CRAW WILL  
BE CANDIDATE  
FOR ATTY-GEN.

DALLAS, Jan. 13.—William McCraw, former district attorney of this county, Saturday made formal announcement of his candidacy for the office of attorney-general of this state.

McCraw makes his debut into politics with the distinction of being the only district attorney ever elected three consecutive years in Dallas county. Newsboy, lawyer, soldier and public official are the successive steps in his career. He saw action in France during the Thirty-sixth division. He has received state-wide recognition for his untiring prosecution of crime and his administration of this county's civil affairs.

McCraw has long been my ambition to have in this place and I take this as an announcement of my candidacy for attorney-general.

McCraw has long been my ambition to have in this place and I take this as an announcement of my candidacy for attorney-general. The general idea of the people of my native state is my objective and in its accomplishment my sole guide will be the constitution and statutes of the state and the decisions of our courts. My ability and general fitness being a primary issue, I submit a legal resume that has given me the privilege of representing the people of my native state as their prosecutor or defender of their civil rights, as well as the experience of the practice in all our courts. I have such inquiry and investigation as each citizen may feel warranted to the end that I may serve as the people's lawyer.

McCraw was elected district attorney in 1926, an office which he held for three consecutive terms. McCraw, long active in democratic affairs, is known here as a "radical" in politics. Since his retirement from public office in 1932, he has engaged in civil law practice and is married.

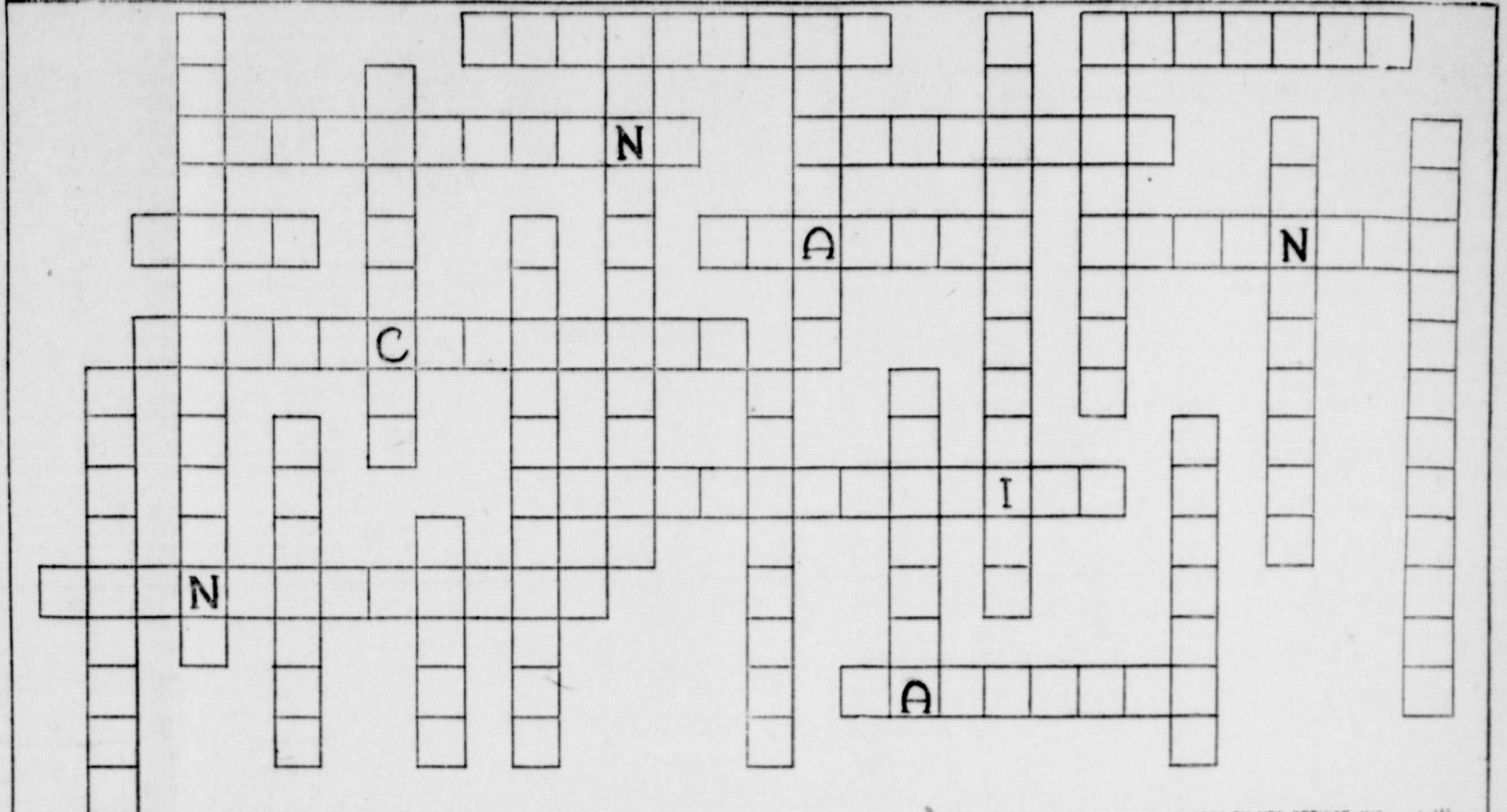
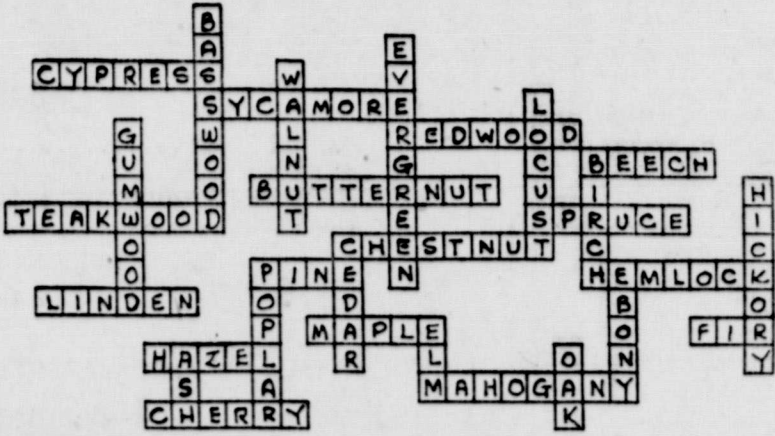
SEEK TO KILL HOUSE
