One Saturday night not long ago in a certain state in this land of the free and the home of the brave, a married woman who had found it necessary to get a job, came home with her pay envelope. Her husband forcibly took her money away from her. However, the next morning before leaving for church to worship God, he yielded to her pleadings to the extent of giving her back five dollars of her earnings.

Don't shower invectives on that husband's head. He was entirely within his legal rights, for the law of his state declares that a man can quite justly appropriate his wife's wages. So you see that according to the legal code of his commonwealth the man was not unfair with his wife but in fact generous in that he let her have so much as five dollars of her own money.

On one side of a state line, that wife-wage-appropriating husband is a law-abiding citizen. Yet twelve inches away, across the line of another state, which recognizes a married woman to be a person and gives her the right to her earnings, he would be a law-violating citizen. See how absurd the law can be?

In one state a person can get a divorce for almost any reason imaginable on three months residence. In another state a year is required. 



### City Pays Interest On Re-issued Bonds

City Secretary J. B. Cate and Assistant Lonnie Shockley were busy this morning checking over about \$9,000 worth of bond coupons that represent interest on new bond payments for May, and which the city has met promptly in its provisions for a settlement of Cisco's bonded indebtedness program.

The city has not only paid the interest on new bonds issued but would be able to meet the interest payments on all bonds should they be issued now. Bonded indebtedness totaled \$4,843,500 and of this amount \$4,221,500 have come in for refinancing, about 87 per cent to be exact, according to City Attorney R. E. Grantham.
