## It's Tick Time In Texas

Beautiful spring weather across the state not only encourages Texans to become more also is a boon for tick populations, said Texas AgriLife Research entomologist at College Station.
Dr. Pete Teel said ticks are an ever-present part of living in Texas. But the unusuall mild temperatures anc the state has received during late winter and early spring on the heels of the hottest and driest year on record are proving to be ideal for "We're now entering the peak host-seeking time when immature ticks are on the
move seeking hosts. Regardless of what happens now weathe wise, I predict this wil be a banner year for tick bites on humans, pets and livestock," he said. As is to be expected, mild weather encourages more outdoor human activity, both recreational and occupational, thus increasing the risk of tick exposure and transmission of tickborne disease, he said. Teel said key points to remember in order
