New Tax Program and Its Provisions

President Roosevelt's new tax program was the latest bomb shell turned loose by the administration on the natives. The president informed his congressional lieutenants he wanted his program charted "provided it did not endanger other programs such as the utility bill, the TVA and the banking bill." The tax program outlined by the president sent the administration leaders up in the air. They had planned to recess July 15. Now they are not certain which road to take. The new tax schedule would include high inheritance and gift levies and a tax to restrict "very great individuals net income" and substitute a graduate corporation tax ranging from 10 3-4 per cent to 16 3-4 per cent. 




