Fruit Gelatin Discovered as Flavor and Color Ingredient for Cookies, Served With Home-Made Coffee Ice Cream.

George Washington's birthday will be celebrated with parties in every part of America, and each hostess will want to serve something new, yet appropriate for the anniversary of the man who not only was Father of His Country, but who also made the cherry tree famous here.

Here is a brand new flavoring idea which will help to make a success of the bridge party held that week. Who ever heard of using fruit-flavored gelatin as a flavoring and coloring ingredient for cookies? It's a novel idea, and the result here is a delicate, tasty cherry cookie that makes the guests ask for the recipe. To go with it, the recipe is also given for delicious home-made coffee ice cream. These two, with some patriotic decorations, will make the party a fitting celebration.

**CHERRY COOKIES**

3 cups flour  
1 teaspoon cream of tartar  
baking powder  
1 cup sugar  
1 package quick-setting gelatin dessert (cherry flavor)  
1 cup shortening  
3 eggs  
3 dozen candied cherries

Sift together flour, baking powder, sugar and cherry gelatin dessert. Add shortening, mixing in well with a fork. Add unbeaten eggs. Roll out very thin on floured board and cut with floured cookie cutter. Cut cherries in halves and place one half in center of each cookie. Bake in moderate oven at 375 degrees F. for 8 minutes. Makes 6 dozen.

**COFFEE ICE CREAM**

1 package vanilla arrowroot pudding  
1 1/4 cups milk  
3/4 cup strong dated coffee  
1 cup cream  
1/2 cup sugar

Mix vanilla pudding with 1 cup milk, coffee and 1/4 cup of the cream. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Remove from fire, add sugar. Cool slightly and pour into refrigerator freezing tray. Let freeze about 1 hour until starting to freeze. Mix remaining 3/4 cup cream with remaining 1/4 cup milk. Whip until stiff. Fold into pudding mixture. Freeze quickly about 3 to 4 hours. Makes about 1 quart.
