Turnbow wraps up MHS career with state win

Tyson Turnbow may have found the perfect way to wrap up his already amazing high school athletic career. He qualified for not one but two Texas State Tournaments by winning the Region I Tennis Singles Championship and tied for Low Individual in the Region I Golf Tournament.

He lost the playoff hole to finish with the Individual silver medal in

Both the State Tennis Tournament and State Golf Tournament were scheduled to be played in Austin May 9 and 10. But Turnbow was up to the challenge and came away with a bronze medal in tennis and then won the gold medal as the State Champion Medalist in golf.

"I went to Austin expecting two very long days," said Turnbow. "But events.'
