## Big step back for education

FLOOR ACTION is expected soon in the Senate on implementing legislation for the proposed U.S. Department of Education
amid legitimate fears that it ultimately will lead to complete federal domination of our Wchools. or without this new federal departof $\$ 14.5$ billion and 15,600 new civil servants Big Brother's role in education, already strong, can be expected to increase.

376 in 1975 a drop of 9 percent. The in376 in 1975, a drop of 9 percent. The in-
crease in federal expenditures and regulations has risen dramatically, meanwhille, as school bond approvals have declined.
There has There has been little enthusiasm for devel-
opment of new textbooks, curriculum and methods of instruction among local school districts and states in the past decade partially because costs were/are prohibitively
high and new techniques often have proved hign acessful. As a consequence, the federal government has taken this role for itself. Samuel Johnson said the supreme end of
