3 Special Session Oil Bills Approved

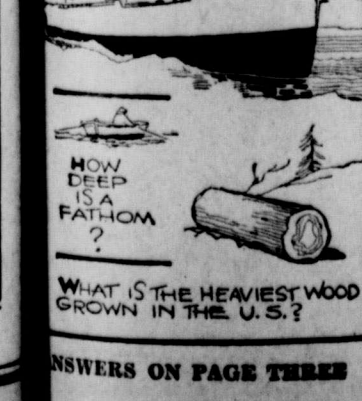

A lie can be sublime or it can be ridiculous. It rarely matters what is done, but how it's done. It's a question of art and motive.

Ever since Baron Munchausen made the art of tall tales a distinction, imitators have sprung up in great number. Rarely, however, do they achieve the finesse of the old master.

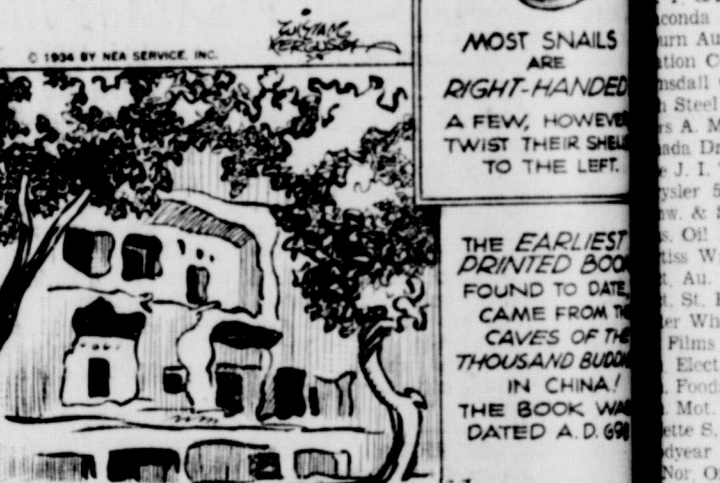
