SPC Handgun Class



Obituaries printed in the Muleshoe Journal are printed at the rate of \$4.50 per column inch, and may contain a variety of information, including but not limited to: Date and details of funeral and place of burial; date and place of birth and parents names; date of marriage; biographical information; names of parents, spouses or children who have preceded the person in death; names of survivors; and where memorials may be directed.



Beautiful spring weather across the state not only encourages Texans to become more active outdoors, it also is a boon for tick populations, said a entomologist at College Station.

Dr. Pete Teel said ticks are an ever-present part of living in Texas. But the unusually mild temperatures and precipitation much of the state has received during late winter and early spring on the heels of the hottest and driest year on record are proving to be ideal for increased tick activity.

"We're now entering the peak host-seeking time when immature ticks are on the move seeking hosts. Regardless of what happens now weatherwise, I predict this will be a banner year for tick bites on humans, pets and livestock," he said. As is to be expected, m i l d weather encourages more outdoor human activity,

both recreational and occupational, thus increasing the risk of tick exposure and transmission of tickborne disease, he said. Teel said key points to remember in order
