ECLIPSE STUDY ON JUNE 19 SET FOR 36 PARTIES

MOSCOW, June 12-(U.R)-Preparations are nearing completion in Soviet Russia for the observation of the total eclipse of the sun which will be seen June 19 in a zone extending from the Caucasus across the Southern Urals and Siberia to Pacific Ocean.

Foundations for coelostats and ther complex up-to-date installaions have been erected in 16 main observation points in this zone. Days before the eclipse, 25 Soviet 11 foreign astronomical and geophysical expeditions will arrive in the zone. Some now are instal-ling instruments and completing eparations for photographing all phases of the eclipse and studying the spectrum of the solar corona, the microstructure of the chromosphere of the sun and its






