In a little more than a week, the City of Muleshoe will be celebrating its second annual Muleshoe Day, but in the days that precede the celebration, Muleshoe will be facing another anniversary... a much more sinister anniversary.

Tuesday, Sept. 23, 2014, will mark the seventh anniversary of the abduction of Johnny
