CHARGES USE OF MAILS TO DEFRAUD

U. S. Treasury To Float Large Bond Issue

NEW MONEY REQUIRED TO PAY BONUS

WASHINGTON, May 21.—(U.P.)—The U. S. treasury will float a bond issue of \$1,000,000,000 or more on June 1st, Secretary of Treasury Henry Morgenthau Jr., revealed today. A formal announcement of the issue will be made on June 1st and bonds will be dated June 15th. Morgenthau declined to reveal the exact amount of the new financing, but it is known that \$686,616,416 of one and one-eighth per cent treasury notes mature on that date and the amounts of new money required to meet payments of soldiers' bonus funds soon after June 15th is expected to bring the new bond issue well above \$1,000,000,000.

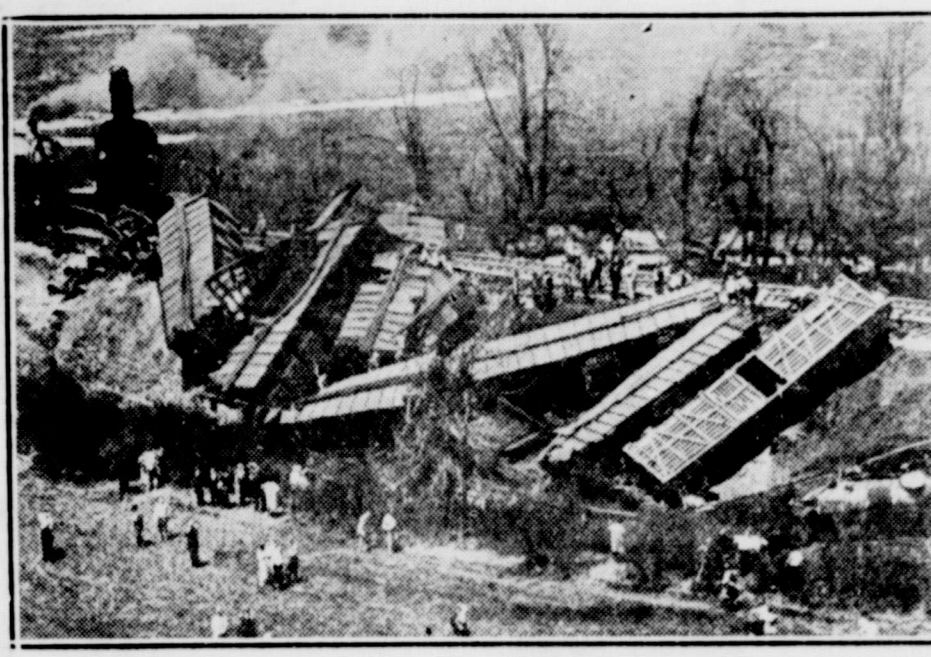
HOUSTON MEN MAKE BOND ON FRAUD CHARGE

Joe B. TOTAL PENSION PAYMENT TO BE \$2,362,500

AUSTIN, May 20 — (U.P.)—Orville Carpenter, executive director of the Texas Old Age Assistance Commission, informed Governor James Allred today that the national social security board yesterday granted a Texas request for allotment of \$1,812,250 of federal funds to match the state's old age assistance fund for the months of July and August.

Carpenter returned to Austin today from Washington.

The announcement was taken to mean that the first distribution of pension funds will be \$2,362,500 as federal funds are to be matched dollar for dollar with state funds.

Carpenter, before leaving for Washington, estimated there will be 60,000 initial pensioners. The average monthly claimant to that number possibly \$2,362,500 for two months would be \$29.00.

Under the law, the payments are to be made the individuals only in accordance with their needs for a standard of living to which they have been accustomed. A limit of \$15 a month is placed on the state's payment which, matched by federal funds, makes a maximum of \$30 for any one pensioner.

Announcement of formal approval followed an airplane trip by Gov. Allred and Carpenter to Washington hurriedly last Saturday when it was learned that federal director Wilmont was to leave today for Europe.

Summer School At Randolph June 1

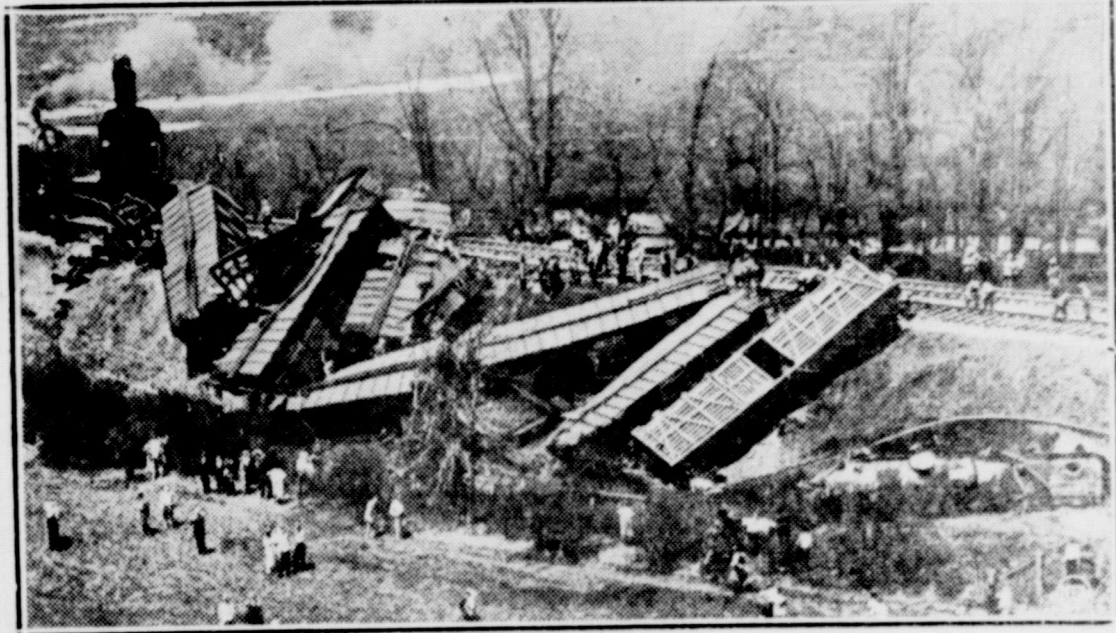

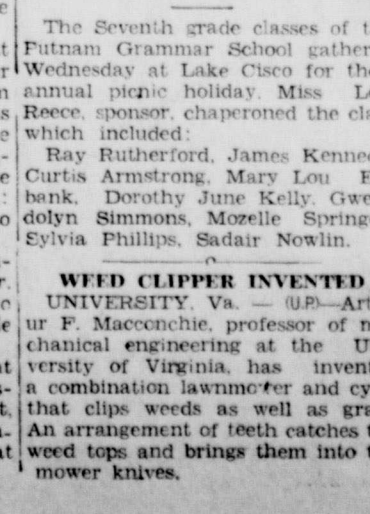
