## Cisco's Park Projects—Their Future!

One of the significant things that Judge Clyde Garrett said in his Monday night talk was that his marvel through the years as a neighbor of Cisco had been the way Cisco stood shoulder to shoulder and went after what they wanted and usually got it. It was marvelous, he said, but true, nevertheless.

And in looking back through past decades, there would seem to be much truth in the observation. Cisco may have argued with itself often times about domestic matters but when some momentous time arrived, petty things were forgotten and all forces lined up for the battle for what Cisco wanted. Many accomplishments are now victorious trophies, hanging at the belt of achievement.

And now another thing seems within the grasp. The Presbyterian recreation building for the district is almost secured. Twenty-five hundred dollars were needed to be raised locally upon which the PWA project hinged. Presto, and it was secured and placed in the bank. Plans have been made for a recreational building for the grounds and those have been approved. Labor needed and it will soon be plentiful. Now, the only thing lacking is that we do not go to sleep like we did on the park when Fort Griffin secured its allocation while Cisco was only a silent contender. But the Presbyterians of this district, led by Rev. Applewhite and others of his kilt, do not seem to be the acquisitive type. It is safe to say they will get the \$14,000 approved for the project and they will become the bell weather that will lead other churches in the parade toward Lake Cisco's recreational borders for similar church parks and playgrounds.

Every one contacted thus far, seems sold on the idea and perfectly willing to grant Cisco her CCC camp and park improvements in the picturesque canyon north of the city. But, as Federal Inspector Ayres said Monday night, we must write the state parks board long and frequent letters lest they, in the general clamor, pass by Cisco's demands in these lines. We need the improvements to make the unusually grand scenery available to our other playground facilities. When united by the proposed improvements, Cisco's recreational facilities will be outstanding, not only for the state but for the entire south.

We will get this improvement, and it will be another scalp in our belts and our good friends all over this section, like Clyde Garrett, will rejoice with us because, while it is in Cisco territory, it will be accessible to all and can be enjoyed equally by Moran, Rising Star, Cross Plains, Eastland, Ranger, Breckenridge, Putnam and more remote towns.

Cisco will not build a wall about it but will welcome all who will come. She will go further. She will spend many dollars inviting visitors from far and near to share with her what nature in her happiest mood made available for our pleasure.

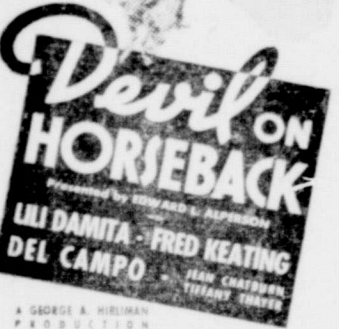

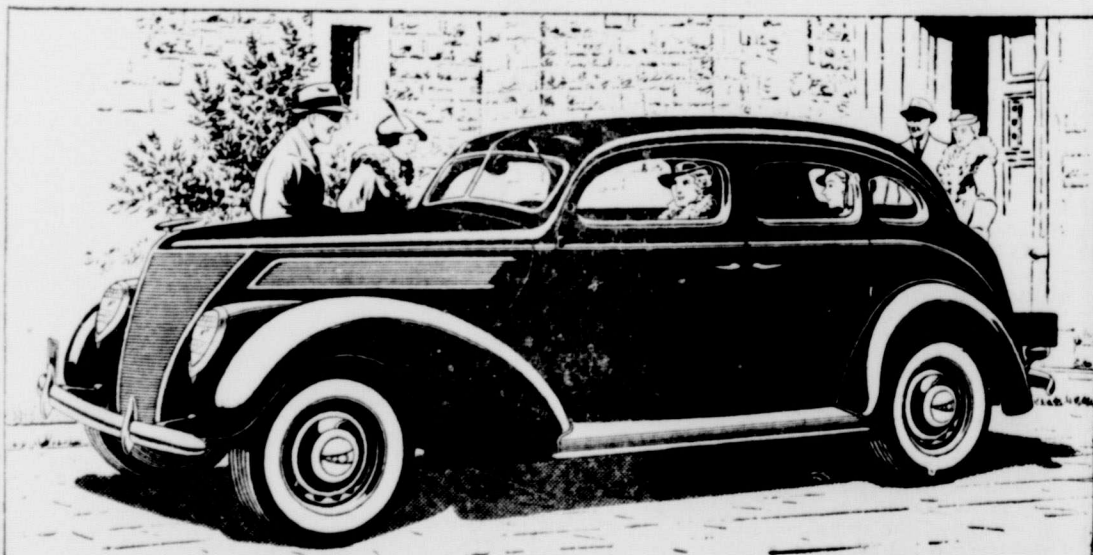

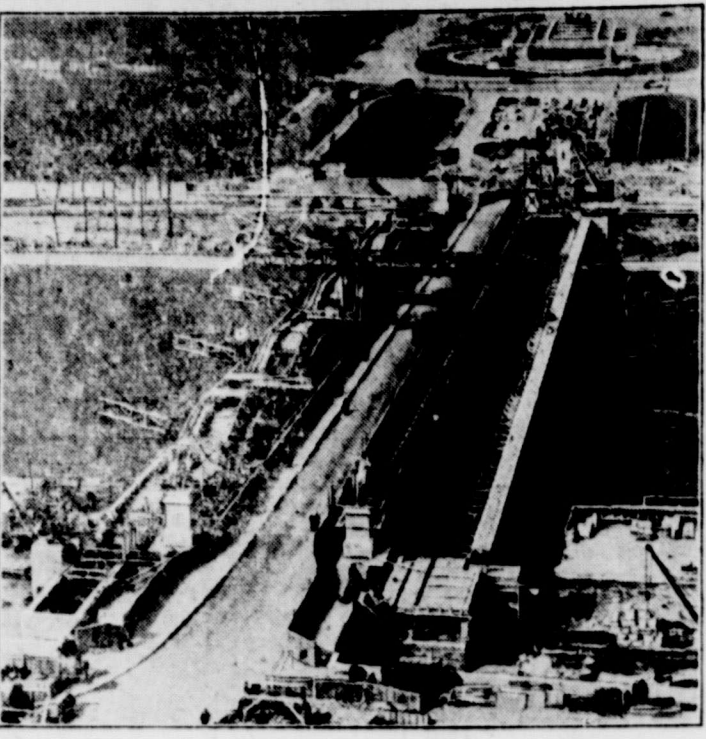
