Such accuracy seems miraculous. Many will say that George B. Terrell the fact that Bill takes care of 1,500 clocks, and winds them all every week, has a good deal to do with it. He couldn't Clyde L. Garrett very well help winding up his own mental clock.

Usually, however, it seems to work the other way. The more we use clocks or watches, the less able we are to tell Cecil A. Lotief time intuitively.
