil advertisement claims, "would impose on the American consumer the burden of higher prices without the prospect of increased supply by taxing away money needed for exploration and production.'

According to many independent observers, this argument ignores a crucial distinction, however. Besides making oil that will come from old wells more valuable, decontrol also ensures that any new oil will be sold at the market price, rather than held down. It is this incentive, outsiders maintain, that is the main spur to exploration rather than simply the amount of money a company has on "Oil companies are unlikely to do a

lot of new drilling unles they think the opportunity looks good that they'll be able to make money on what they discover," says Robert Stobaugh, coauthor of Energy Future, a Harvard Business School report on the situation. "You could have all the money in the world, but unless you think your future profit will justify the investment in new wells, you won't

And Rand economist Charles Phelps agrees: "Investment in exploration will proceed pretty much ndependently of internal cash flow.'

Political actions, such as President Carter's threat to force companies to invest in more exploration, could change this equation somewhat, but they can't alter its validity.

In response the oil companies argue that they shouldn't be singled out for a special tax that other firms don't have to pay because their profits are no better than those of other indus-

Critics of the industry contend that profits in oil are plenty big enough to encourage drilling and production.

At this point, the debate starts to resemble a group of medieval scholars arguing about how many angels fit on the head of a pin.

Last year's return on stockholders' equity (one measure of profitability) was about 13.9 percent for the oil industry compared with 15.1 percent for all manufacturing companies.

Houston said department statisticians estimate that "the actual viola-tion rate for sulfa," if all pork could be tested, is between 9 percent and 10.5 percent.

The Food and Drug Administration currently allows no more than onetenth of one part per million of sulfa residues in pork. The Agriculture Department is responsible for monitoring for violations

Most of sulfa residue shows up in the livers of swine after they are slaughtered, but traces also have been found in the red meat parts of

'Residue violations may occur when the drugs are not withdrawn from the hogs' feed for an adequate inadvertently on the farm, at feed mills and at various stages of marketing." Houston said.

## Savings, loans officials expect special session

By BILL KIDD

AUSTIN - Savings and loan officials are saying that they're afraid Gov. Bill Clement may be called on to live up to his promise to call a special session if the situation on mortgage loans reaches a crisis.

Durward Curlee, executive vice president, Texas Savings and Loan, League, says lenders were "keenly disappointed" at the governor's announcement he would veto legistation to raise the interest ceiling on mortgage loans from 10 to 12 percent.

Clements adds however, that he would call a special session to deal with the matter, if it reaches crisis

"We hope he'll stick to that," Curlee says, adding, "we expect it to get to the crisis point.

"We do understand that there's a lag time on an economic problem like this...sometimes it's more obvious to the people closer to it.

"We can't see any relief for months in long-term interest rates - There may be some fluctuations," he says. In the meantime, it appears savings and loan associations are pursuing the funds which are available to them even more vigorously

The number of applications for branch offices being received by the Texas Savings and Loan Department has been increasing over the last several months — with 45 new branch office requests filed with the department for the first three and one-half months of 1979.

Many of the applications are for locations in or near shopping centers, reflecting, Curlee says, the movement of the retail market in Texas. Savings and Loan Commissioner Alvis Vandygriff and Curlee both say

HB 937, which was considered by the House Insurance Committee during a meeting that saw members drift slowly away as the evening progressed, would set up a "file and use" system similar to that in use in several other states.

# Corporate profits come on strong

NEW YORK (AP) - Corporate profits for the first three months of 1979 appear to be surprisingly strong for the second consecutive quarter.

Banks and companies making computers, chemicals, basic metals such as aluminum and steel have reported profit levels well above those of the first quarter last year.

While the major portion of earnings statements from the January through March period are still to be issued, several private analysts predict that first quarter after-tax profits may be at least 30 percent higher than first quarter figures for 1978.

The first quarter figures I've seen so far have been very strong. My guess is when the figures are all in and get totaled up ... they will be embarrassingly large," said Bob Lewis, a Citibank economist.

But Lewis and others say some of that may be deceptive because of inflation, which has temporarily ballooned value of inventories, and because the comparison quarter last year was weak. Companies then were troubled by a nationwide coal strike and severe winter storms.

THE ISSUE OF corporate profits is particularly sensitive in light of the Carter administration's emphasis on wage-price restraint. The Commerce Department last month reported a 26 percent increase in profit levels between the last quarter of 1978 and the same period in 1977. While the administration said it had no intention of saying what was a proper level of profits, some inflation-fighters cautioned that the "appearance" of high profits would put American business on trial. And AFL-CIO leader George Meany charged that profits showed businesses were "gouging" the public with high prices.

The chairman of the Aluminum Co. of America, which reported a 137 percent increase in profits in the first quarter of this year from the same period in 1978, reflected some of that sensitivity in his comments at an annual stockholders meeting this past

'The mood of the times suggests that I should apologize and tell you why I'm sorry our earnings are so good. Well, I'm not going to apologize. I'm proud of this performance and you should be too," said Chairman W.H. Krome George.

Alcoa's earnings jumped to \$128 million from \$54 million last year partly on higher prices for aluminum and improved efficiency, George said. Last month Alcoa reduced a planned increase in its wholesale price of aluminum ingot to 3 cents a pound, a penny less than before, to comply with administration price guidelines.

Alcoa's performance was not unique. Kaiser Aluminum and Chemical Corp. reported a 129 percent profits gain to \$56 million and Alcan Aluminum of Canada reported a 60 percent gain to \$98 million.

CHEMICAL FIRMS also are showing sharp profit increases. Dow Chemical said its first quarter profits were up 37 percent to \$176.5 million; DuPont Co. showed a 48 percent increase to \$248.4 million; Union Carbide profits rose 58 percent; Stauffer Chemical's rose 16 percent and Celanese Corp. reported a 60 percent increase in earnings. Dow, one of the largest companies

in the field, predicted that such jumps would be short-lived because increased demand for petrochemical products was "triggered in part by the oil crisis and threat of shortages.' Customers bought more to build up inventories in advance of higher prices, or as protection against possible shortages. Rising oil prices were cited by some

airlines for profit losses in the quarter, despite increased traffic. American Airlines reported a loss of \$6.8 millon in the first three months of the year against a \$7 million loss in the same period last year. Trans World Corp. had a \$47.8 million loss up from a \$37.6 million loss a year earlier.

Among others who have reported earnings so far, Chase Manhattan Corp. reported a 78 percent profits gain while Citicorp earnings rose 18 percent; BankAmerica, holding company for the nation's largest bank, said its profits rose 26 percent.

These earnings reflect only a sampling of company profits. But underlying the generally strong showing are several factors that analysts argue may make profits seem better than they are.

LEWIS, AT CITIBANK, notes for instance "a tremendous surge in inflationary inventory profits," which by some estimates could account for as much as \$40 billion of the estimated annual corporate profits, which topped \$130 billion in the fourth quarter of 1978 and averaged \$118 billion after taxes for the full year.

Inventory profits "are a phantom profit" says Lewis. They are counted as profits because a company may buy its materials at one price but because of inflation during the period they are part of its inventory, it is able to sell them at a higher price later. The catch-up effect eventually takes that away, however, when the company has to pay higher prices to replace the inventory it sells.

It is partly for such reasons that many economists predict a tapering off of profits later.

# Refugees find 'new world' full of disease, despair

respondent Peter Arnett traveled 45,-000 miles over four continents to document the blight of the world's 10.5 million refugees. In this series he tells the story of the despairing people of the Fourth World, unwelcome where they are, unwanted where they want

#### By PETER ARNETT

DJIBOUTI (AP) - The greatest exodus of refugees in modern history is spilling over international borders all over the globe, creating a Fourth World of misery, disease and despair.

An estimated 10.5 million men and women and children today have no country. They have been uprooted by gunfire and revolution, shifting ideologies and changing maps, nationalism and racism and other follies.

Their numbers compare only with the millions who were put to flight during the two world wars when most of Europe was in disarray.

THE WINDS OF WAR have blown them across the rock-strewn mountains of the Horn of Africa.

They have fled genocide in Laos and Cambodia. The siren call of revolutionary lead-

ers has lured them out of Rhodesia and Namibia They chase the dream of a better life, plunging across the icy waters of the Danube river into Austria, and

China Sea. Where they land they are often unwanted.

bobbing like corks across the South

A SEARCH FOR THE WORLD'S new generation of homeless millions took an Associated Press reporterphotographer team to four continents. The journey inevitably led here to Djibouti. This storied city by the Red Sea, the last African outpost of the French Foreign Legion and, perhaps, for the thousands huddled in miserable camps in the surrounding black volcanic hills, victims of the fighting in the Horn of Africa.

Up in those hills was Mariam Aw Ardi, 71, squatting in flowing brown robes, twirling his worry beads. He had fled on foot from the troubled Ogaden, center of a bloody dispute between Ethiopia and Somalia, to join other refugees in temporary wooden shelters in the semi-desert.

"There was always fighting nearby," he said. "The Ethiopians confiscated all our animals. They kill everything they get near. They don't recognize the difference between men and animals.

THE OLD MAN'S confusion and fear were echoed in similar refugee enclaves around the world. Their plight fit a pattern:

Squalor, "I don't care where they put me," said tired Fatouma Al Aden, she waited outside the crowded, filthy Ali Sabieh camp in Djibouti at the end of a 20-day walk from Ethiopia. A

> Danger. When former Vietnamese interpreter Nguyen Phong Lam, 33, flung himself from his surf-swamped fishing boat and crawled onto the yellow sands of the Malaysian coast last January, he said, "I was set upon by angry inhabitants who resented my presence and beat me up before trying to push me back to sea." Lam made it safely, but hundreds of Vietnamese "boat people" have drowned off Malaysia.

> Hunger. Exhausted from their swim across the Mekong River from Laos on inflated plastic bags. Among village headman Tsia Pao Yang and 300 of his people chewed on cold rice as they waited at riverside for food and shelter from the United Nations. "We're starving," he said, but it was unlikely he would get much to eat.

And everywhere we went we found numbing hopelessness.

MANY REFUGEES LAND in poor Third World countries, whose resources already are over-taxed. Often local officials steal their supplies. Furthermore, some countries are, in effect, holding the refugees as hostages, demanding more assistance for their own people.

The flow of these desperate people is testing the depth of the western world's humanitarian sympathies, particularly those of the United States which beckons many of the refugees as the Promised Land.

The United Nations will spend about \$150 million on emergency relief in 1979, less than \$15 per refugee. The United States will spend \$570 million. But the real cost to the world in terms of the impact on the economy - will soar into the billions. And the human cost is beyond mea-

The mass exodus from European countries earlier this century-from Russia during the 1917 revolution, from Turkish Armenia in the 1920s, and from Nazi Germany in the '30s was by millions literally fleeing for

But after World War II, other political factors came into play.

The creation of the state of Israel put Palestinians in permanent camps in the Middle East. Revolutions forced thousands to flee Algeria, China, Cuba and Vietnam. And the continuing trickle of refugees from behind the Iron Curtain burst briefly into a flood when Soviet troops eracked down on liberalizing governments in Hungary and Czechoslova-

At first glance the remote Dikhil and Ali Sabieh refugee camps look like fields of collapsing parachutes.

Fierce winds in short order had shredded the camp's emergency tents. So the nomadic refugees gathered twigs, shaped them into oval "toukal" houses and anchored old sacks, cardboard, skins and the remains of the ripped tents for roofing.

FOR THE REFUGEES in the camps, there are no schools, no homes, and work, and almost no food. They live in a hot, harsh enviornment prone to earthquakes. It's sometimes 120 degrees in the shade and sporadic torrential rains often bring floods.

For refugees in the city, conditions are even worse.

In the Palous compound where 500 Fritreans live, abnormally high Red Sea tides flow waist deep through the squalid homes, often tinged red with blood from an adjoining slaughterhouse

"We have no birthdays, no marriages, no happiness," said Abdullah Hamet,71, the camp leader.

Dressed in immaculate white robes,

#### First baby crane dies

SAN ANTONIO, Texas (AP) - Officials at the San Antonio Zoo aren't counting their whooping cranes before they hatch, especially after a rare chick died Thursday immediately after hatch-

One of the rare eggs being tended by bantam jungle fowl hens hatched Thursday morning, but the chick died just after it poked its beak through the shell, David McKelvey, senior aviculturist at the zoo, reported Fri-

Two other fertile eggs are still being tended by the foster mothers, while two have been sent to the Patuxent Wildlife Research Center in Laurel, Md., for incubation, McKelvey said.

The avocado-sized eggs are from Ektu and Crip, the only two of the rare whooping cranes in a public zoo. Ektu produced five eggs before Crip died March 27 after three decades in captivity and produced three more afterward

Only five of the eight proved fertile, however, McKelvey said.





#### Billie Sol Estes subpoenas four

DALLAS (AP) - Paroled West Texas swindler Billie Sol Estes has subpoenaed U.S. Rep. Jim Mattox and three newspaper reporters for a hearing on a motion to dismiss swindling charges against him.

The hearing is scheduled for May 3 in Dallas.

Estes has been indicted on charges he masterminded and profited from a scheme involving the sale of non-existent oil field steam cleaners. He was convicted in the early 1960s of a similar scam involving mortgages on nonexistent fertilizer tanks.

Estes' attorney, G. Brockett Irwin, said Mattox put political pressure on the U.S. Parole Commission during their consideration of a proposed plea bargain agreement.



# Ethiopian land reform runs into economic snags

ADDIS ABABA, Ethiopia - A sweeping land reform carried out here four years ago has run into serious economic difficulties despite its enormous popularity with the peasants and success in rallying their support for the Ethiopian revolution.

Some of the problems stem directly from what a recent government brochure calls "The agonies of war" that have afflicted Ethiopia since shortly after the military deposed the late emperor Haile Selassie in 1974 and set

this once sleepy feudal empire on a

radical Marxist course. "Four years of brush fires, battles and a naked aggression (by Somalia) have left their mark on all sectors of the economy," the brochure remarks. "Other countries have successfully won revolutionary wars and built up their economies, but revolutionary Ethiopia inherited a fragile economic infrastructure which has been weakened by four years of constant

war.' The key issue for the military government has become how to get the peasantry, now organized into some

25,000 semiautonomous assiciations, to produce more and, above all, sell more to the food-short towns and cities where 3 million of Ethopia's 30

million people live. Some outside Western analysts wonder whether the government will have to resort to a "green error" to extract by force more food gains and cash crops from the peasan associations. It has already carred out a very effective "red terror" to eliminate its leftist and rightst oppo-

The government is counting mainly on "agitation" and "political educ-

tion" to persuade the peasants to cooperate voluntarily with its recently launched "national revolutionary development campaign.

In the past two years, the economic situation here has deteriorated sharply. The government has exhausted its once relatively large foreign exchange holdings, mainly buying Soviet arms, and it is now having trou-





# Different kind of flying rancher

He pilots an airplane with teeth and a menacing bok

The flying rancher was relaxing in his Rebel office in an isolated aircraft hangar on a 110-section ranch north of Midland.

He was drinking freshly-brewed black coffee from a throwaway cup stamped "'Ole Joe.

'Somebody gave me that," said Joe Mabee.

He was surrounded by scores of photographs of vintage aircraft and other memorabilia prized by airplane buffs and, more especially, by fellow colonels in the Confederate Air

Mabee is a high-flying colonel. Even the w.c. — the necessary! room — is plane fully decorated with wallpaper drawings of biplanes, World War II warbirds and other

vintage flying machines. Another flier and the colonel's lady, Van A. Van Wie, fixed up the office and touched up the colonel's airplanes to his everlasting pleasure and lik-

Magazines and books on flying abound. He's especially pleased with the new AirTexas Magazine.

'Some of those (magazines) are just plain silly," he said. "They tell you how to practice crash landings."

JUST OUTSIDE the office and nestled in the new and sturdy hangar was the epitome of Col. Mabee's flying interests: a Curtiss P-40N Warhawk. The 35-year-old fighter was decked but in Flying Tiger markings of the American Volunteer Group, led by Gen. Claire Chennault, in China before and in the early years of World

Curtiss turned out 13,783 of the P-10s, known variously as the Kittyhawk, Tomahawk and Warhawk. The P-40s flew the colors of 28 Allied

pations during the great air war. Mabee, to his fullest joy, has one of six P-40s still flying. The CAF's Ghost Squadron in Harlingen also has a Warhawk.

Mabee's craft is in mint condition. It's no toy, though it's somewhat of a plaything, since flying, to Col. Mabee, ts a hobby.

"I think the most thilling thing to fly is the P-40," said the 48-year-old colonel, who has logged 2,000 hours in his 13 years of flying aircraft from single-engine light airplanes to the warbird to a twin-engine executive jet owned by his father, Guy Mabee.

LIKE HIS FATHER, Joe Mabee is an independent oil producer-rancher. They moved who moved to Texas from Missouri in 1943.

"Dad runs cattle on one end of it (the ranch), and I run cattle on the other end," said Joe Mabee.

Petroleum is under much of that ranch land, which spreads over Anrews and Martin counties. "Oil keeps the ranches going," said

And oil keeps Mabee in planes and eeps the aircraft flying.

Joe Mabee, his father and his son, 28-year-old Guy, are all colonels in the CAF, which was "born" in the mid-1950s for the express purpose of preserving warbirds of the 1939-1945 era. After the war, most were "stacked pp, chopped up, and melted down" for the aluminum

The Col. Mabees - grandfather, ather and grandson - are the only bree-generation family in the CAF. The senior Mabee, though he owns he two-jet engine Cessana Citation bangared at the ranch, leaves the lying to his son and grandson.





# 'Hired guns' essential, hated

EDITOR'S NOTE — Good doctors are hard to find - especially when it cases. Time and intimidation are two resons. Thus lawyers sometimes must go to great lengths to find expert

#### By RICH KIRKPATRICK

HARRISBURG, Pa. (AP) - They are as hated as any gunslinger, accused of going from town to town taking money to blast away medical

Fellow doctors sneer "hired gun" or "prostitute" and are trying to rid the profession of their influence.

But to lawyers and plaintiffs, these expert witnesses for patients who file medical malpractice suits are bold, courageous and hard to find.

Only a few of the nation's more than 300,000 doctors are willing to testify against one of their own, trial lawyers complain.

"There are very, very few legitimate doctors who have the guts to get up on the stand and say someone has done something wrong," said a Pennsylvania woman who helps find such mavericks.

IN A NUMBER of medical specialities — notably neurology, orthopedics and cardiology - it is nearly impossible to find a doctor willing to accuse another of mistakes, lapses or incompetence, lawyers say.

"For a period I could not find a neurosurgeon willing to testify against another neurosurgeon," said Marvin Ellin, a Baltimore attorney who handles malpractice cases in a

number of states. He has resorted to importing experts from England, but he complains that the U.S. medical profession is trying to dry up his sources.

"It's a big industry," says Dr. Joseph Danyo, a York; Pa., orthopedist. "I have spoken to physicians who testify against doctors and charge \$10,000 a case."

Danyo, author of a popular pamphlet, "Medical Malpractice Survival Kit for Physicians," feels strongly about doctors who sell their services to lawyers.

"They're professional prostitutes.... The thing that has doctors so infuriated is that certain colleagues are hired guns and will find any fly in the ointment and try to magnify it for a client," Danyo says.

BUT LAWYERS SAY the medical community's refusal to own up to mistakes forces them to go back time and time again to those doctors who are willing to testify.

Some do make a career of it. But there are others who say they act out of conscience. Instead of making money, they pay a stiff price.

"I've lost practice, there's no ques-tion about it," said one East Coast comes to testifying in malpractice surgeon who testifies about five times a year. "But I feel better. I would feel awful if I saw some of these things that are so horrendous and did noth-

ing about them.' Besides losing referrals from other physicians, testifying doctors say they are harassed by their insurance companies, forced out of teaching positions and threatened with career destruction.

In a recent case in Baltimore, two doctors planned to testify against a prestigious physician. One, an orthopedic surgeon from Trenton, N.J., was told he could jeopardize his career by appearing, and it was strongly implied he would have trouble with his upcoming examinations for board certification. A Florida doctor in the case was told his testimony would be recorded and sent to his county medical society.

Both doctors backed out, and the jury returned an innocent verdict. Later they told a lawyer in the case what had happened and he appealed to the Maryland Court of Special Ap-

The court ordered a new trial, saying that despite doctors' feelings toward malpractice, "the remedy doesn't lie in polluting the stream of justice by tampering with witnesses.

Lawyers say the Baltimore incident is not isolated.

"It happens here routinely," said Mark Mandel, a Philadelphia lawyer who specializes in malpractice cases. "When we reveal our experts, as they get closer to trial, they get cold

MEDICAL WITNESSES are crucial to malpractice cases. In states such as Pennsylvania, the law specifies that a malpractice verdict cannot be returned unless a jury hears an expert say that a doctor made a mistake.

"If there's no expert testimony, there's no malpractice," Mandel

Mandel disputes the medical community's claim that doctors who testify do it for money

"I usually find they are competen" physicians who are independently wealthy and who are courageous guys willing to get on the stand and say, 'My brother physician has committed

an error," he said. But even doctors who will testify usually won't testify against a close colleague or someone in the same city, doctors say.



## Job stress may cause disease in dogs, too

SEATTLE (AP) - The rape call in suburban Bellevue sent Bob Oliver and Chimo to work early.

Chimo, a burly, 5-year-old tan and black German Shepherd, a K-9 corps veteran, normally works a 10-hour shift. But this cold, clear Sunday night it would be longer.

'He ran a good track," said Oliver. Chimo's handler since February. But there was no quarry at the end of the trail. The rapist may have escaped in a car, or on horseback in a wooded

For Chimo, the evening was one of excitement - and frustration.

He took out some of the frustration an hour later, worrying a green tennis ball, bouncing head-to-head with Oliver when the ball was hidden, sniffing out the right pocket until the ball was his again.

Excitement and frustration are part of his job. So is boredom - long hours of cruising in the patrol car.

For Chimo's partner, Kahuna, the police dog's life is over. Kahuna was returned to his original owners in September after developing pancreatitis, an inflammation which caused stomach pain and nausea.

Did the ups and downs of police life with the 3-year-old Bellevue Police K-9 Corps prompt Kahuna's disabili-

"He was retired for medical reasons," said Lt. Tim Johnson. "The label 'stress' was attached to it at the time, perhaps improperly. According to our vet, pancreatitis is a stress-related problem."

Johnson said Kahuna's feelings are easily bruised. "If you got on him at all if he was doing something he shouldn't have done, he was very sensitive, he might even cower a lit-

The Seattle Police Department, which began its K-9 program in 1971 with six trained dogs from Germany, also has encountered the illness.

"Because of the highs and lows, where the dog gets extremely excited, or he's laying there very passive in the back of the car, some of these dogs have developed pancreas problems, said Larry Franklin, Seattle K-9 trainer and an expert on police dogs.

"In some of the dogs we've had medical problems with, we've discovered the animal's pancreas may be five or six times the normal size for a German Shepherd. In some cases they become physically ill, in others

Of 25-30 dogs who have worked for the Seattle department, two have been retired because of pancreatitis. Ordinary disabilities such as old age or bone spurs account for the rest of unit the 10 retirees.

Dr. Donald Canfield, who treats dogs in the Seattle, King County and Port of Seattle K-9 corps, is uncomfortable with the "stress" explanation of pancreatitis.

"I'm going to take issue with the idea," he said. "I don't think that has been documented scientifically enough to say a working dog is going to have a higher incidence of pancreatitis than the general population. "German Shepherds as a breed have a lot more pancreatic problems

(than other breeds.)" It's difficult to compare the incidence of pancreatitis in German Shepherds versus other breeds used as police dogs, because almost all police dogs in the country are male

German Shepherds. Apart from the highs and lows of day-to-day patrol, Franklin said he doubts that the dogs suffer much stress.

"The problems they encounter are just because of sheer excitement," he said. "If I took a hunting dog and put him in a field full of pheasants, he'd get excited and pumped up about it. I don't think you'd say he was under any real stress other than what he was putting his own system through to find the birds.

Canfield agreed. "Essentially the dogs have the same kind of wear and tear that any working dog would," he said. "They've been trained in a manner where the excitement, the up and down, is a positive and not a negative experience for them.

"You've never seen a more eager group of dogs to do what they've been

'They are going to be some breakdowns," Canfield added. "And probably some breakdowns that wouldn't occur if they weren't under stress. But in general it's not because they don't like what they're doing, it's because they weren't cut out to do that kind of work.

Yes, dogs will break down under stress," Canfield said, "but if the dogs are well-selected, well-suited, they thrive, both in a psychological

## Philadelphia's mounted force still growing

By WALTER PUTNAM

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — If Mayor Frank Rizzo held a full inspection of Philadelphia's police force, the roll call would have to include names like "Just Jesse," "Gomer" and "Kyber Rifle."

They're members of the mounted police unit, which at 148 strong has replaced New York City as the largest in the nation, says a spokesman for the department, Charles Turner.

From a list of about 100 officers requesting mount ed training, about 10 are chosen each year, says Turner, an inspector with the mounted training and services division.

Many of the officers chosen have little or no riding experience, he says, because the division likes to train men to ride without having to break any bad

Leroy Patterson, who's been a mounted officer for about three years, says he asked for the duty because he thought it would be a challenge.

"I had never been on a horse before, and I thought it would be the best training in the world," he says.

Officer Rich Crockett says there's a special rapport between a rider and his mount that attracts some men to the field. "With a car, you work for eight hours and then turn it over to somebody else," Crockett says. "With a horse it's just you and him. You know his faults and he knows yours.'

Added to this is the rapport with people on patrol, the officers say. "People are more quick to accept you," Patterson says. "Everybody likes horses,

"You're halfway between a beat cop and a car cop," Crockett adds, "because you're more mobile, yet you can talk to the people. Whereas in a

car, you're closed up behind the car windows." New York once had the largest mounted police unit, but, for financial and other reasons, the city's police force is down from a peak of 300 mounts to about 75, says Capt. William Falcone of the mounted

Philadelphia's mounted patrol has tripled since Rizzo, a former police commissioner, became mayor

A mounted officer can see more and move faster than an officer on foot, Turner says. If he spots a disturbance, while racing to the scene he can see the number of people involved and determine whether weapons are being used. And he's not exhausted on

The mounted officer is more of a crime deterrent, Turner says, because of his increased visibility



Sharif seemed to be enjoying a period of well. being, having recovered from a kidney stone operation six months ago ("the greatest pain known to man") and his longtime addiction to gambling ("a huge loss five or six years ago cured me").

'My life has become normalized," he commented. "I try to arrange it so that I work solidly for one year and then devote two years to the things I like to

This is his work year. He has already made two movies, "Bloodline" and "S.H.E." "During my two years off, I live at home in Paris," he said. "I belong to a club, so I can see my friends regularly. I play in bridge tournaments, I breed racing horses on a farm in Normandy and I have a small racing stable of my own. I like to spend vacations with my son, Tareq, who is now 22. We are very good friends

"He thought he wanted to be an actor, but what he really wanted to be was rich and famous. I tried to explain the overwhelming odds against success as an actor, the chances being that he would end up poor and starving.

#### Menotti choral suite will premiere today

FORT WORTH - Con- duled for presentation in temporary composer Gian-Carlo Menotti's newest work, a choral suite titled "Miracles," has its premiere perfor-mances this week in Fort

The suite for boys' chorus and symphony orchestra will be presented this afternoon and Tuesday night in the Tarrant County Convention Center theater in downtown Fort Worth. Performing the work will be the Texas Boys Choir of Fort Worth, under the direction of Jack Noble White, and the Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra, whose music director and conductor is John Giordano.

The choir and orchestra jointly commissioned "Miracles" with funds made available by Mr. and Mrs. F. Howard Walsh, well-known Fort Worth philanthropists and art patrons.

The Menotti work, a substantial piece of almost 40 minutes' duration, is scored for full orchestra and chorus in two-to-four parts.

The work is a setting of a series of poems written between 1961 and 1964 by children, mostly under the age of 10, in 18 countries of the world where English is either the native tongue or an important second language.





In one episode, for example, Susan Winslow (who works in an ambiguous but suitably with-it profession) goes on a date with one of her clients. She returns home and tells her mother she likes the guy but is afraid to get close to him because of ... well, you know, her special little problem.

"Friendly Fire," tonight on ABC, is the true story of an American family that tried to understand the death of a son accidentally killed by American were told

It is the story of just one Iowa family, but their loss and bitter disaffection came to speak for a nation. They searched for meaning, but couldfind none. In that sense, "Friendly Fire" says why Vietnam became the forgotten war.

Carol Burnett and Ned Beatty give extraordinary performances as Peg and Gene Mullen, fifthgeneration bread-belt Americans who became unlikely antiwar heroes. Heartland folks, people of the soil who would have smiled bravely and proudly buried their dead son in any other war.

That they went a little haywire over this loss in this war said more about the Vietnam conflict than all the anti-war shouting at Columbia or UCLA. The radicalization of the Mullens meant something; America's sense of right and purpose had gone off-track

The Mullens were shocked by the death of their son Mike, but from the beginning, something seemed wrong. Mike was killed by friendly fire, from a defensive missile that struck his chest, the Mullens

Tee and fairway seeding with Common Bermuda grass, will begin and finish up before the week is out. The rough seeding will follow the fairway seeding and the seed for them will be native Buffalo grass with a millet nurse grass.

If any of you come out to look at the area, may we once again remind you not to walk on any of the cleared areas for the next month or so to allow the new grass to take hold. As you play the present golf course, you can see the new practice green from No. 7 tee box and you can tell how it is progressing.



# Crosby may apply 'tourniquet' to 'appendagitis'

Norm Crosby is a man of a thousand words, all of them wrong. If he gets a pain in his side, he'll figure he wants to get his "appendage" removed, and he'll go to an abominable sturgeon. "Appendagitis" can be serious. And the golf tournament he is staging next month at California City is his very own "tourniquet." Every performer should have a tourniquet of his own to raise money for his favorite

One of the troubles with the world today is that the rich don't know what it's like to live in the ghetto in the midst of grinding puberty, Norm cau-

Norm's vocabulary is full of near misses like that. He's the Mr. Malaprop of show business. Foster Brooks may be the resident drunk who hiccupped his way to fame, Don Rickles insulted his way to the top, Frank Gorshin imitated, but Norm Crosby just had a way with words. Not the right way, but the funny way. As it has been since Richard Brinsley Sheridan's famous character in "The

Some people throw pies for laughs, Norm throws words. "I became an overnight excess," he explains. 'After I did, I received a standing oration. The audience deplored me to

Few people realize it, but Norm Crosby succeeded in a business which depends on the fast pace, the quick cue, the swift punch line and the sharp ad lib with only half a comedian's full essential arsenal of tongue and ear. There was a time when Norm couldn't hear the laughs.

CROSBY WAS on a subchaser during World War II and they did such a good job of halting Hitler's U-boats that you don't see hardly any of them up the Hudson River now, did you? Norm suspects they spent most of their time depth-bombing salmon. At least he never saw anything that could be classed as an enemy peri-

Norm doens't know what affect they had on the Fuhrer's wolf pack, but the effect on his ears was devastating. His hearing sank without a trace. When he came home from the war he wondered why everybody was whispering. He marveled at the way they had muffled the sound of traffic, but he wished actors would speak up in the movies and not mumble their

He thought he was just inattentive, as he went through the usual gauntlet

of "How many times do I have to tell you!?" or "You heard me!" or "For heaven's sake, now this time listen!" or even "Clean out your ears!"

NORM REALIZED the world hadn't gone silent, only the part of it around him. Life was a silent movie. And Norm had joined the silent mi-

There are 14 million people in this country with hearing loss. Three million of them are children. As the actress pointed out, they are the "invisible" handicapped.

Norm's hearing was helped through amplification. But even that had its pitfalls. At a drive-in movie one night the action had shifted from a battlefield to a love scene. But the roar of combat still responded in Norm's ears over the whispered sweet nothings on screen. Norm wondered why

he was still hearing the Battle of the Bulge instead of love lyrics — until he discovered his date had gone to sleep and was snoring into his pocket hear-

He made light of his infirmity on talk shows, but he got his message across all the same. "I knew something was wrong when I misunderstood guys trying to pay back money they owed me. I saw an ad in the paper: 'Clip this coupon and your hearing will improve in 30 days.' So I clipped the coupon, kept it 30 days, and nothing happened.'

BUT HEARING is a precious sense, not a foil for comedy. And Crosby left his lesson. "People with hearing problems are embarrassed," he says. "They try to dominate the conversation, to keep talking so you won't notice. They say 'Hello, how are you. I'm fine, my sister's going to Chicago, have you seen any good movies lately? I saw one the other night.' They never let you get a word in for fear they'll be embarrassed.'

Crosby is chairman of the Hope For Hearing at The University of California Los Angeles and the Better Hearing Institute; the proceeds from his May 19-20th Celebrity Golf Tourniquet at Tierra Del Sol in California City will go to them. The Tourniquet will star Jack Albertson, Joey Bishop, Glenn Campbell, Vic Damone, Telly Savalas and Don Rickles, among others. I can't think of a better use for a whole bunch of bogies, a group Norm promises will be "the most extinguished personalities in Hollywood.'

# Reggie bristles at Yankee critics

NEW YORK (AP) - A relaxed Reggie Jackson leans back on his dressing room stool and begins talking about his favorite subject - baseball and his role in it.

Jackson said he expects the New York Yankees' road to another championship to be as tough as last year's, when they had to rally from 14 games behind Boston to capture the American League East title in a playoff with the Red Sox. Then they had to beat the Kansas City Royals and Los Angeles Dodgers for their second straight title. He expressed annovance at suggestions the Yankees are their own worst

"Complacent? Lazy?," he repeated when asked if the team was dominated by "fat cats." Jackson had been accused of such things before, especially after being yanked from a 1977 game in Boston by then-manager Billy Martin in front of a national television audience.



WASHINGTON (AP) - During the last 30 years about \$5 billion has been spent on more than 100,000 investigations of what radiation can

do to your health. Yet when specialists at Three Mile Island were pressed to say what the radiation dangers were. they had to say that "there is no risk - based on what we know today.

The accident at Harrisburg is the centerpoint now but it's far from the only problem on scientific investigators' minds. Among the

-A study reporting a higher incidence of cancer among nuclear workers at Portsmouth Naval Shipyard at Kittery, Maine.

-Findings by a county health officer that people around Denver, living downwind from the government's Rocky Flats plutonium weapons plant are contracting cancer at a rate higher than the rest of the nation.

-Research on soldiers who participated in the early testing of the atomic bomb and people living near the Utah and Nevada test sites have shown an increase in certain types of cancer.

—Studies have been done which show higher cancer among people living near a Connecticut nuclear power plant; residents of dwellings built on or with uranium mine tailings, and workers at the government's Hanford plutonium processing

plant in Richland, Wash. Many scientists say that today we still don't know what level of radiation is dangerous and many believe we will never know.

Other experts believe the answer will never be known because there is no danger from low-level

'It's not because the government isn't trying," said Dr. Donald Frederickson, director of the National Institutes of Health. "More than \$5.5 billion has been spent for radiation health research. Fifteen to 20 federal agencies are somehow concerned with radiation and they report to no fewer than 50 congressional committees.

"Everyone is looking for the answer but that answer is not easy to find.'

Scientists say the health effects of exposure to high-level doses are well known and have been documented extensively from studies on survivors of the bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, people treated with high doses of therapeutic X-rays and a handful of people injured in military or occupational radiation accidents.

But the effects of long-term exposure to low levels of radiation are far more difficult to document

"No one in his right mind would suggest exposing people to radiation to determine the health effects," said Vice Adm. Robert Monroe. Nuclear Defense Agency director. "So we must rely on animal experiments and what little human data we can find.

"In low-level radiation investigations we have to work around the edges picking up a bit of data here and another study there. We may have enough of the bits to build a frame for a picture but we have no idea what the picture looks

Doctors say obvious medical symptoms which apidly appear with high level exposure are absent at lower doses.

'With low-level exposure there are no easy markers or signals such as radiation illness, Frederickson said. "Diseases which may be caused by radiation, primarily cancers, have a long development period. Sometimes it takes 15 to 20 years from time of exposure to the first sign of disease.

To determine a relationship between radiation and disease, researchers must have precise information on the amount of radiation received by the population being studied. This information must be based on accurate monitoring or dosimetry of radiation.

"In the majority of cases we are faced with poor dosimetry and massive uncertainties in record keeping and, to be useful, these inadequacies must be overcome years after the exposures occurred," Frederickson said.

Some scientists believe studies of the Portsmouth workers offer a large enough population and period to provide new data on the radiationcancer link. The shipyard has been involved in nuclear work since the late 1950s, the start of the nation's atomic submarine program.

In 1977, a Boston blood specialist, Dr. Thomas Najarian, reported a higher incidence of leukemia among nuclear workers than among those who worked outside radioactive areas. The Department of Energy and the Center for Disease

Control in Atlanta have been collecting records on the workers almost two years.

"At Portsmouth we may have a unique opportunity to investigate what we're told are very carefully kept records on individual workers, said Dr. William Foege, CDC director. "If we are able to link those exposure records with accurate health histories of the workers we may be able to tell something."

But Foege isn't sure that an answer will be found at Portsmouth or anyplace else.

Under pressure from Congress, several agencies have started reevaluating studies they had earlier discounted.

-The Department of Energy and the Department of Health, Education and Welfare are repeating and expanding Najarian's study of the Portsmouth workers.

-The Nuclear Regulatory Commission has three independent teams of researchers reviewing studies on the health of workers at the DOE's Hanford atomic plant by Dr. Thomas Mancuso, who believes there are serious dangers in lowlevel radiation.

-The Government Accounting Office also is

evaluating the Hanford study. -The NRC is redoing a double study by Dr. Ernest Sternglass, which he said showed increased cancer among people living near Denver's Rocky Flats plutonium plant and the Millstone nuclear plant in Connecticut.

-The NRC also is reviewing another Rocky Flats study just completed by Dr. Carl Johnson, the health officer for Jefferson County, Colo., where the plant is located.

But some scientists say the review of old results may not be helpful.

"I really don't know how much of an answer we'll get from Portsmouth or other ongoing studies," Foege said. "We should be prepared for the fact that we may never be able to define the health effects below a certain level."

Although predictions of low-level exposure

effects are based on 20 years of assumption and

extrapolations, they're still not precise enough to provide the nice neat round risk estimates that the public and science would like to have," said Dr. Arthur Upton, head of the National Cancer But other scientists say there is no risk from

low-level radiation. One of them is Dr. Lauriston Taylor, a radiation physicist and the former director of the National Council on Radiation Protection, who has been involved in radiation

In 1934, Taylor's group was responsible for establishing the nation's first radiation exposure

.These were created because doctors, nurses and techicians were being badly burned by overdoses of high level X-ray radiation, he

"High level effects are known. The best science has been used to investigate the hazards of low-level radiation but if there are health effects they are so minimal that it would take a test population of billions of laboratory animals or humans to see that effect," Taylor said. "Do you know what it means? It means there's no problem and we ought to stop looking for one.'

But critics of government radiation policies disagree. They say the passage of time may now be producing the deaths they had warned of some years ago.

"It was easy for the government to dispute our predictions of radiation dangers. Regardless of how thorough our studies were, the rows of calculations and complex scientific jargon had little emotional impact on the public or Congress," said Mancuso, an epidemiologist whose studies have been challenged by some government scientists

"But now the latent period for cancer and radiation-induced death we predicted can be seen all over the country," the University of Pittsburgh scientist said.

Dr. Clark Heath, director of the Center for Disease Control's division of chronic diseases, agreed that the increase in cancer deaths at some radiation sites has rekindled debate. But

"All the cancer deaths at the nuclear facilities may not be radiation-induced. That question still remains unanswered."

### DR. NEIL SOLOMON Check prostate

what are the signs of cancer of the prostate? For about a month now, my husband has been having occasional troube urinating, and I've heard that that can mean that something is wrong with the prostate. I want him to see the doctor, but he says he can't be bothered and that he is sure it is nothing serious. I'd appreciate any advice you

can give me.—X.

Dear X: The typical symptoms that may indicate cancer of the prostate are indeed urinary difficulties, such as trouble starting to urinate, a weak or interrupted flow, a need to urinate often, especially at night, a flow that is not easily stopped, or a burning feeling while urinating. Blood in the urine, or persistent pain in the pelvis. the lower back or the upper thighs are symptoms especially important to

The reason so many of these symptoms affect urination is due to the location of the prostate gland. It is a male genital gland situated right below the bladder, surrounding the first inch or so of the urethra, the tube that carries urine from the bladder down through the penis for evacuation.

If there is a growth in the prostate gland, this tends to compress the urethra and diminish the flow of urine.

Dear Dr. Solomon: Just benign prostatic hyper-that are the signs of trophy. More than half of the men in the United States over 50 years of age have this condition to some extent or other.

On the other hand, it is also very important not to underestimate the danger of prostate cancer. More than 20,000 American men die of it each year. The risk increases with age. In the 55-74 age group, prostate cancer is the third highest cause of cancer deaths-right after lung cancer and colon-rectum cancer.

The first step in diagnosing prostate trouble is very simple. The doctor inserts a gloved finger into the rectum and palpates (feels) the prostate gland. If there are any firm or irregular areas he will conduct the necessary tests, such as urine and blood analyses as well as X-ray.

To find out for sure if a tumor is malignant or not a biopsy is required. This involves removing a bit of tissue surgically for examination under a microscope.

In any case, your husband should cheek his condition with your doctor. As I said, his trouble may not be serious. And it may not have anything to do with the prostate. The doctor is the only person who can sort all this out.







Ten homes have already been repaired, said Mrs. Edwards, because "plumbing repairs don't wait for spring. If we have money, we use it to pay for such repairs between "Christmases."

Mrs. Edwards said the goal this year was 30 homes, but because of the fantastic volunteer turnout, we raised the limit to 53 homes total.

Forty-three of these will be worked on over "Christmas."

"Last year we had to exclude five projects because we did not have enough volunteer groups to work on them," she added.

The monetary goal was expected to be \$12,000 for building materials, said Mrs. Edwards, but this may have to be increased because volunteers will be working on 23 more homes than anticipated. "We have just over \$8,000 now, which includes last year's dollars left over."

The new groups making the turnout "so incredibly good," are Greater St. Luke's AME, a group of people from Grace Lutheran Church, who call themselves "The Elves," vocational clubs from Lee High School, Community Gold, Boy's Club, Wilshire Park Baptist Church and Rotary Club.

Thirty-five groups in all will be doing the actual repairs on the homes. Other Midland clubs and organizations will furnish lunches for the workers.

The Midland County Commissioners have resolved their support of the project by joining the Midland City Council in offering the use of a dump truck and a driver, and other heavy equipment if needed.

Mayor Ernest Angelo Jr. has signed a proclamation proclaiming Saturday as "Christmas in April 1979," along with a resolution adopted by the commissioners.

According to Mrs. Edwards, "HRC and "Christmas" are grateful for the county's indication of support. It reiterates this to be a total community project."

To be eligible for assistance, an applicant must own his or her home, be low-income and elderly and-or severely handicapped and not have enough money, materials or help to repair their own homes.

Referrals are made by friends, churches and agencies such as

Salvation Army, Casa de Amigos, welfare office and Senior Citizens Center.

The program, although sponsored by the Human Relations Council, operates completely apart from the council's other programs. All donations are used exclusively for this program and there are no paid employees. The overhead, which includes stamps, film, post cards, paper, etc., is less than one percent, said Trimble.

In the past six years, 250 projects have been completed at a cost of \$50-60,000, said Mrs. Edwards.

Each year during the one day of "Christmas", 6,000 hours of actual labor are performed. This does not include beforehand preparation.

Mrs. Edwards cited the case of an elderly woman, a double amputee, who this year agreed to pay a portion of the total plumbing repairs on her home "at \$10 a month."


Mina Fitting, coordinator for "The Elves," said, "It is great the program is all local and can get so much done without a great deal of money being donated, just a lot of time. It's people caring and I want to be a part of it."

Since Mrs. Fitting's volunteers number more women than men, the group decided to pick easier jobs like painting.

They will also put hand rails on the bathtub and on the front and back doors of the home of an 80-year-old widow. For her, they also will replace a damaged closet door.

For another elderly widow, the workers will scrape and paint the back of her house, replace screen doors, put up railings and fix some plumbing leaks.

Mrs. Fitting said one reason a lot of people in her group are interested in "Christmas" is because "they delivered for the Meals-On-Wheels program and saw the need for such a project."

### Teenagers still prefer alcohol

WASHINGTON (AP) - Alcohol remains more tempting than tobacco or marijuana to teen-agers, a government statistician says.

But the percentage of teen-age cigarette smokers is dropping while marijuana smoking is on the rise, according to surveys of youths aged 12 to 17

"If the trends noted in 1977 continue, it will not be long before more adolescents are using marijuana than nicotine," Mary Grace Kovar of the National Center for Health Statistics wrote in an article in Public Health Reports.


Surveys have estimated that among the 24 million American youths, 53 percent have tasted alcohol, 47 percent have tried cigarettes and 28 percent have sampled marijuana.

The number of experimenters increases with age, so that among highschool seniors in 1977 more than 90 percent had tried alcohol, 76 percent cigarettes and 56 percent marijuana,



### Submarine wives suffer

WASHINGTON (AP) - Wives of men serving long tours on nuclear submarines suffer from depression and grief that the Navy neither recognizes nor deals with adequately, a psychological study reports.

While the Navy is concerned with effects on seamen of their threemonths-at-sea, three-months-home rotation, it does not deal with the severe stress this pattern poses for wives, the University of Hawaii at Manoa, study says.

The researchers said the Navy provides counseling services, but informal social pressures make wives reluctant to use them. Faced with constant pressure to be a sacrificing, "good military wife," a woman often is forced to hide her feelings and grief, the report said.

The researchers tested 24 wives of nuclear submarine personnel based in Hawaii to assess their depression when husbands were at sea and at

The researchers - Karen Beckman and Drs. Anthony J. Marsella and Ruth Finney — said wives' problems were linked both to grief whenever husbands leave and to constant shifting of role patterns.



The commission said lines have been jammed by thousands of people calling with questions about asbestos in their hairdryers.

The commission has reported that more than 100 electric hairdryers sold in the country contain asbestos, a potential cancer-causing agent. After it made the original announcement, the commission set up 11 telephone lines and three toll-free numbers to handle queries from the pub-

But commission spokeswoman Heidi Bowers said too many calls are coming in. "We're entreating people not to call because they're overloading the lines, and people trying to make normal calls are getting nothing but busy signals," she said Thurs-

Instead of calling, the CPCS said queries about hairdryers could be mailed to: Hairdryers, Consumer Product Safety Commission, Washington, D.C. 20207.

In another development Thursday, the commission said it erroneously identified three models of Hamilton Beach hair dryers as containing asbestos.

The dryers erroneously listed by the commission were Hamilton Beach models 477, 478 and 481.

### Crab bisque is rich fare

Having written more than once about the cuisine of Georgia since a son of that state entered the White House, I think it's time to switch to another southern state, such as South

Recently, I heard of another South Carolina classic. It's a rich crab bisque a friend of mine was served while visiting a family at Moss Creek Plantation, a community of homes situated in a corner of historic Beaufort County. The region was established back in 1718 under the formidable title of Devil's Elbow Barony.

Crab has been a staple in South Carolina's low country since the days of the Indian tribes. The blue claw crab is still readily available in the lagoons and salt marshes of Moss Creek. All you need in order to catch them is a couple of chicken necks fastened to a weighted string.

Here's a recipe my friend obtained from the files of the Pinckneys.

1 pint milk 1 teaspoon mace

2 lemon slices, with rind 1 pound crab meat

4 cup butter pint heavy cream 1-3rd cup cracker crumbs

1 ounce dry sherry-

Salt and pepper to taste Simmer milk, mace and lemon in top of double boiler 5 minutes. Add crab, butter, cream, cook about 15 minutes over low heat. Thicken with cracker crumbs, season and let stand on warmer a few minutes to enhance flavor. Just before serving add sherry. Serves 6. Good with dry white wine, well chilled.



# Marked up prices 'unfair' to cash payers

By LOUISE COOK Associated Press Writer

A new effort is under way to encourage merchants to give a price break to people who pay cash instead of using credit.

Supporters of discounts say retailers mark up prices to cover the processing costs of credit. It is unfair, they say, for cash customers to pay

Most discount programs so far have been local efforts with minimal organization. An exception is "Savings Plus," run by American Business Enterprises of Sikeston, Mo.

Here is how it works:

Savings Plus cards are issued free by savings and loan associations and banks that sign up with and pay a small fee to American Business. To get a card, an indiviual must open a savings account at the participating institution. Holders of the cards are entitled to discounts when paying cash to participating merchants.

When the customer makes a purchase, he or she hands the Savings Plus card to the clerk who runs it through an imprinting machine similar to those used for regular credit cards. At the end of each month, an amount equal to the sum of the discounts on all Savings Plus purchases at all participating merchants is deposited in the cardholder's savings

Jim Hulen, treasurer of American Business Enterprises, said there are about 600,000 cardholders and 10,000 participating merchants across the country. He said the program started in southeastern Missouri in November 1977 and has spread to St. Louis; Cincinnati; Baton Rouge, La.; Albuquerque, N.M.; and "almost the en-tire state of Arkansas." Savings Plus plans are in the works for Fort Lauderdale, Fla., Minneapolis-St. Paul and Fargo, N.D., Hulen said.

Hulen said there are several advantages to the Savings Plus system both for the seller and for the buyer.

The merchant, he said, does not have to calculate individual discounts for each purchase. He or she simply adds up all the Savings Plus receipts for a week, figures out the amount of the discount on the total and sends a check to the participating bank. The bank gets a computer tape from American Business enabling it to deposit the appropriate sums of money in individual accounts.

The merchants have to pay a fee to American Business - just as they would have to pay to a credit card company. But, said Hulen, they do not have to worry about running credit checks, they can improve-their-cash flow and they get a competitive

Hulen said the cardholder appreciates the discounts more with the Savings Plus plan because he or she gets a lump sum rather than a few dollars here and a few dollars there.

For her part, Mrs. Guthrie has founded the Committee to Combat-Huntington's Disease in an effort to encourage research into that ailment and other neurological disorders. She lectures around the country, most recently at the University of Pennsylvania School of cine, and buttonholes political figures to plead her case.

After Guthrie's death in a New York state mental hospital she married a Philadelphia businessman.

She said of Guthrie, who wrote "This Land Is Your Land," a thousand other songs and a couple of books, "We had seven good years together before the roof.

It took time to learn that Guthrie's violent outbursts, slurred speech, listing walk and bouts of depression were not due to the fact that "everyone in Oklahoma begins drinking cheap wine at the age of 4," as he jokingly claimed.

And it took 15 years for him to die.

# Male job seekers need right wardrobe

NEW YORK (AP) - Although elothes don't make the man, they can often make the difference between getting and not getting the job when a recent college graduate interviews for that all-important first chance. says a specialist in the men's apparel

"In an interview situation for a first job, it's often difficult to select one applicant over another," says Marvin A. Blumenfeld, head of a merchandising consulting firm which represents more than 140 men's shops around the country. "They're all enthusiastic and inexperienced and if their course of study and grades are equivalent, the potential employer has to consider other factors.

"And one of them is the way a prospective employee is dressed, adds Blumenfeld, president of April-Marcus Inc., in New York. He offers some basic fashion points a college graduate should keep in mind when he's job hunting.

"First and most important," says the fashion expert, "is that the applicant's outfit blend into the surroundings. The young man who is remembered as 'the one in the green suit or bright plaid blazer' probably has created an unnecessary obstacle for himself. When dressing for an interview it's better to err on the side of conservatism.

Blumenfeld suggests that the job seeker who is especially interested in a certain company might do well to get a copy of its annual report. In most cases, it will contain a color photo of the chief executive and his key personnel, from which one can get an idea of the company's mode of

Since most college graduates do not have unlimited funds at their disposal to spend on clothing, he advises keeping the job-hunting wardrobe down to they are.

its bare essentials "because when an applicant gets a job, he'll be better able to determine the appropriate dress code in his new company and buy accordingly.

Blumenfeld believes that the firsttime job seeker can get by with two interview outfits.

"Having only one is a little too precarious," he warns. "In-case of a spill or a tear, you don't want to be left without anything to wear. Also, in situations where you have to return for a number of interviews, you can't. wear the same outfit during every

He suggests these guidelines for the two outfits:

-Suits. One should be either blue or gray. The other might be blue, gray or brown. The blue and gray should be darker shades and the brown either a darker shade or subdued tan for summer months. Stripes are permissible as long as they are on the conservative side. Plaids of all kinds are out.

-Shirts. They should be either white or lighter shades of blue or beige. Striped shirts are acceptable as long as they are white with subdued blue, gray or brown stripes. -Ties. Ties should be striped, con-

servatively dotted or solid. Solid ties are the only type to wear with striped shirts. Floral patterns and bright shades of any color are out. There are certain items that Blu-

menfeld and other clothing experts suggest are better left for wear during the cocktail hour and other social and informal engagements. They include sports coats and

slacks, plaid suits, green, red and certain shades of rust and any other color that conveys the feeling of loudness. And, of course, Blumenfeld points

out, jeans should never be worn at interviews, no matter how high-style
