KIDNAP NIGHT MARSHAL WHEN LOOTING FAILS

CRESCENT, Okla., June 20.—Seven gangsters, armed with shotguns and rifles, early today terrorized the town in an attempt to rob the Farmers and Merchants bank, and kidnaped Night Marshal Joe Stanfield as they fled.

Four other persons were taken as hostages by the gang but were released a short distance from the town.

Seven shots were fired at them from across the street as they sought to haul the huge five-ton safe through the bank window and load it on a truck.

They drove into Crescent at 3 o'clock this morning captured the telephone exchange, and cut all the cables and wires leading from the switchboard.

It was believed the gang left Crescent driving west after they had released four of the captives, and then doubled back to near Chushing where Stanfield was released.

Hugh A. Adams, president of the bank, said that \$2,000 was in the safe.

Richardson Claims Shooting Accidental
