Fight for all Americans' right to bear arms wages on Last year, the US
Supreme Court issued Supreme Court issued
a landmark ruling that affirmed the Second Amendment right to bear arms as an individual, protected right.
In D.C v. Heller, the court declared that the District of Columbia's an unconstitutional restriction on that right. The day the nation's highest court handed down its opinion, and I was proud to stand on the steps of the Supreme Court with scores of other Americans, including Dick Heller, one of the plaintiffs in the case, who all count the right to bear arms as one of their most precious liberties.
The court's decision was a triumph for firearms the Second Amendment It was a victory for the citizens of Washington D.C., who had been denied the right to protec hemselves in their homes by the most restrictive gun ban in the nation.
The decision was also in line with the view of the majority of Congress. Fifty-five senators, 250 epresentatives, and Vice Pres. Cheney, in his role as the President of the Senate supported my "friend of the court" brief to the Supreme Court, expressing Congressional views of the Second Amendment as a fundamental, individual right.
This put to rest the contention of gun contro advocates that the right to bear arms is a collective right only granted to members of a militia.
But we see now that the threat to the right of lawabiding Americans to own firearm cannot be taken

for granted, even after this face for the gun rights landmark decision
Despite clear for the individual right to keep and bear arms, and Supreme Court decision affirming this position, ome jurisdictions across the country have the Heller decision, saying it does not apply to the states. These ke the Citysdictions have impoty of Chicago, restrictions or outright bans on handgun To contend that the Second Amendment would not apply to the states defies common sense.
The individual right to bear arms would have little meaning or effect if gun not extend to lawful gun owners regardless of where they live.
We remain a union of states, and for an individual to be truly secure in his right to own a gun, protections against infringement
to the states.
Arguments attempting to limit the reach of the Second Amendment's protections are not hypothetical. Although the Supreme Court of the United States has made it unequivocally clear that outright bans on lawful gun ownership are unconstitutional, Chicago, for example, believes the Constitutional protection of the Second Amendment does not extend to its residents.
Much like Dick Heller became the name and
ace for the gun rights movement in Washington, Otis McDonald has taken
up the fight in Chicago Mr. McDonald has lived in Chicago since the 1950s and has worked tirelessly to improve his community through civil rights activism and efforts to rid his neighborhood of drugs and crime. As a result, he has become a target for the criminals he seeks to purge from the Chicago's ban prohibits Mr. McDonald from keeping in his own home the handgun he legally purchased for protection against these threats. Mr. McDonald is o of several plaintiffs in the case McDonald v. the City of Chicago, which the Supreme Court is set to consider in early 2010. The case was recently heard by the Seventh
Circuit Court of Appeals, Which held that the precedent for federal enclaves, like Washington D.C., and not the states. However, the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals recently determined in a similar gun rights case, Nordyke v. King, that the Second Amendment does apply to the states through the Due Process Clause of he 14th Amendment. 1 am firm in my belief that the right to bear arms is an individual, fundamental right that is guaranteed and protected by the Constitution. But these cases illustrate he fight for the Second Amendment has not yet been won.

I am pleased the Supreme Courthas agreed to hear McDonald v . the to hear McDonald v. the
City of Chicago to settle this extremely important Constitutional question regarding one of our most precious liberties.
My colleagues and I are once again authoring a brief to the Supreme Court so that the Court knows members of Congress have the right to bear arms and the right to defend ourselves and our families.
And it is our view that this liberty extends to all law-abiding Americans, regardless of the urisdiction in which they reside.
Ultimately, this fight not merely about handgun laws; it is about the preservation of the Constitutional rights intended for all Americans.
