NEW GOVERNOR, THEIR TO LONG, VOWS REFORM

BATON ROUGE, La., May 12.—Richard Webster Leche will inaugurate his governorship today at the first session of the Louisiana legislature since the assassination of the late dictator, Senator Huey P. Long.

As Long lay dying in Our Lady of the Lake hospital here from a wound inflicted by a young Baton Rouge eye, ear and nose doctor, he summoned political leaders to his bedside and demanded that Leche become the candidate on the long ticket.

Although expecting death, this was the last demand imposed by Leche upon the political followers who had stood by him so staunchly since he rose to power.

Won by Largest Vote The Long leaders, after disagreement which for a time threatened to split the faction, finally got together and Leche was entered in the Democratic primaries. He won Representative Cleveland by the largest vote ever polled for an office.

Prior to becoming candidate for governor, Leche, who was graduated from the Tulane University School of Law, served on the appellate court bench in New Orleans. Before that he was secretary of Governor Oscar Kelly Allen, who died a few weeks after Long's death in the lobby of the Louisiana capitol.

Following Allen's death, James M. Noe, lieutenant governor during Long's regime, became chief executive.

Inherits Wide Powers With his inauguration Leche will become actual head of the Long administration.

BALLOT GIVES BORAH EDGE IN WEST VIRGINIA

CHARLESTON, W. Va., May 12.—West Virginia voters today will go to the polls in a primary that will indicate their choices for almost all important national, state and local elective offices.

The Mountain state will select its delegates to the republican and democratic national conventions, while voting on presidential preferences. Candidates for one United States senate seat will be nominated. Candidates for the house of representatives also will be chosen. Nominations for governor and other state offices will be voted.

KIDNAPER'S CRIME CARRIES DEATH PENALTY

WASHINGTON, May 12.—(AP)—Thomas Robinson, Jr., admitted after his capture in California, it was learned today, that he subjected Mrs. Alice Stoll to merciless violence while he held her captive.

This admission under the new federal kidnaping law makes Robinson eligible for the death sentence. Justice head J. Edgar Hoover quoted Robinson also as saying: "I paid plenty for protection."

This evidently was an indication that the ransom money had been largely dissipated in Robinson's flight from the law; it also carried the inference that Robinson had been in some manner, connected with the underworld despite the general belief that he was a "lone wolf."

However, Hoover flatly denied a report that a tip from Alvin Karpis had led to the capture of Robinson. California Department of Justice Agents advised Hoover that under questioning Robinson told them he was forced to use a lead pipe to coerce Mrs. Stoll into submission according to the confession transmitted to Hoover.

ROBINSON IS SEIZED IN LOVENEST WITH WOMAN

GLENDALE, Calif., May 12.—(AP)—Thomas Robinson, Jr., accused kidnaping of Mrs. Alice Stoll was seized with a "lovenest" young woman, federal agents revealed today.

While refusing to release all details in the capture here last night, agents admitted that a woman was with Robinson when they forced their way into a bungalow where he was hiding. The woman was not held, and agents said their information indicated she played no part in the abduction and had joined Robinson later.

EFFORTS BEING MADE TO SECURE PEANUT FACTORY FOR CISCO

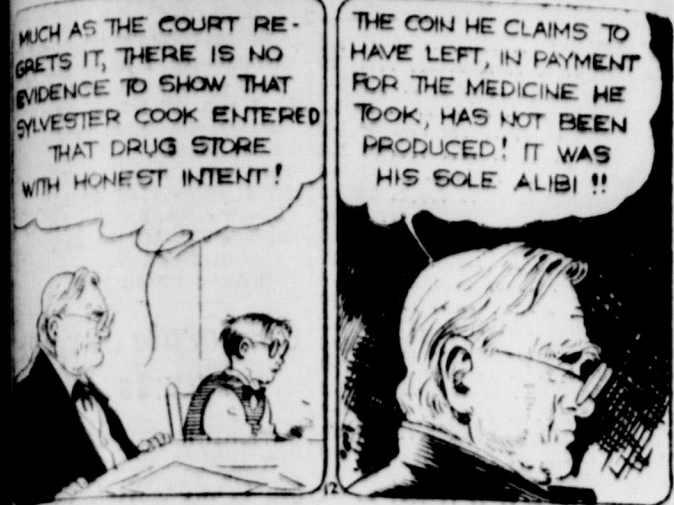
"I am working toward securing a peanut factory for Cisco," said J. E. Spencer this morning on being questioned as to activities of the chamber of commerce.

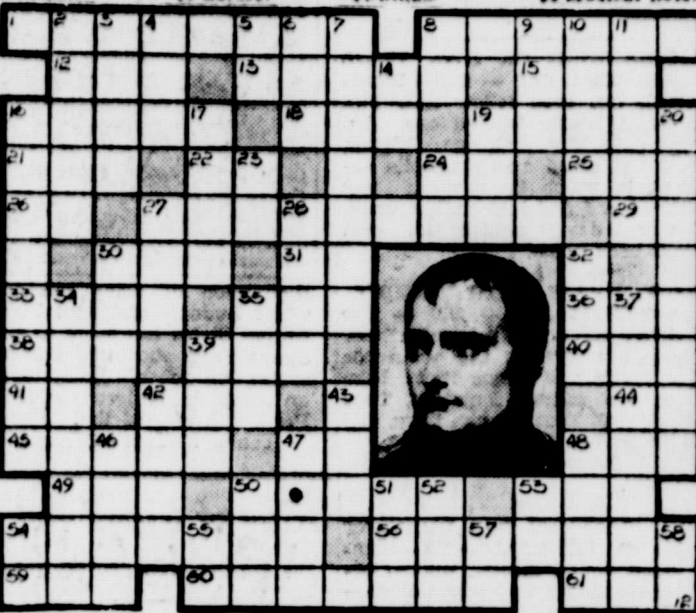

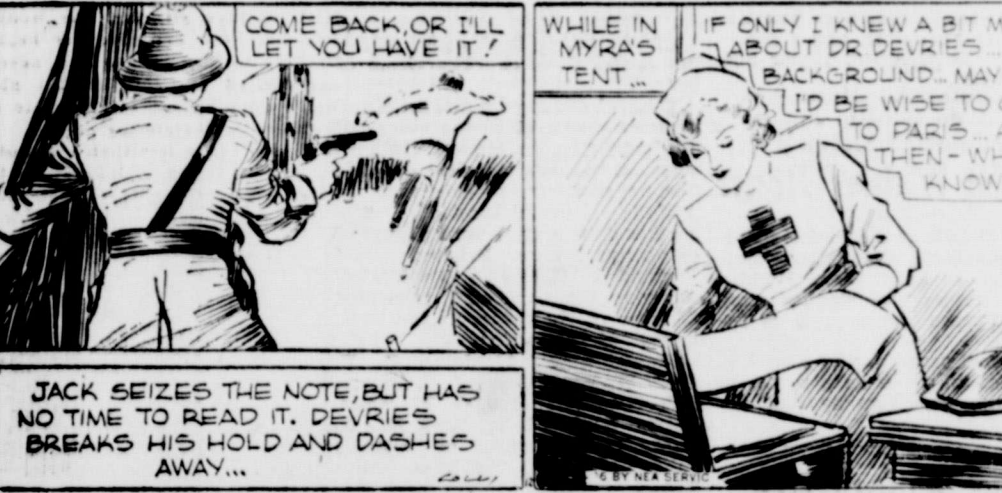

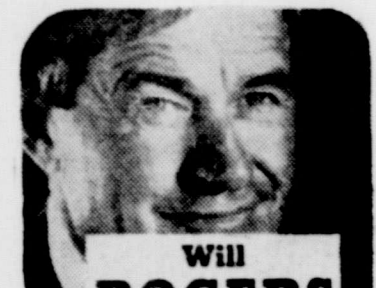
