

KNOWLEDGE AND PREPARATION ARE THE KEYS TO SEVERE WEATHER SAFETY

An Approaching Thunderstorm: When to Seek Safe Shelter: Lightning can strike as far as 10 miles from area where it is raining. That's about the distance you can hear thunder. If you can hear thunder, you are within striking distance. Seek safe shelter immediately.

Know the signs of a tornado: Weather forecasting science is not perfect and some tornadoes do occur without a tornado warning. There is no substitute for staying alert to the sky. Besides an obviously visible tornado, here are some

things to look and listen for:

- Strong, persistent rotation in the cloud base.
- Whirling dust or debris on the ground under a cloud base -- tornadoes sometimes have no funnel!
- Hail or heavy rain followed by either dead calm or a fast, intense wind shift. Many tornadoes are wrapped in heavy precipitation and can't be seen.
- Day or night Loud, continuous roar or rumble, which doesn't fade in a few seconds like thunder.
- Night Small, bright, blue-green to white flashes at ground level near a thunderstorm (as opposed to silvery lightning up in the clouds). These mean power lines are being snapped by very strong wind, maybe a formado.

•Night-Persistentloweringfromthecloudbase, illuminated or silhouetted by lightning -- especially if it is on the ground or there is a blue-greenwhite power flash underneath.

Weather Advisory...

SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCH

Tells you when and where severe thunderstorms are more likely to occur. Watches are intended to heighten public awareness and should not be confused with warnings.

SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNING

Issued when severe weather has been reported by spotters or indicated by radar. Warnings indicate immediate danger to life and property to those in the path of a storm.

TORNADO WATCH

What You Should Do...

Watch the sky and listen to radio and television for further information. Remain alert for rapidly changing conditions. Know the area in which you live. Use a road map of your

area to track storm path. If you can hear thunder, you are close enough to be struck by lightning. Take shelter inside sturdy structure.

- Go to safe shelter in a sturdy building.
- Continue to listen to radio and television for further information. Postpone outdoor activities if thunderstorms are imminent.

Unplug appliances not necessary for obtaining weather information. Unplug air conditioners. Power surges from lightning can overload compressors.

- Avoid using telephone or appliances. Do not take a bath or shower. Use phone ONLY in an emergency.
- LISTEN! Be aware of your Local Early Warning System.

Know the area in which you live. Use a road map of your area to track storm path from weather bulletins. Remember: Tornadoes occasionally develop in areas in which a severe thunderstorm watch or warning is in effect.

LISTEN! Be aware of your Local Early Warning System.

In a home or building, move to a pre-designated shelter, such as a basement.

If an underground shelter is not available, move to an interior room or hallway on the lowest floor and get under a sturdy piece of furniture. Stay away from windows.

↔ LISTEN! Be aware of your Local Early Warning System.



Producers reminded to file acreage reports

Service Agency in unable to meet the FSA county office to meet FSA program eligibility requirements.

"Producers must file their reports accurately and timely for all crops and land uses, including prevented and failed acreage, to ensure they receive the maximum FSA program benefits possible," said Hanlin. Accurate acreage reports are necessary to determine and maintain eligibility for various programs, such as the Direct and Countercyclical Program and newer programs authorized in the 2008 Farm Bill. Programs include the Supplemental Revenue Assistance Payments Program (SURE), Average Crop Revenue Election Program (ACRE), Livestock Forage Disaster Program (LFP), Tree Assistance Program (TAP), and Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honeybees, and Farm Raised Fish Program (ELAP). Acreage reports are considered timely filed when completed by the applicable final crop reporting deadline, which may vary from state to state. Bailey County's final reporting date for small grain is May 17. Prevented acreage must be reported within 15 calendar days after the final planting date. Failed acreage must be reported before the disposition of the crop. Producers should contact their county FSA office if they are uncertain about reporting deadlines. Late-filed provisions
