Local voters will go to polls on Saturday, April 7, at the Corral Room, 400 Avenue D, in Cisco to decide the outcome of three local elections. The polls will be open for eligible voters from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., with Doug Fry serving as election judge. In order to be eligible to vote in this election, a voter must have been registered in the county by March

In Saturday's election, two of six people will be elected to the City Council, two of three persons will be elected to the Cisco Hospital District Directors and two of four persons will be elected to the Cisco Independent School District board of trustees.
