



Nov. 1, down 11 percent 1. This inventory was from a year ago.

According to the Nov. 1, 2011. monthly report released by the Texas Field during October totaled Office, the estimate was 2.18 million head, 13 down slightly from the percent below October Oct. 1 level. Producers placed 450,000 head in commercial feedlots during October, down 20 percent from a year ago and down six percent from last

Texas commercial feeders marketed 440,000 head during October, down five percent from 2011 but up 10 percent from last

month. On Nov. 1, there were 2.31 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern High Plains, 87 percent of the state's total. The number on feed across the area was down nine percent from last year and down slightly from the Oct. 1 total.

October placements in the Northern High Plains totaled 394,000 head, down six percent from the September total. Marketings were up 10 percent from last month to 388,000 head.
