CONNELLSVILLE, Pa. (AP)—Sixteen years old, 6 feet 8 1/2 inches tall and still growing—that is William Percy, Connellsville high school freshman.

Eating is his favorite pastime, he says. For breakfast he eats one or two grapefruit, two or three cereal biscuits and drinks a quart of milk. Lunch, he says, usually consists of "whatever is in the house."

Then comes dinner — his "big meal." Usually he eats two steaks, a quantity of fruit, a plate full of lettuce, a loaf and a half of bread and whatever side dishes happen to be available.

"But ice cream is my favorite food," says William. "I eat it by the quart. I just had 11 hot dogs for lunch, but I wasn't hungry."

He can pick up the front end of an automobile or a billiard table and can easily hold a typewriter with one hand.

His 236 pounds rest on size 23 shoes, which cost \$50 a pair. Half-

soling the shoes costs \$2.50. He wears a size 17 1/2 shirt with an extra long sleeve. His waist measures 30 inches and his chest 43. With arms outstretched, he measures 86 inches from fingertip to fingertip.

As to his prospects, William says, "I'm just the baby of the family. I've got an uncle who is 7 feet tall. He's full grown."

FARLEY POINTS TO 5-YEAR GAIN FOR AIR MAIL

WASHINGTON, April 8 (AP)—The domestic air mail system of the United States—started with a single line between Washington and New York in 1918—has become one of the largest and most efficient in the world.

The first route was 218 miles in length. Today the domestic air mail system includes more than 29,000 route miles, over which carriers flew more than 44,000,000 miles last year.

Postal Evolution Since 1854 From Camel to Plane

WASHINGTON (AP)—In 1854 to make transportation of mails across the western deserts of this country a "certainty," the post-office department purchased a number of camels in Egypt and Asia Minor for \$30,000.

The stony surfaces on the deserts of Arizona and California injured the soft pads on the feet of the camels. An unsuccessful attempt was made to provide the camels with specially devised leather boots. The idea finally was abandoned.

"This new and greatly improved and expanded service is being provided at an annual cost of \$7,000,000 less than was expended in 1932 for the limited and inadequate service operated in those days," said Postmaster General James A. Farley.

15,377,000 pounds of domestic air mail were transported during the last fiscal year, compared to approximately 10,000,000 pounds in 1932 and approximately 6,000,000 in 1931.

He estimated the United States dispatched 26 per cent and received 22 per cent more foreign air mail during the fiscal 1936 than during the previous year.

"The people of the nation demand, and rightly so, that the postoffice department keep pace with the march of transportation progress in the swift and efficient transmission of the U. S. mails," Farley said.

Farley estimated the department paid \$165,000,000 during fiscal 1936 for mail transportation service. This sum was approximately 23 per cent of the department's total expenditures, he said.

Air mail transportation costs consume 1.6 cents of each dollar of revenue received by the department, Farley said.

The postmaster general said legislation enacted as result of the senate investigation into airmail and ocean mail subsidies safeguarded the steady growth of the domestic system.

"Contracts are now let by real competitive bidding and changes in pay rates can only be made by the Interstate Commerce Commission," Farley said.

"Evils and wastes existing in the administration of ocean and airmail subsidies were brought to light. The revelation of these evils by Senator Black's committee resulted in legislation which has thrown new safeguards around these subsidies," Farley declared.
