This choice is crystallizing between those

ing the usefulness of force.
Force, however, is an abstract concept. Force, however, is an abstract concept.
In many cases, the perception of it alone is In many cases, the perception of it alone is
sufficient. In others, it must be exercised sufficient in others, it must be exercised
and applied by men using weapons within an organizing framework
It was in such an application of force that
the American military proved inadequate to the American military proved inadequate to he task in Vietnam.
