

Editorial

You have to go a long way before you find a topic on which were in agreement with House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi, but that is just the case when it comes to the recent announcement that this proud nation's Olympic representatives won't be representing this nation's textile manufacturers.

In case it slipped by you in the myriad of news items traveling across the nation this past week which seems unusual considering the vim and vinegar with which the elite of Capitol Hill have voiced their opinions on the issues during the past week, the US Olympic Committee has insulted the nation it represents by purchasing the outfits to be worn by the US athletes during the upcoming opening ceremonies in London from China.

Exactly how this came about, we don't know. Granted, the US Olympic team, as the committee governing it points out, is privately funded, and it reportedly was to a large degree the corporate sponsors who were responsible for the "non-American" attire's selection.

But if there was anything worse than the "made elsewhere" labels that adorn the clothing, it's the total lack of remorse displayed by this nation's Olympic committee.

Still, it's not the first time such an issue has arisen. Several years ago, the U.S. military ditch it's tried and true side arms, the Colt 1911a1, for a foreign-made pistol — the Beretta 92, and while there were similar outcries made about that decision, the reaction from the Pentagon was nearly the same.

As to what should be done about the most recent issue, it's probably become a mute point. By the time this editorial hits the news stands, there will be only a few days left before our athletic representatives must make an appearance in London.

As embarrassing as the incident is, it would be even more for them to make their grand entrance attired as the Hans Christian Anderson character in the "Emperor's New Clothes." Neither do we see a repeat of the 1980 Summer Olympics boycott as a viable alternative.

About all that's left is for the Olympic mothers to start tie-dying t-shirts.
