
Norman Thomas Speaks for Socialists

Norman Thomas is the number one socialist of the United States. Addressing an audience at Kansas City, he said, "Whatever else critics of President Roosevelt may say, they are wrong when they accuse him of socialistic leanings It is a poor authority on socialism that says the new deal is socialistic. Only the TVA partakes in any respect of socialism and it is not generally so because of the capitalistic settings in which it was placed." Speaking of Alfred E. Smith, "the happy" or "unhappy warrier," Socialist Thomas said, "Smith hurt only himself in his recent Liberty League speech. He has lost his political cunning or he would never have spoken his piece at a plutocratic gathering. All he did was to fan prejudices of a small group while losing out with the masses of the people he hoped to influence." Well, Thomas speaks for himself. President Rooseveli speaks for himself and a vast number of voters as well, as "the happy warrior" spoke for himself in other days and not for "the unhappy warrior."


