Dear Dr. Pettey: My mother has what
is called "low vision" and she was is called "low vision" and she was sent Optometry Cininic by her eye doctor to be fitted with a special seeing aid. I
thought all eye doctors should be able to work on any wisual problems. Just as in other healths. care profes-
sions sions, optometry has its specialties. Thee
care of low vision patients is one. There are a number of optometrists, and oth-
ers, who have taken special training in ers, who have taken special training in
low vision management and can take care of nearly all low vision cases. Some patients, however. can have seemingly nothing done for them because of great-
