lar session Tuesday night passed an ordinance relative to tax payments making the penalty more lenient in some respects to the end that delinquents may be encouraged to pay without the cost of suits that are to be instituted where parties are thought to be able to meet the payment now due, and past due.

The essential features of the ordinance are the reduction of interest penalty from 10 per cent to 8 per cent and it is to be temporary as to time in force.
