Texas has had such a law on the statute books probably ever since it was a state, but of late years custom rather than the law has been observed by Tax Assessors and Boards of Equalization and as a result a great deal of property has been assessed at a mere fraction of its actual value. There could be no objection to assessing all property at its cash value provided the tax rate was lowered, but many people believe this will not be done hence the kick. The most unjust feature of assessments is that there is no uniformity in assessing. The rule has been that the less a man has the more in proportion is his tax while the large property owner pays less in proportion than the small property holder. What we need more than anything else is uniformnity in assessments. Section 1. That Section 9 of Article 8 of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended by adding thereto Section 9a, which shall read as follows:

Section 9a. A majority of the property tax paying voters in any county or one or more political subdivisions thereof, in this State, voting at an election held for that purpose may vote a tax for road and bridge purposes not to exceed 30 cents on the \$100 valuation of property subject to taxation in such county or political subdivisioe of such county, or may issue bonds not to exceed 20 per cent of the assessed value of the real property in such district, for such road and bridge purposes, provided that such tax, or proceeds of such bonds, shall be expended in the territory in which it is voted and no other, and this provisamendment to Article four (4) of ion of the Constitution shall be selfenacting without the necessity of





PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO the Constitution Providing for the Creation of Improvement Districts in Certain Cities.

Joint Resolution amending Section 9, of Article 8, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, providing for the creation of improvement districts in cities of more than five thousand inhabitants, and charging the cost of certain improvements made therein against the abutting property. SECTION 1. Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas: That Section 9 of Article 8 of the State of Texas, be so amended as to hereafter read as follows:

SEC. 9. The State tax on property, exclusive of the tax necessary to pay the public debt, and of the taxes provided for the benefit of public free schools, shall never exceed thirty-five cents on the one hundred dollars valuation; and no county, city or town shall levy more than twentyfive cents for city or county purposes, and not exceeding fifteen cents for roads and bridges, and not exceeding fifteen cents to pay jurors, on the hundred dollars valua cept for payment of detbs incurred prior to the adoption of the amendment September 25, A. D. 1883, and for the erection of public buildings, exceed twenty-five cents on the one hundred dollars valuation, in any one year, and except as in this Constitution otherwise provided; and the Legislature may also authorize an nual ad valorem tar u collected for the furth the public roads er mai provid qualif of the
