ADDIS ABABA, Dec. 21 — Ethiopia claimed officially today to have captured Enda Selasi, 31 miles west of the holy city of Asksum, and then to have taken Dega Shah, north of Aksum.

The fighting was part of a widespread Ethiopian offensive which began last Sunday and continued for days. It was claimed in private advices that Italian casualties were more than 600 and the Ethiopian somewhat less.
