### **Death Claims Emmett Roberts** In Ft. Worth



#### Doane Agricultual Service reported today that work was nearing completion on the price forecasting phase of the agricultural study presently being conducted for Sherman County. John King, who heads Doane's price team, is supervising tenyear price forecasts for the major crops being produced in Sherman County. Information way of prices for wheat, sorghum, cattle and other commosound recommendations can be

made on expansion of farm and ranch production in the area. As might be expected, the

price of wheat will be closely tied to governmental action. Hence, an estimate of what can be expected in the way of future prices of wheat, must include a prediction of what the government might be expected to do. Unfortunately, this is most difficult, even for the most talented price forecasters.

King reports, however, that supply and demand factors have a much greater influence on other Sherman County products. Hence, more reliable estimates are possible.

The information being gathered by the Doane price forecasters will be used to help determine the enterprises that can be expected to return the most dependeable profits to farmers and ranchers in the area. It will also be used to determine the best use of the agricultural products produced. For example, if future prices for a grain such as sorghum can be expected to remain strong, adequate profits might be expected from a cash grain operation. 

1½ cups sliced fresh strawberries

1 teaspoon grated orange rind ounce package lady fingers confectioners sugar, Fold strawberries and grated rind into whipped cream. Place layer of lady fingers in wax paper-lined loaf pan (81/2 x 41/2x 2¾). Spread half of cream mixture over lady fingers. Make another layer of lady fingers and cover with remaining cream mixture. Top with lady fingers. Chill 3 to 4 hours. Invert on serving plate and slice to serve.

When you want to remove grease from a skillet, cover the bottom with boiling water and add a teaspoon of washing or sal soda. Boil until the grease dissolves and the skillet will yield easily to suds cleaning.
