




"A tree grows in Cisco" was a much talked about subject this past week. The Cisco Civic League in their

Residential Homestead Exemptions To Be Available Until April First

The Cisco Independent School District would like to remind local property owners that they will have until April 1st to file for their homestead exemptions. If you rendered your property before January 8, 1979, you should check with the tax office to see if you were granted the homestead exemption as they had just gone into effect at that time. There is no age qualification for this exemption, if you lived in a residence located within the Cisco Independent School District on January 1st, 1979, you are eligible and could save as much as \$46.54 on your 1979 taxes.

The tax office would like to remind all property owners that April 1st, 1979 is the deadline for rendering your property. The law requires that all property be rendered each year by April 1st. If property is not rendered by that time, it is placed on the unrendered tax roll; and has a value assessed by the tax assessor. If you have any questions about the homestead exemption or the rendition of your property, please contact the tax office before April 1st, 1979. The tax office is located at 610 Ave. D.





Do you need financial assistance to attend or continue attending an educational institution?

The U.S. Office of Education supports two grant programs. Money received by students under these programs are gifts and are not to

Eligibility for these grants include being enrolled or accepted for enrollment in an postsecondary approved educational institution. college, university, technical school, or hospital school of nursing, and being a citizen or permanent resident of the United States

The BASIC EDUCA-TIONAL OPPORTUNITY GRANT PROGRAM makes funds available to eligible students attending approved colleges, community junior colleges, vocational school. technical institutes, hospital schools of nursing, and other post-high school institutions. To apply for a basic grant, a form called "Application for determination of basic grant eligibility" must be completed.

The SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL OPPOR-TUNITY GRANT [SEOG] PROGRAM is for students of exceptional financial need who without the grant would be unable to continue their education.

One is eligible to apply is he is enrolled at least halftime as an undergraduate or vocational student in an educational institution participating in the program. Graduate students are not eligible

If a student receives an SEPG, it cannot be less than \$200 or more than \$1,500 a year. Normally, an SEOG may be received for up to four years. However, the grant may be received for five years when the course of study requires the extra time. The total that may be awarded is \$4,000 for a four year course of study or \$5,000 for a five year course.

The educational institution must provide the selected students with additional financial assistance at least equal to the amount of the

Apply through the financial aid officer of any participation institution. He is responsible for determining who will receive an SEOG and the amount.

There are many more sources of aid for students. Some are sponsored by the federal government, others states. localities. businesses, organization, individuals, associations, and other private sources. To find out what they are, get in touch with the financial aid officer at your school.

NOSE BLEED Bleeding from the nose is a common problem. Medically this condition is called epistaxis. Most often it is caused by trauma -- either a fall or blow to the nose or by the patient picking or scratching inside his nose.

Many children have spontaneous nose bleeds on and off and they are growing up. The cause for these nose bleeds is seldom found, but it

results from one of the blood vessels in the septum of the nose break and bleeding.

Older patients may have nose bleeds from high blood pressure, growths in the nose, infections in the nose, or heardening of the arteries. Certain generalized diseases may increase the risk of nose bleed. Such diseases are measles, typhoid fever, heart kidney failure failure, (uremia), Leukemia, and cer-

tain other blood diseases. The treatment of epistaxis is usually simple, but may become very difficult in some cases. The first thing to try to is to apply pressure to the side of the nose that bleeding. Just press the outside of the nose against the septum and hold the pressure for several minutes. If this does not stop the bleeding, then insert cotton inside the nose and again apply pressure. If these simple measures do not stop the bleeding, the patient should go to the physican's office or the hospital. If the doctor can see the bleeding vessel in the nose, he may burn the spot with a chemical or with an electric needle to stop the bleeding. If this does not work or if the vessel cannot be seen, then a pack of guaze is inserted and left in place for several hours. If bleeding continues with the pack in place either a posterior pack (inserted through the mouth and up behind the nose) or an inflatable rubber pack can be inserted. In extremem cases surgery might be required to tie off blood vessels going to

the inside of the nose.







It will soon be time to start spraying for this insect, the plum cuculio as well as brown rot disease. the cuculio is the little white worm sometimes found around the seed when peaches and plums are harvested.

When 75 percent of the petals have fallen spray with 50 percent Malathion plus a fungicide. The fungicide Captan, Benomyl (Benlate). or wettable sulfur should be added for disease control. Mix six tablespoons of 50 percent Malathion in three gallons of water. You may add seven tablespoons of wettable sulfur in the same solution. In place of sulfur you may use 11/2 (one and one half) tablespoons of Benomyl or four tablespoons of Captan.

on disease and insect control. Before using any pesticide, carefully read its entire lable. Note any special precautions, such as need to wear special protective clothing when applying the chemical. Take necessary precautions in pesticide applications to avoid any unnecessary

chemical contact. Fertilizer and week killer combinations are designed to appeal to the inherent lazy streak present in almost all home gardeners. The idea of fertilizing the lawn and killing the weeds all in one application is difficult to resist.

Weed killers when used properly can be great timesavers and eliminate a lot of back-breaking work. However, they must be used according to the directions given on the container if they are to be effective and not endanger valuabbe plants in the landscape.

The same chemicals that will the weeds are frequently harmful to the trees, shrubs and vines used in the landscape. Since tree roots invade the lawn area and usually extend beyond the branch spread it is difficult to apply a fertlizer-herbicide mixture to the lawn area without danger of damage to the desirable plants in the lawn.

All to often the time to apply fertilizer is not the correct time for effective and additional information weed control. Each type of

herbicide must be used at specific rates and at a critical time to be effective for killing weeds.

While fertilizer should be applied at the recommended rate, there is usually little harm if the homeowner fails to calibrate his distributor correctly and makes a slightly heavier application. If herbicides are contained in the mixture, this error can be very damaging to the desirable vegetation. Another difficulty which frequently arises is the part of a sack of the mixture left over after the lawn has been fertilized. Frequently this is left in the garage or tool shed until fertilizer is needed for a flower garden or rose bed. The fact that the fertilizer contains a herbicide is forgotten, and irreparable damage is done to a favorite beauty spot in the garden.

Many of the more popular landscape trees including oaks, mulberry, sycamore, and others are highly susceptible to weed killers. When contemplating the use of a herbicide or herbicide and fertilizer mixture, always read all of the precautions given on the label. 



said this would not be necessary so this is why I question his diagnosis.

-Mrs. J.C.B., Louisana DEAR MRS. B .-- It is not unusual for you to be unaware of having diabetes. Many times diabetes if found during routine examinations or while being treated for another illness.

Most people are also unaware of the seriousness of the disease, its warning

signs and the dramatic increase in new cases. Diabetes is a major health problems for millions of people around the world and at least 10 million live in the

United States.

There are two forms of diabetes: Insulin-Dependent Diabetes (juvenile-onset) is characterized by the sudden appearance of Constant urination, abnormal thirst, unusual hunger, rapid loss of weight, irritability, weakness or fatique, nausea.

Non Insulin-dependent diabetes (maturity-onset) may include any of the signs of insulin-dependent diabetes or: drowsiness, itchfamily history of



Rev. Buddy Sipe, pastor of the First Baptist Church, was master of ceremonies at the banquet, which was a family style supper.




