

# **Learning to Listen**

by Max Lucado

Equipped with the right tools, we can learn to listen to God. What are those tools? Here are the ones I have found helpful.

A regular time and place. Select a slot on your schedule and a corner of your world, and claim it for God. For some it may be best to do this in the morning. Others prefer the evening. Others prefer many encounters during the day.

Some sit under a tree, others in the kitchen. Maybe your commute to work or your lunch break would be appropriate. Find a time and place that seems right for

How much time should you take? As much as you need. Value quality over length. Your time with God should last long enough for you to say what you want and for God to say what he wants. Which leads us to a second tool you need — an open Bible.

God speaks to us through his Word. The first step in reading the Bible is to ask God to help you understand it.

Before reading the Bible, pray. Don't go to Scripture looking for your own idea; go searching for God's. Read the Bible prayerfully. Also, read the Bible carefully.

Here is a practical point. Study the Bible a little at a time. God seems to send messages as he did his manna: one day's portion at a time. Choose depth over quantity. Read until a verse "hits" you, then stop and meditate on it. Copy the verse onto a sheet of paper, or write it in your journal, and reflect on it several times.

Will I learn what God intends? If I listen, I will.

Understanding comes a little at a time over a lifetime. There is a third tool for having a productive time with God. Not only do we need a regular time and an open Bible, we also need a listening heart. Don't forget the admonition from James: "The man who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and makes a habit of so doing, is not the man who hears and forgets. He puts that law into practice and he wins true happiness" (James 1:25 PHILLIPS).

We know we are listening to God when what we read in the Bible is what others

see in our lives. Paul urged his readers to put into practice what they had learned from him. "What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, do" (Phil. 4:9 RSV).

If you want to be just like Jesus, let God have you. Spend time listening for him until you receive your lesson for the day — then apply it. From Just Like Jesus Copyright (W Publishing Group, 1998, 2001) Max Lucado







the location of the bullet. Where, exactly, anatomically speaking, is a person's "yet"? I

don't think they know yet. Perhaps what follows is the same sort of English mystery, and we may never find a real answer for it.

But this I know for sure: If you happen to find a wheelbarrow full of gruntles, be sure to hang on to them!

No, I haven't the foggiest idea of what a gruntle looks like.

Yes, it does sort of sound like a lower GI sort of thing, but I know of no particular evidence to back up that view. More mysterious still: I know

people who've lost their gruntles, but my dog has never once lost hers. This begs for research. And, speaking of gruntles,

things get even more complicated. If you find a bunch of the gruntles that people have lost, I don't know what you're supposed to do with them.

How do you know whose is

And how are they taken, ingested, or attached? Are they swallowed? Grafted on?

Plugged in? Can lay folks do the job, or does "gruntle-attaching" or "gruntle-grafting" or whatever the technical term is, take some sort of specialist? If so, is that a particular specialty in and of itself, or would you go to a gastroenterologist, or a dermatologist, or a neurologist, or . . .

I have no idea. But I do know that losing one's gruntle is a very bad thing for everyone involved. Even if you're not the lossee, if you spend too much time around folks who have lost their gruntles, you can end up as a loser of sorts yourself and, yes, I'm afraid it's true, lose your own.

We've all seen it happen. One person in your home/

business/school/church/office/ club loses his or her gruntle and everybody else is just sort of expected to tiptoe around them. The person. Not the gruntle.

Yes, it's a deep loss, and, no, you wouldn't want to step on one, and maybe break it, and lose all hope of the person who lost it ever being re-gruntled, but the tiptoeing does get to be kind of a pain. So much so that, even if you're not sure where your own gruntle is or how to take care of it, you just sort of feel it slipping a bit. And you become really concerned that you yourself may wake up one morning and find that you've joined the ranks of those sad and saddening folks who've already lost their gruntles.

# **Medication management (Part 2 of 2)**

We know that taking our an important part of staying healthy.

This involves understanding a little bit about drugs, in general, and pharmacist and other health providers who might prescribe medications.

safely organizing and storing medications in addition to keeping good records about them.

Your doctor has prescribed a medication, the pharmacist has filled the prescription and now it is up to you to take it safely.

Andrew B. Crocker, extension program specialist — Gerontology Health, has provided some tips that can help:

• Take your medication in the exact amount and at the time your doctor prescribes

 Call your doctor if you have problems with your medication. Your doctor may be able to change it to a different one that will work better for you.

 Avoid mixing alcohol and medication. Some medications may not work correctly or may make you sick if taken with alcohol.

Take your medication until it is finished or until your doctor says it is okay to stop taking it.

For some medications, like antibiotics, it may be important to take all of the pills, even after you start feeling better.

Remember not to share medications — your medication was prescribed for you to treat your condition.

Also, check the expiration dates on your medication bottles and throw away outdated medications.

Because of changes in vision, hearing, loss of strength in the hands and many other ailments that may accompany aging, older adults may have a hard time managing their medications once they get them home.

For these reasons and others, you may want to purchase a pill sorter to help better manage your medications.

Some pill sorters allow for a seven-day supply of medication, and some hold a seven-day supply of medication with different slots for taking pills up to four times per day.

Some pill sorters hold a month's supply medication.

No matter what type you choose, look for a few things






