## Cisco Child Care Center Open House To Be Sunday

The Cisco Child Care Center has announced an open house for Sunday, February 11, from 2 p.m. until 4 p.m. at the center located at 501 West 8th.

The center has been operating from this new address for some time and they are anxious for the people of Cisco to see the accomplishments of the past year.

The center is licensed to accommodate 68 children, instead of the 30 in the previous location. It is centrally heated and fully air conditioned, with adequate room for the children to exercise when the weather does not permit their being out of doors.

Complete new furnishings have been installed, with adequate space for the separation of each age group activity.

The center is unique in that there has been no outside financing from either the state of Texas or the federal government, although they are under all regulations prescribed by both.

Financing has been through contributions from local citizens, civic organizations, and churches. It, according to one officer of the center, "was built by the citizens of Cisco; underwritten by the citizens of Cisco, for the citizens of Cisco." It is a project of which Cisco can be justly proud, for it is "An exercise in Americanism."

## Five Inches Of Snow Blankets Cisco Area

A reported five inches of snow blanketed the Cisco area on Monday of this week, to give area residents some more "practice" of walking and/or driving on slick city streets and sidewalks. The snow was accompanied by some sleet and freezing rain later in the day, adding to the difficulties encountered by local residents.

As the snow became packed and overnight temperatures dropped into the low 20's, Tuesday morning roadways were extremely treacherous with a number of persons sliding into ditches and off roadways. Reports indicated that Highway 80 between Cisco and Eastland was a solid sheet of ice and extremely difficult to maneuver.

By noon Tuesday the local temperatures had reached the 30's and most of the ice and snow accumulated on roadways began to turn to slush. With the traveling of autos on the roads, most streets were safely passable by mid-afternoon.

Wednesday morning the remaining moisture on the highways was frozen in spots making early morning travel a bit tricky. But for the most part the city streets were

virtually clear of ice and snow.

Local cattleman, J.V. Heyser Jr., stated Tuesday morning that cattle were having a difficult time finding anything to eat under-

neath the snow-blanketed fields.

Forecasts for the remainder of the week call for the weather to clear off with a gradual warming trend toward the weekend.

**STATE CAPITAL HIGHLIGHTS**

AUSTIN—New Gov. Bill Clements asked the legislature to strengthen the governor's powers substantially to deal with growth of the government and bureaucracy.

Clements, in the "first chapter" of his messages to lawmakers, asked for budget supervision authority and gubernatorial power to remove state agency members "for stated reasons" and with Senate consent.

Highlights of the new Republican governor's recommendations included:

- A repeat of his call for a \$1 billion tax reduction.
- Power for the governor to appoint chairmen of state boards and commissions "from time to time."

- A freeze on state hiring and an "attrition policy" to reduce the number of state employees by 25,000 over four years.
- Initiative and referendum powers for citizens to pass or veto laws.
- A constitutional ban on state corporate or personal income taxation.
- Power for local voters to ratify or reject tax increases by election.
- Limiting the governor, lieutenant governor and attorney general to two four-year terms.
- Abolishing the state's 10-cent property tax for college buildings.
- Development of a plan for a single tax appraisal office within each county.
- Full implementation of the 1978 tax relief amendment.

Clements, throwing down the glove before advocates of a 22 per cent budget increase, told defenders of sharp hikes in spending the burden of justifying their decision is on them.

**Cut Sought**

House Speaker Bill Clayton says the Legislative Budget Board budget can be trimmed by \$500 million and the amount returned to taxpayers.

Clayton recommended a 2.5 per cent cut across-the-board in the \$20.8 million LBB appropriations draft.

Lt. Gov. Bill Hobby, who presides over the Senate, insists the bill cannot be trimmed without a substantial reduction in state services.

Gov. Clements and former Gov. Dolph Briscoe claim a \$1 billion reduction and corresponding tax relief is possible.

Clayton seeks to "freeze" state employment at current levels, to require pooling of state airplanes and to prohibit contracting by state agencies for consultation services and studies without prior approval by the governor.

Meanwhile, Associate State Education Commissioner Raymon Bynum told the House Appropriations committee, in effect, the legislature will have \$72 million more for tax cuts than anticipated. The legislature set aside \$450 million to reimburse school districts for revenue they will lose due to the 1978 tax relief amendment, but Bynum said cost of implementing the amendment is more like \$378 million.

**Expanding**

There may be multiple capital complexes in the future. State rent payments

jumped from \$1.5 million in 1970 to \$6.1 million in 1978, and may go up to \$8.1 million in 1984.

A new \$28 million office building has been authorized, but State Board of Control Chairman Charles Coates said that it will not meet all needs.

High costs are forcing the board to consider developing many capitol complexes, especially on land the state already owns, according to executive director Homer Foerster. The board's master plan, said Foerster, envisions clusters of state buildings outside the present capitol area.

**Courts Speak**

The Texas Supreme Court set a February 28 hearing in a major case involving Rio Grande Valley water rights.

The Court of Criminal Appeals overturned the death penalty murder conviction of a Nacogdoches man in the shooting of his former father-in-law.

The State Supreme Court upheld an intermediate court decision that two Houston oilmen should have a full trial of their suit claiming they were cheated out of their share of a Webb County natural gas bonanza.

The Court of Criminal Appeals refused to rehear its reversal of murder convictions against Elmer Wayne Henley and Ignacio Cuevas.

The U.S. Supreme Court agreed to consider whether the federal government can ban laetrile. Fifteen states including Texas have legalized laetrile for use in treating cancer.

The top court also refused to hear a challenge of a Texas law prohibiting retail sale of many items on a consecutive Saturday and Sunday.

In other Texas cases, the U.S. Supreme Court took under study an Austin ruling which could bring \$50 million a year in Social Security benefits to mothers of illegitimate children and left intact a Texas provision for allowing persons convicted of felonies in state court the right to vote but denying the right to those convicted in

federal courts or other states.

**Committees Named**

Key House committee chairmanships remain firmly in the hands of loyal conservative supporters of Speaker Clayton.

Rep. Bill Presnal of Bryan retained chairmanship of appropriations and Rep. Tom Uher of Bay City, state affairs. Rep. Bob Davis of Irving will head ways and means, and Rep. Tom Massey of San Angelo, calendars. Rep. Pete Laney of Hale Center remains as administrative committee chairman. Rep. Al Brown of San Antonio will preside over constitutional amendments and Rep. Hamp Atkinson of New Boston, public education.

**Short Snorts**

Gov. Clements termed successful his mission to Mexico to discuss energy, the drug problem, illegal aliens and the "tortilla curtain." He proposes a future conference with border state governors to review mutual concerns.

The Senate approved \$1.5 million in emergency appropriations for the attorney general's office and the Railroad Commission.

George W. Strake Jr. took the oath of office as Texas secretary of state and began his new duties last week.

The Texas legislature invited Mexico President Jose Lopez Portillo to address the House and Senate.

Rep. Paul Moreno of El Paso is new chairman of the House Mexican-American Caucus, and Rep. Arnold Gonzales of Corpus Christi is vice chairman.

Anti-abortion groups rallied at the capitol in support of legislation to restrict abortions.

Eleven applications to register \$6.8 million in securities for sale in Texas were filed with the State Securities Board during the last week.

G. Rudolph Garza Jr. of Corpus Christi and Shannon H. Ratliff of Austin are new members of the Texas Board of Law Examiners.

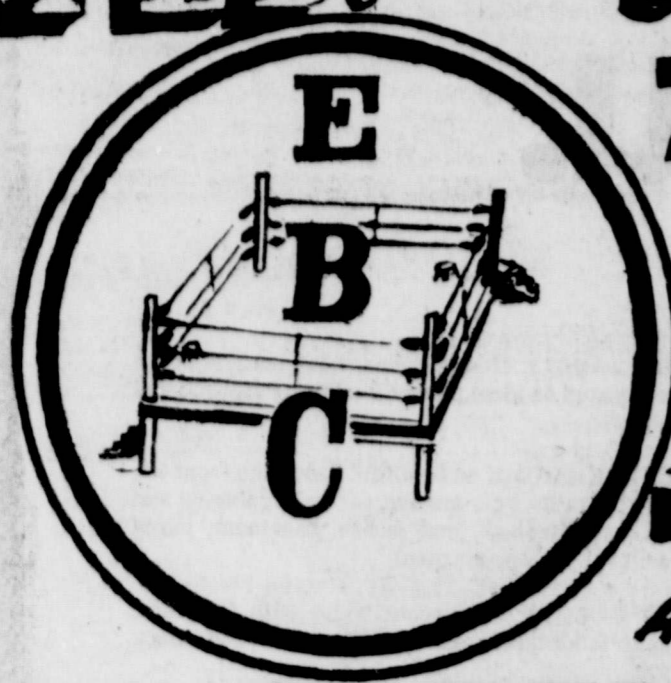

**Census Bureau Begins Operation**

Census Bureau address compiling operations for the 1980 census have begun in Texas from an office located in Dallas, said Mr. Julian Moseley, office manager. Temporary workers are being hired now to begin putting together lists of addresses from which mailing labels will be prepared for use on the 1980 census questionnaires. They will be mailed to each of some 80 million households nationwide in late March 1980. Census Day is April 1, 1980.  
Mr. Moseley said the address-collection phase of the census operation will take several months to complete, also involved are checks of the lists to make sure all area dwelling addresses are included. Census workers will drive or walk thousands of miles of streets and roads asking at each household for a correct mailing address. These address lists play a vital role in taking an accurate census since they are used to record completed questionnaires returned by mail. Households which do not mail back a completed census form within several weeks after Census Day in 1980 will receive a visit from a census taker who will interview householders for the information required on the questionnaire.  
The 1979 address collection activity in Texas is part of a Census Bureau program involving 35,000 temporary workers nationwide to compile lists containing approximately 30 million addresses. Another 50 million addresses have been purchased from commercial mailing list companies.



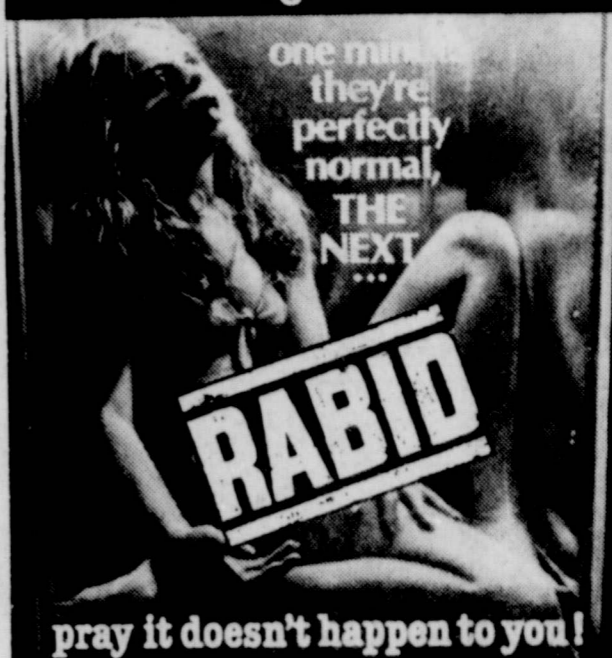

# Eastland County Newspapers Invited To Foreign Policy Conference

EASTLAND COUNTY Newspapers has been invited to attend a Foreign Policy Conference for Editors and Broadcasters to be held at the U.S. Department of State in Washington on Feb. 21 and 22.

It'll be an On-the-Record conference with Sec. of State Cyrus Vance and other ranking officers of the government scheduled to give briefings.

Subjects on the agenda include: Salt II and U.S.-Soviet Relations, China, Middle East, Africa, International Economic Policy and other matters.

The conference will be held at the Loy Henderson Conference Room in the Department of State at C and 22nd Sts., N.W.

What would you ask? WHAT EVER happened to the Garrett Corp.? Remember the "un-talk" talk that ran through Eastland County about three years ago about the big, big company that "just might" locate a major plant here? There's not been much said recently. Guesses are that inflation, world economy and other matters have a bearing on the lack of talk.

There was hard work put in on the effort back in 1974 and '75. Remember the Law Enforcement Barbecue on the Courthouse Lawn and Bicentennial Celebration, at which Sen. Lloyd Bentsen (at that time an announced candidate for President) was present? He and Cong. Omar Burleson, who was also a

guest of honor here that summer, were advised of the local hopes for the plant while they were here, and here's a copy of a letter which went to Sen. Bentsen later:

Sen. Lloyd Bentsen It was a real pleasure having you in Eastland last Saturday for the Law Enforcement Association meeting and also for the Bicentennial Recognition Program. In addition to expressing our gratitude for your visit here I would like to bring you up to date on an industrial prospect which is considering Eastland as a possible location for a uranium enrichment plant.

The company involved is the Airesearch Manufacturing Company of California.

This firm is a division of the Garrett Corporation [one of the Signal Companies], which has manufacturing plants located across the country. Airesearch has conducted feasibility studies covering the construction and operation of a centrifuge type enrichment plant. A portion of the enriched uranium would, after further processing, be used as fuel in nuclear power plants. Construction of this facility would be carried out in phases with initial production scheduled for 1980. At that time investment in the plant would be approximately \$100,000,000, and when fully expanded over a five year period, approximately 1200 employees would be required to operate the plant.

The total investment would be in excess of \$500,000,000. Representatives of the Airesearch Manufacturing Company were in Eastland last November and again in January looking at sites and visiting with community leaders. Because of the economic, social and cultural impact of a plant of this size, this facility would be an important addition to all of Eastland County. The cities of Cisco and Ranger have given their whole-hearted support to Eastland and our efforts to locate this plant here and the city commissioners Court have passed resolutions pledging their cooperation and support.

In mid-July Airesearch Manufacturing Company will submit proposals to the E.R.D.A. Evaluation Board in Washington. It is our understanding that E.R.D.A. proposes a federal subsidy on the output of uranium enrichment plants for a specified period of time in order to encourage private business to enter the enrichment field. This participation would require legislation by Congress. Also, a permit from the Nuclear Regulatory Commission would be required for the operation of a uranium enrichment project. At this point, we do not know of any problems that might arise in connection with the federal processes involved. However, we wanted you to have this background and let you know that Eastland and the surrounding cities and towns would very much appreciate your help if assistance is needed.

"Stay the mail?"  
 "Not rain. Not sleet. Not snow!"  
 "Bureaucracy?"  
 "Yes!"  
 Mail service stopped for 18 towns in this area early this week--and if the ice storm didn't clog the wheels of commerce, lack of mail in our out, did. Albany, Moran, Cisco, Putnam, Cross Plains, Rising Star, Cisco, Olden, Eastland, Ranger, Strawn, Mingus, Gordon and Santo did not have mail movement, in our out. Monday.

The Star Route Contractor, who operates under the Department of Transportation, our new bureau guidelines, exercised his prerogative to decide that the conditions were unsafe for life and or equipment, and decided not to move the mail. The same contractor has a contract for the route from Carbon, Gorman, DeLeon, Lingleville and Stephenville, and these towns did not have mail movement. These were the only towns in this entire area which did not have mail service at the beginning of the week. Mail service was as near normal as was humanly possible out of Breckenridge, Comanche, Blanket and Stephenville.

The Postal Service, which catches complaints from many directions, doesn't deserve criticism on this one, and it would appear that it could be another classic example of over-regulation at the federal level, in which the regulations of one bureau can penalize the operations of another. The Postal Service Tuesday found a Special Delivery parcel, mailed Monday in Rising Star, addressed to Eastland, at the Cisco Post Office. Postmasters and postal employees throughout this affected area were apologizing for the inconveniences. Through the hurried efforts of postal officials, the contractor agreed to an early run into Fort Worth Tuesday afternoon to start

the mails toward regular schedules. Persons who were inconvenienced enough to want to suggest that such "over-lapping" bureau-

cratic fumbling be "fixed" so that future snafus may be prevented, might consider letting their legislative representatives know:

Sen. John Tower and Sen. Lloyd Bensten may be written to at the Senate Office Building; and Cong. Charles Stenholm, [who has just been named

to the Postal Service Committee] may be written to at the House Office Building, all in Washington. Cong. Stenholm will be

in Cisco Sunday, Feb. 11. We might ought to write now, and maybe wait for a pretty day to mail it--so it'll get out. HVO.

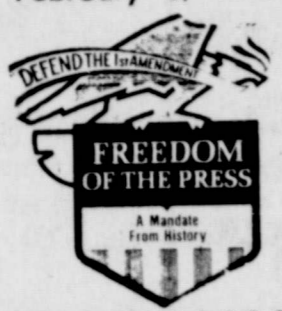

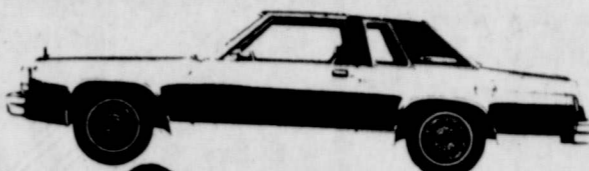

SEVERAL FRIENDS have suggested that we should have our head examined because we came home from the Rio Grande Valley as a new cold wave and ice storm was beginning. And we didn't argue the point.

The weather down south wasn't too good during the some three weeks we were away. There was one balmy day while we were there. Several times, the night-time temperature dropped to the mid-thirties and often the day readings were in the fifties. And there was quite a lot of rain.

REGARDLESS of the unseasonably cold weather down south, the valley is full of travel trailers and visitors from the north country. Those from the northern states and Canada take consolation in the knowledge that temperatures in their home country is zero and below and with record snow-fall.

Saw figures that the average number of Winter Texans (as they're called in the valley) exceeds 100,000 each year. As you might guess, these folks are most welcome in the valley. They

fill up many trailer parks plus all of the hotels and motels. They represent a big industry and valley cities go all out to make them feel welcome.

MEXICO IS nearby and is quite an attraction. All winter visitors enjoy trips to border cities where there are a few nice restaurants in each town. And there are many, many shopping opportunities. Prices are pretty attractive in some areas and high in others. For example, gasoline costs about \$1 per gallon in Mexico and most Mexicans drive across the border to fill their gas tanks at U.S. service stations.

Generally speaking, prices are good on crafts. Leather goods is 25 percent cheaper there. Liquors sell for about half USA prices. Sugar and coffee are about the same. Many Mexican families make one trip a week to USA super markets to buy groceries. They buy most of their clothes in the USA. It is a big deal for a Mexican man to take his girl friend to Brownsville, Harlingen or McAllen for dinner at a USA cafeteria.

A BAD FREEZE in the valley a month or so ago took

quite a toll in the fruit orchards. You see evidence of damage around Harlingen -- dead citrus fruit trees in many places. The fruit that was damaged by the freeze was rushed to juice plants and it wasn't a total loss.

Fruit prices are higher this year due to demand. Standard bags of grapefruit and oranges run from \$1.75 to \$2.50...Strawberries were available at roadside stands and in the super markets -- three pints for \$1.00...Lettuce prices were around 40 cents per head...Carrots were being harvested as was cabbage.

GOT HOME IN time to discover that the 40-gallon water heat at our house had just sprung a leak after 12 years of faithful service. With the help of Neighbor Marshall Jones and Plumber Jack Rawson, we got a new one installed. And work was still going forward to dry carpets and water soaked things as this was being written.

VISITING OUT at Graham Memorial Hospital, we learned that Lawyer Bill Wright is a patient, having been flown here from Houston where he underwent treatment in Brother-in-law Bob Parker's jet airplane last week. He was resting comfortable when we

looked in...Mrs. Al Anderson had been there several days and her jeweler husband and two sons were visiting. Was Al doing a good job looking after the boys, we asked? "Yes, with the assistance of Mrs. AA's parents," she replied...Guess you saw it in the papers that Dash Crofts, son of the Sutton Crofts of Cisco, was among the celebrities playing the Crosby Golf Tournament out at Carmel, Calif., last weekend...See by the papers that one things won't ever be changed when the metric system is finalized -- football fields will always be 100 yards long. Guess there is something that is sacred, huh?...One local business man says he remembers best Dr. Kiker's advice in his recent CoC banquet speech here: "Be kind to your critics -- they ain't ever gonna put no beans on your table." In addition, the Canadian operation did not recover as planned from the effects of its mid-1978 strike and a relatively low backlog. Power Equipment, however, met its forecast although the first fiscal quarter is traditionally affected by an end of the calendar year slow down in business activity.

Burgess-Europe's operations were unprofitable, as forecasted." Mr. Rogers said that the second quarter would be marginal, but that the second half should see a turnaround in the Company's fortunes. 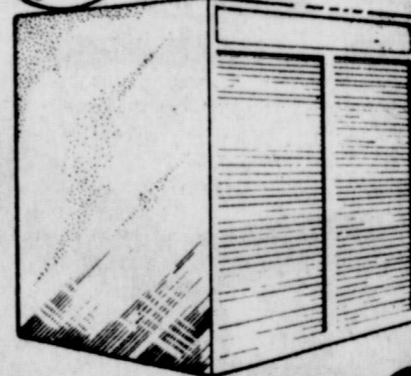
