

Steer-Frog Game May Affect Championship

TEXAS OUT TO DASH HOPES OF TCU SQUADMEN

AUSTIN, Nov. 13 — What promises to be one of the finest aerial games of the Southwestern season is in store for football fans who gather in Memorial Stadium here Saturday to witness the annual battle between the T. C. U. Horned Frogs and the Texas Longhorns.

The Longhorns rested Monday after their comparatively easy win over the Baylor Bears last week, but started Tuesday one of the most intensive work programs since early in the season. Pass defense was slated to take up much time as Chevigny planned to prepare his charges for the coming of Sammy Baugh, premier tosser of forwards in the nation.

No injuries were suffered in the Bear tilt, enabling the Longhorns since more to place their full power on the field for this important encounter. The Frogs, undefeated and untied to date, will be most anxious to retain their unsullied record, while the Steers, already out of the conference race, will seek to continue their winning ways started at Waco last week.

The contest is likely to develop into a passing battle between Baugh and Buster Jurecka of the Longhorns, though Chevigny plans to concentrate on the development of a smooth running game.

The performance of second and third stringers — Frankovic, King, Maedgen, Launey and Henderson in the line, and Collier, Sands and Johnston in the backfield — last week added a little encouragement to the outlook for the Texas coaching staff.

In sixth place in the nation stand the Texas Christian university Horned Frogs. The Frogs have yet to meet the Mustangs and if they are successful in their attempt to down the mites this year, may replace them at the top of the list.

Immediately behind the Frogs are the Rice Owls. The rating sare based upon both conference and inter-sectional play. Princeton is ranked second, Minnesota third, and California, fourth.

Breckenridge has just about grabbed off the Oil Belt district title for this season. The Buckaroos have yet to play the Ranger Bulldogs, but almost everyone is conceding that as a mere formality.

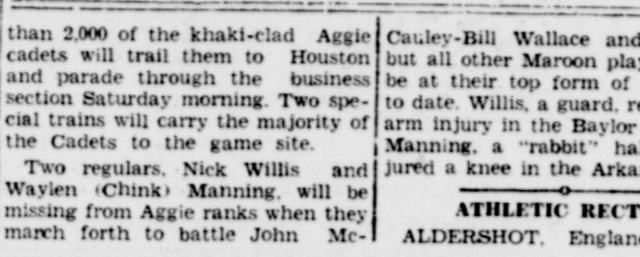
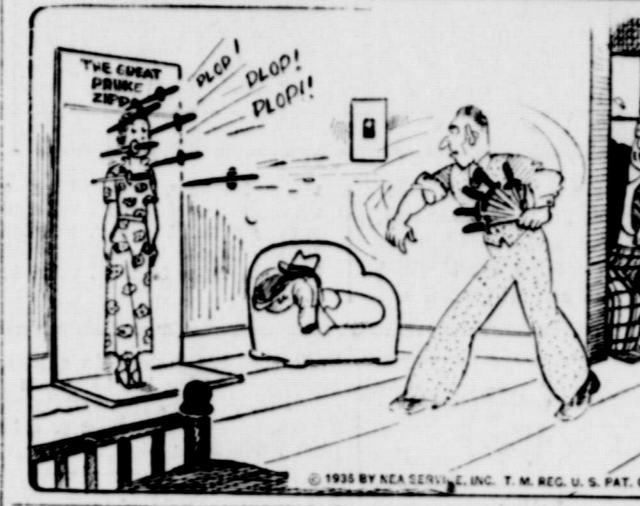

AGGIES PLAN OFFENSIVE TO PLUCK OWLS

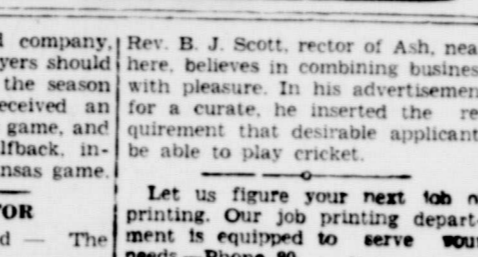
