SEVENTY DEAD IN SPANISH REVOLUTION

MADRID, April 21. (U.P.)—Madrid today underwent the worst punishment of the war in a concentrated artillery bombardment which left the streets strewn with dead.

It was unofficially estimated that 25 were killed and approximately 60 injured. Casualties for the last 10 days are 70 dead and wounded.

One attack began at daybreak today and continued for several hours at two- and three-minute intervals. The second bombardment started at noon.

Two Youths Killed By Electric Wire

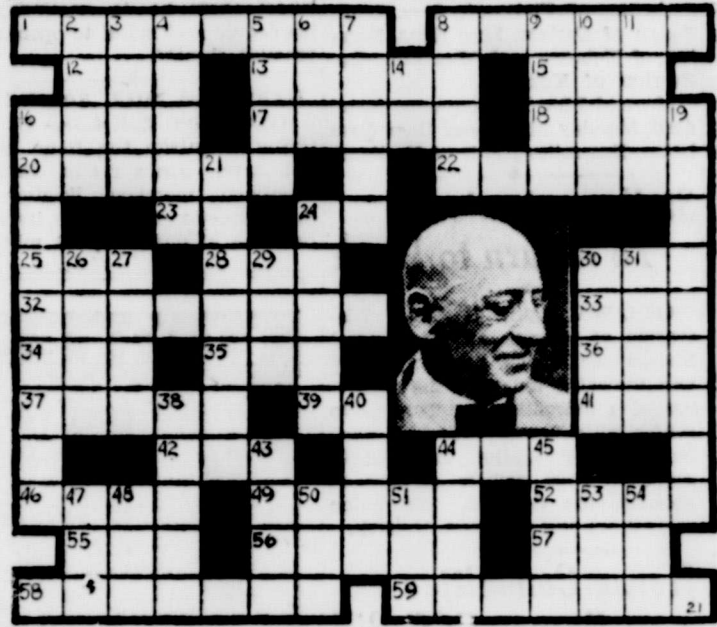

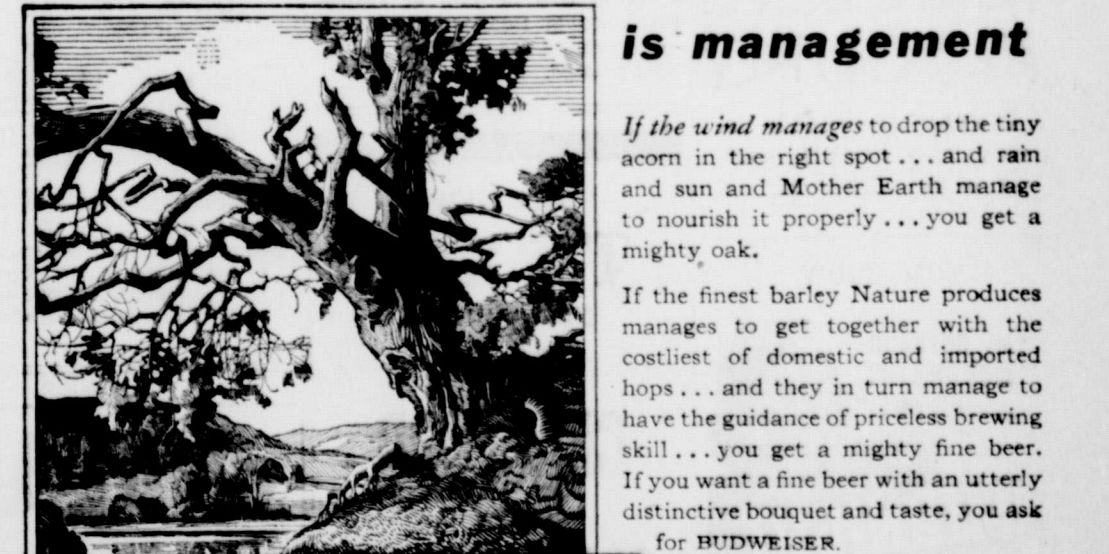
