## Turnbow wraps up MHS career with state win

Tyson Turnbow may have found the perfect way to wrap up his already amazing high school athletic career. He qualified for not one but two Texas State Tournaments by winning the Region I Tennis Singles Championship and tied for Low Individual in the Region I Golf Tournament.

He lost the playoff hole to finish with the Individual silver medal in Odessa.

Both the State Tennis Tournament and State Golf Tournament were scheduled to be played in Austin May 9 and 10. But Turnbow was up to the challenge and came away with a bronze medal in tennis and then won the gold medal as the State Champion Medalist in golf.

"I went to Austin expecting two very long days," said Turnbow. "But I also had high expectations in both events."

"I was not accustomed to humidity and even though the sun was not up during my first tennis match. I had never sweated so much at 6:45 in the morning. My light blue shirt had turned dark blue and I felt like it was 100 degrees."

The University Interscholastic League did not change the dates of

the tournaments but did make some concessions to allow Turnbow to play his opening tennis match at 6:45 a.m., on the University of Texas Courts rather than at the Lakeway Tennis Center.

Turnbow won his opening round tennis quarterfinals match over Chris Gang of Irving North Hills School.

He took first set 6-0 and finished the match with a 6-3 second set. The match was over by eight and he quickly changed clothes and his golf coach, Carey Sudduth, drove him to the Roy Kizer Golf Course where he teed off at 9:55.

"He had about 45 minutes to get

ready to play his first round of golf in the State Tournament," said Sudduth. "He had already played won two sets in the State Tennis Tournament before starting the long tough Roy Kizer Course."

Sudduth went on to say, "Monday was nuts! We had to leave the motel at 5:30 so he could get to the tennis courts by six in the morning. He easily won those first two games, changed clothes and then we threw him in the suburban and drove south through Austin traffic to get to the golf course."

"It was a brutal day with the temperature reaching 98 degrees and it was very humid. The West Texas wind had followed us to Austin. It was blowing 20 to 25 mph with higher gusts all day. The golf pace was very slow and the round took five and half hours."

"When Ty finished and signed his card we put him in back in the Suburban and drove west toward Lakeway for his second tennis match. It was about an hour's drive because of the traffic."

"Fortunately he had a little time to rest before playing his semi-final tennis match. The UIL tennis people were calling and asking where we were because they needed us there

## Neugebauer hosts local town meeting

Area residents joined with Muleshoe High School Students Tuesday, May 17, for a "town hall" meeting with Dist. 19 Cong. Randy Neugebauer focusing on the federal budget and government spending.

"What we're going to talk about over the next hour is spending your money," the congressman said in his opening address.

### "We're going to have to find out how to operate the country using the money we have..."

Comparing the federal budget with that of a family or a business, Neugebauer said something had to be done to control government spending, reduce the current deficit, and prevent the deficit increase he said has been projected due to

President Barack Obama's proposed budget.

"We're going to have to find out how to operate the country using the money we have," Neugebauer said.

"We've got a government that borrows too much, spends too much, and taxes too

much," the 19th district U.S. representative said.

According to Neugebauer, it's too easy for the federal government to try to solve the country's problems by raising the national debt limit rather than resolving the underlying issues.

While an informal poll during Tuesday's meeting indicated many in attendance would support increasing the

## Large crowd on hand to watch Muleshoe athlete at state meet

When Junior Baca walked into the Texas State Track Meet on Friday afternoon to get a feel for what the Mike A. Myers Stadium is like, he took a look around and said to his mom, "Look at all the people that are here to watch."

The reason for the

initial visit to try and rid Baca of the shock and awe of the stadium and the crowd that gathers there each spring to witness the state track and field finals.

"The athletes were able to warm-up in the Darrell K. Royal at the University of Texas Longhorns play football,"

### MAHD board election results show minimal participation

In what has apparently become a Muleshoe Area Hospital District election tradition, only 76 voters in Place 2 and 4 turned out to exercise their right to select their representative on one of the county's most important public boards.

In Place 2, incumbent Scott Brown defeated his opponent, Daniel Patterson in a 27 to 17 win.

Early voting in Place 2 showed results of nine

for Brown and eight for Patterson, but election day totals for Brown were double Patterson's totals at 18 and nine.

In Place 4, incumbent Wayne Pierson, with three votes, fell to his opponent, Chad Nickels, who garnered a total of 29.

Of those votes, Nickels received 16 early votes and 13 votes on election day. Pierson's votes were received during the early

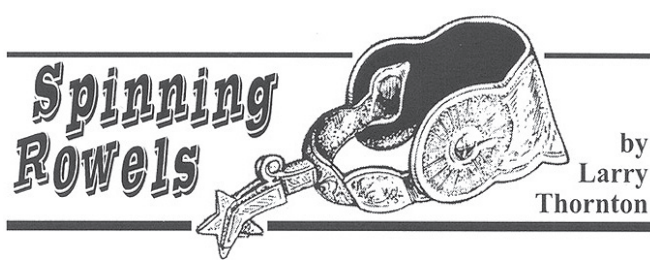
### Anyone who is loud about being holy... is not

Then I think you can be very sure of one thing: they are not holier than others; and pretty darn sure of another: some fairly scandalous bit of "unholiness" is floating not that far down somewhere beneath the surface. Continued from page 1 national debt limit if significant steps were also made to reduce the national debt, Neugebauer said such a reduction isn't possible without taking a hard look at all areas of the federal budget, including both mandatory spending — such as Social Security and Medicare, and discretionary spending, such as defense.

"We need to spend the defense budget more efficiently," Neugebauer said.

Referring to such issues as Medicare and

Social Security, the congressman said years ago the government made promises it couldn't keep, and that both funds need to be re-structured so they are sustainable.

"I think it's time to stop worrying about the politics," Neugebauer said, especially referring to political interest groups that send out postcards for members to address and send to their representatives. "It's time to do what's right," adding that "serious discussion is needed to determine what needs to be done."

## FSA county committee nominations start June 15

Bailey County USDA Farm Service Agency Executive Director Kim Hanlin has announced that county committee election nominations begin June 15.

Farmers, ranchers and landowners are encouraged to nominate farmer and rancher candidates to serve on their local FSA county committee by the Aug. 1 deadline.

Elected county committee members serve a three-year term and are responsible for making decisions on FSA disaster, conservation, commodity, and price support programs, as well as other important federal farm program issues.

"County committee members are a valuable asset because they are local producers who participate in FSA programs themselves and have a direct connection to farmers and ranchers in the community," said Hanlin

Producers may nominate themselves or others as candidates. Organizations that represent minority

said the nation needs to reduce its dependence on foreign oil by increasing domestic production.

He also noted that while part of the problem with the current gasoline prices is the result of supply and demand, the majority is the result of the falling dollar.

and women farmers and ranchers may also nominate candidates. Nominees must participate in a program administered by FSA, be eligible to vote in a county committee election and reside in the local administrative area (LAA) in which the person is a candidate. To become a nominee, eligible individuals must sign form FSA-669A. The form and more information about county committee elections are available online at: www.fsa.usda.gov/elections.

"It is important that the county committee reflects the demographics and agricultural interests of the community these individuals represent," Hanlin said.

County committees are comprised of three to five members elected by local producers. All newly elected county committee members and alternates will take office Jan. 2, 2012.

Nomination forms must be postmarked or received in the local USDA Service Center by close of business on Aug. 1.

## County, area roadways are scheduled for seal coating

Roadways in 16 Lubbock District's counties will see \$11.6 million in preventative maintenance work during the summer months.

"Seal coating provides a variety of benefits to the roadway," said Jim Combes, P.E., Brownfield Area engineer overseeing the project, "including a waterproof surface that prevents moisture from entering and weakening the roadbed. Seal coating also reduces deterioration and cracking of the asphalt surface, which prolongs the life of the pavement."

Other benefits from seal coating include an improved non-skid surface in wet or icy conditions and an anti-glare and increased reflective surface for night and wet weather driving, Combes noted.

Seal coat operations are set to begin in late May. Roadways included in this year's program are:

FM 54 — from US 84 overpass to State Loop 430

US 84 — through the city of Sudan

race. He drew lane one which is not a desirable lane because of the tight curves and opportunity to be boxed in at the cut in point.

But for Baca it would have been his lane of choice because he could see every runner coming off the first curve because of the staggered start.

The runners were all vying for position on that first curve. Baca got off to a great start and shot to the front of the pack to stay out of trouble at the cut-in point. He maintained good position through the first lap and finished it with a time a 57 seconds. He was exactly where he wanted to be.

Bacca started the final lap in fourth place. The kick by the pack came much earlier than Baca was prepared. The pack took off at the 300-meter mark and Baca dropped

from fourth to eighth in approximately 30 meters.

He picked up his pace and worked his way back to fifth place as the group entered the 200-meter curve. Baca became boxed in and could not accelerate and was forced to wait for runners to pass before making his move.

"Junior was finally able to start his kick," said Byrd. "He passed five runners off the final curve to move from eighth back to fourth. And he attempted to run down the third place runner but ran out of real estate. He finished fourth with a 1:58.61."

Greg Bostick from Eddy Bruceville won the gold medal with a 1:56.04, Nathan Sumner of Jarrell was second with a 1:57.47 and Adam Montez from Stanton took the bronze with a 1:57.56.

"All the Muleshoe coaches in the stands really thought that if he had not gotten boxed in off the last curve he would have been in the run for a medal," continued Byrd. "But it was valuable on-the-job training for Baca."

"He learned how the big boys are going to run the 800 in Austin. He really did a great job and with more hard work on his part next year and a little luck he could be back and win the whole thing."

"The silver medal winner this year placed fourth last year. So he must have learned a little something in Austin last year. Junior had a great time and learned a lot. I want to thank all the Muleshoe parents and fans for their great support of the track program," concluded Byrd.

Turnbow not only had to walk the 6,739 yard golf course but he had to carry his clubs. He had six bogeys, two birdies and 10 pars in his first round.

The early leaders self-destructed on the back nine leaving Turnbow leading by a single stroke at the end of the first day.

“I was playing with the leader and as his game began to crumble I took that as encouragement to try and stay focused,” continued Turnbow. “The wind did not bother me all that much as every tournament I have played in this year have been windy. I felt very good at the end of round one with a one stroke lead.”

“I took a little nap on the way back to the tennis tournament. It seemed like people just kept handing me food and things to drink. I ate bananas and a sandwich. I knew I had to stay hydrated but I got tired of eating and drinking.”

Turnbow was scheduled to play tennis at 2:30 p.m., but it was closer to 4:30 when he arrived at the courts.

“My legs were a little tired so I got off to a sluggish start in the semifinals of tennis,” said Turnbow. “My opponent was very good and he jumped out a 5-0 lead on me in the first set before I finally won a point.”

Turnbow lost that first set 6-2 and went down 6-3 in the second.

“I was a little frustrated and tired after losing. But after I thought about it for a minute I was very happy to receive the bronze medal. I do not play a lot of tennis and normally play for fun. I was thrilled to finish that high in the state.”

Muleshoe Superintendent, Gene Sheets said, “It would have been more fair if Jordan Jackson of Stockdale had had to run a hundred laps around the court before the match started.”

Jesse Guerra from Tornillo went on to win the tennis gold medal. Turnbow had defeated Guerra in the Region I tournament in Odessa.

It was about 8 p.m. by the time Turnbow finished his second tennis match so he grabbed some chicken from a fast food place and headed to the hotel and hit the bed about 9 p.m.

“When I got up the next morning I could hardly stand up,” continued Turnbow. “My legs felt like they were made of Jell-o™. But after I walked around and got ready I was feeling a lot better. We were up at 6:30 and I grabbed a couple of

bananas and we headed to the golf course.”

“I knew I had to stay focused because I had a goal before I left Muleshoe. I had to concentrate on doing my very best. I started the front nine with a birdie and then triple bogeyed the second hole.”

When he looked at the second hole there was water on the right and trees on the left. He hooked his second shot into the trees. He then hit a tree with his first attempt to escape the trees and had to take a second shot. He finished the par five, 559 yard hole, with an eight.

“A lot of kids would have lost it right there on that second hole,” said Sudduth. “He walked away from that triple bogie and was facing some of the hardest holes on the course. But he just got it back together and shot par golf on the next four holes. He is an amazing young man.”

“As we walked to the third hole Coach Sudduth was telling me to keep my head up,” continued Turnbow. “I really did not get frustrated and told Coach, ‘It would not be as good a story if it was all easy.’”

He regained his focus and shot par golf on six of the next seven holes and birdied the other hole to finish the front nine. Turnbow took a bogey on the 10th hole and then shot par golf through the next eight holes.

“There are no leader boards out on the course but Coach Sudduth was keeping up with the scores on line with his phone. He told me I had a three shot lead when I was standing on the 15th tee.”

“When I got to the 18th tee box I ask him where I stood. Coach ask me, ‘Do you really want to know?’ I said yes I do and he asks again, ‘Do you really want to know?’ I told I really did want to know and that

all three days he played. He hit his driver only three times during the tournament. Most of the time he used his two and three irons off the tee.”

“Some players hit their drivers off the tee on almost every hole and found themselves in trouble most of the time. I know Tyson would have loved to have shown the other players that he could bust the big ball with his driver.”

“But he is such a disciplined player that he stuck with our plan. By hitting the iron off the tee he had longer second shots to the green but he missed very few greens on his second shot.”

“The final hole is a great example. It is a tough 430 yard par four with forest on the left. There is water and sand to the right and the green is very shallow and guarded by sand. Ty hit a three iron off the tee and an amazing six iron from 208 yards to only 20 feet from the pin.”

“That is the way he played for two days. If he had putt well I believe he would have won the tournament by well over 10 shots. He stayed composed and determined the entire tournament. I have thought that he was the best 2A golfer in Texas for the last three years.”

“But golf is a funny game and the best player loses more than he wins. It was really a great experience to see him concentrate, execute and finally get it done.”

“I am very proud of this fine young man. He is a great example to all of us in everything he does. I saw lots of kids acting bad on the golf course when things did not go their way. You never see that from Ty. I hope my two girls grow

up to be just like him and conduct themselves that way in everything they do.”

“There were approximately 40 people in Ty’s entourage. They all met at the tennis courts on the first day and then followed us to the golf course. They left their cars and followed him around the course providing him with all the support they could muster.”

“They then followed us back to the tennis

courts and cheered him for his courage and determination as well as his abilities. It looked like a train as we worked our way through the Austin traffic. We appreciated that support very much and it made this trip very special for Ty as well as for me,” said Sudduth.

“I want to express my thanks to all those that supported him both here at home as well as in Austin. It was an awesome two days,” concluded Sudduth.

was when he told me I had a five shot lead.”

“I felt a lot better after that and thought that if I shot par on the final hole that I should hang on for the win.”

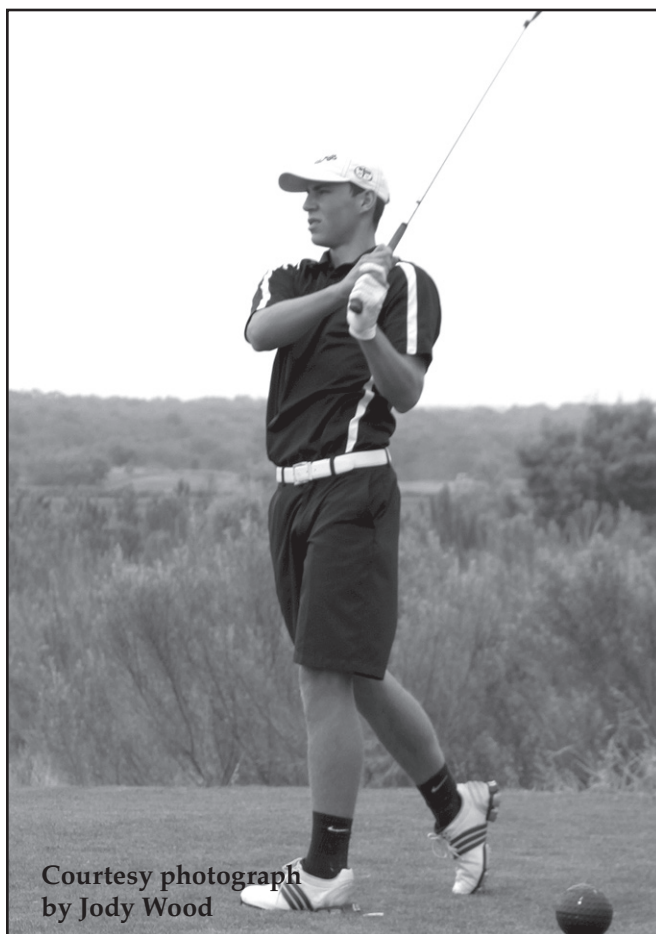
Turnbow did shoot par on the 456 yard par four. He hit two iron shots and then two putted for the par.
