

# Service dog being used to monitor sugar levels

But when the Bessire's learned that dogs were now being trained to alert on an individual's high and low blood sugars, they began gathering information about the subject and eventually took Boone to a training kennel in Oklahoma that specializes in public assistance dogs earlier this year.
