



After I had made the rounds and brought all the bottles I could find back I would have to walk home and we lived in Jack Julian's house on the far west edge of town.

In a very fine little book entitled, The Will of *God*, Weatherhead went on to say, "Surely we cannot identify as the will of God something for which a man would be locked up in jail, or put in a criminal lunatic asvlum." But, all too often, we do. Weatherhead goes on in his fine book to help us be a good deal more accurate in the way we use the phrase "the will of God," as he talks about God's original (intentional) will for this world he created, his circumstantial will for this now-fallen world, and his ultimate (or ideal) will for his people for eternity. It's good to think about such things. If we are unable or unwilling to work hard enough to deal with such questions, we usually end up adopting the terminology of insurance companies who label everything they can't control or don't understand as "an act of God." We lay at the feet of the Author of life the blame for suffering, tragedy, and death, and we attach to the Giver of all good gifts the responsibility for almost everything that goes very badly wrong. I know, because I've done it, too. It is a mistake that says more about me than I like to think.

Texas Cattle On Feed Slightly Up For June

total.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter across the area was market in Texas feedlots with capacity of 1,000 last year and up three head or more totaled 2.77 million head on June 1, up slightly from a year ago.

According to the monthly report released by the Texas Field Office, the estimate was up two percent from the May 1 level.

Producers placed head. 580 thousand head in commercial feedlots during May, up four percent from a year ago, and up 41 percent from the April 2012 total.

Texas commercial feeders marketed 500 thousand head during May, down four percent from last year but up eight percent from last month.

On June 1, there were 2.39 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern High Plains, 86 percent of the state's total.

The number on feed up two percent from percent from the May

May placements in the Northern High Plains

totaled 507 thousand head, up 41 percent from the April total. Marketings were up eight percent from last

month to 427 thousand

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the United States in feedlots with a capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 11.1 million head on June 1. This inventory was two percent above June 1, 2011.

Placements in feedlots during May totaled 2.09 million head, 15 percent above May 2011.

May placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds totaled 520,000 head; 600-699 pounds totaled 365,000 head; 700-799 pounds totaled 530,000 head; 800 pounds and greater totaled 672,000 head.

Marketings of fed cattle during May totaled 2.02 million head, one percent above 2011.

Contest Eating Rules

This event will be a speed-eating contest, with the following rules in effect:

• Food items may be separated, but the entire item must be consumed. (The wrapper shouldn't be eaten.)

 A bottle of water will be supplied for each contestant; however, dunking or dousing the food items before consumption is not allowed.

- Condiments will be provided at contestant's request, but must be applied after the contest starts.

• Contestants will be given five wrapped hot dogs and buns. At the signal to start, the contestant will urwrap and consume their hot dogs. Once the food items are consumed, and the contestant's mouth is cleared of food, the individual contestant must shout to show their mouth is empty.

- Remember, talking with your mouth full will be deemed "picnic violation," as will failure to properly phrase the statement.

— An eating judge will identify a successful contestant. The winner will be determined by the event judge. The event will be recorded on video for broadcast, and may be utilized by the event judge to resolve any questions concerning the competition.

 Should a contestant be observed hiding his or her hot dogs, dropping them in part or in whole under the table, or placing them on another contestant's plate the guilty contestant will be deemed in performance of a "picnic violation," as determined by an eating judge, and receive an additional hot dog for consumption.

• Contestants who are unable to retain their food items will be disqualified.

- In such an event, contestants are encouraged to use the provided buckets for non-retention.

• In the event of a tie, the winner will be determined by the consumption of a second set of five hot dogs.

• Creative participation is encouraged, but good sportsmanship is required.

- Obviously, most rules of normal table etiquette, except for "picnic violations," are out the window.

The decisions of the eating judges and the event judge are final.

• The winners of the two divisions will receive a trophy to commemorate their achievement.

~Registration~:

The event is limited the first 20 participants to register. Contestants may register prior to the event during regular business hours at the Muleshoe Journal news office. Unfilled slots will be open for registration on the morning of July 4, 2012, but registration will close 30 minutes prior to the contest's official time. All contestants are required to check in 15 minutes prior to the contest's official time.
