Vanquisher Of Dragons

BY VIOLA M. PAYNE In stories of long ago, courage was symbolized by a Knight riding a white horse,

dashing off to slay a dragon. But courage can take many forms. The people of Cisco realize that courage also rides in a wheel chair, in the person of Patsy Nance. And Patsy has vanquished more dragons than most of us meet in a lifetime.

Patsy's longtime friends are accustomed to seeing her, serene and lovely, use that chair. But any person who meets her for the first time noticable recieves emotional impact. There is no outward sign of her disability. She has clear skin, dark hair, and a vibrant smile. A fairy-tale princess, strangely immobilized. One longs for the magic word to free her!

But the word does not come. For this is reality-a reality which sliced into her life one November day in 1947. It began with a car accident near her home in

Patsy was only fifteen, a Sophomore in Cisco High School. Before that time, the only real tragedy she had known was the death of her brother, Garland Nance Jr., from pneumonia. Patsy had sparkling good looks, lots of friends, and parents who gave her many advantages. Her mother, Lavena, made the home a pleasant place. Her Father, Garland R. Nance, was an Accountant with his own office in Cisco. was interested in community affairs, and

served on the School Board. Patsy loved music, and had taken piano lessons from Ora Howell of Cisco and Wilda Dragoo of Eastland. She enjoyed sports and all the school activities.

The Nance family belonged to the First Methodist Church, and Patsy had faith in God and His wisdom. She would need every bit of it. After the accident, anyone who could help Patsy mobilized into action. First came the hospital in Cisco. where it became obvious that her spinal cord was injured between severely shoulder blades. neurosurgeon drove over from Dallas. Later Patsy went to Baylor hospital in Dallas, for more tests and surgery. Time fragmented for her, falling apart in great chunks. Days of oblivion, days of pain. Days of hope, when sensation began to return to her legs. More surgery, no more sensation. Then the final word - Patsy would be paralyzed, unable

to walk.

to make the best she could of her life. Her parents, grandparents, and the community rallied behind her. Between hospital stays the local teachers came to her home to visit and tutor, and friends helped with lessons and cheered her up. Her Mother gave daily care, and her Father paid bills and arranged the home in ways to make Patsy's life as easy as possible. One of Patsy's teachers. Lela Lloyd, introduced the Nances to Mary Louise Sudderth, a Physical Therapist who worked at a Veteran's Hospital in Temple. She instructed Lavena Nance in daily care for Patsy, and many details of therapy which would keep her in good condition. This treatment, as well later rehabilitation at Gonzales

By 1950 Patsy could stay away from hospitals long enough to attend school part time. Out of this tangle one thing became certain - the mind was the most important of any body. And Patsy's mind kept clicking right along, giving her an above-90 average in her Senior year. Friends wheeled her across the stage to recieve her diploma from the President of the School Board her Father. The audience cheered wildly.

About fifty graduated that night, and about eight have remained in the Cisco area. The rest are scattered. For they walked across the stage that night into a world in upheaval. The United States entered the Korean War, and many became involved in that Not long after Patsy's gra-

duation Garland R. Nance

assisted with the project of setting up Cisco Junior College as a State supported school. He became President of the Board of Regents, and spent much time on the school. Nance Hall, at C.J.C., was named for him as a Memorial of his work. Patsy enrolled in C.J.C., studying Accounting and a number of other courses. Mrs. O.L. Stamey was her Math teacher, and Olga Faye Parker taught her English and Spanish. After graduating from Cisco she enrolled in correspondence work with McMurry College, and went to Gonzales for rehabilita-

training," she explains, "Was designed to make me more independent. I learned better ways to get into cars and bathtubs, and I practiced weightlifting. I especially enjoyed swimming, so my Fahter built a swimming pool at home. I still use it in the summer, swimming with the help of a

At Gonzales Patsy met Dr. Clary Bates, who has remained her personal physician. Each year she goes to Austin for a check-up from Dr. Bates, who calls her 'My prize patient". Dr. E.E. Addy, of Cisco, cares for any difficulties she may have at home. She seldom calls on him, but it is good to know he

is nearby. In 1956 Patsy and her Mother stayed in a G.I. apartment near McMurry so she could fulfill class attendance requirements for a degree. She graduated in 1957 with a Degree in Business Administration.

and began work in her Father's busy Cisco office. She helped with Income Tax Forms, Railroad Commission forms, and various types of business accounting. Garland R. Nance remodeled a building on Ave. D for his office, arranging it in a convenient manner for Patsy. But again all her plans had to be changed. Her Father died of a heart attack two years later - 1959. Without her Father to drive her to the office, and assist her while there. Patsy decided it would not be practical for her to keep the office open. Eventually the business was sold, but Parsy continued to

work in her home. At the present time she does accounting work. continues to do Income Tax work, and various types of business accounting. She works in her home office in the afternoons, for most of each morning is spent with has proved priceless for the therapy her Mother maintaining the use of her

Mother has been called 'My Gold Mine'.' Patsy smiles. "And I agree. There is no way anyone can buy the type of care she gives me. Of course I can't drive, so Mother drives me where I need to go. Traveling has been a real pleasure for both of us - trips to see relatives in the South and Southwest; sightseeing trips Colorado, Arizona, and other states.

Patsy still loves music, but more as a listener than a performer now. "I like classical, folk, even country, if it's good," she smiles. She also works at crafts, when her busy life leaves her enough spare time. She has done a lot of decorative painting, on woven purses, dishes, and other things. Television and radio furnish entertainment and diversion, and she enjoys reading when possible.

Although Patsy cannot attend Church on a regular basis, she serves her First Methodist Church as the Church Treasurer. "Mrs. Jerden Davis, the Church Secretary, assists me.' Patsy says. I appreciate this work so much. It gives me a chance to help - to be a part of the Church.

Perhpas it is this longing to be a part of life which troubles handicapped people most. Patsy would love to attend more public events, to visit friends, to get about and shop, but difficulties beset her. Few older buildings are arranged to accomodate persons in wheel chairs. And curbs and high steps present real obstacles.

"I'm glad to see this changing." Patsy says. "There are more paraplegics around now - mostly from the Viet Nam war - so more attention is being focused on our problems. Car accidents, football injuries and gunshot wounds are leading causes of civilian spinal injuries. How I hope that someday enough research will be done on spinal injuries to find a way to repair and regenerate the spinal cord!"

But the years have given Patsy a long view - different perspective - of her own injury. "I realize that everyone in this world has problems. Mine just take a different form. Emotional problems can also be severe.

The biggest feat of all is that Patsy has kept a healthy mind, and can have this type of insight. Occasionally she hints at how this has been done. "I simply cannot afford to dwell on the past. about why or what might have been. Nor can I sit around worrying too much over what bad things might happen in the future." Her dark eyes become reflective. "Mother and I must have faith that whatever happens. that some provision will be made - that somehow help will be there when we need it. Devastating Tornado In Tex.-Okla. Finds Red Cross At Work

Seven days after a devastating tornado slammed into the Texas-Oklahoma border area leaving 57 people dead and hundreds injured, the cleanup continues as more than 7800 families try to restore their lives to normal.

Red Cross workers have been working around the clock assisting in the relief operation. Within hours of the tornado's onslaught, local Red Cross staff and volunteers mobilized and began providing first aid, emergency services and food

the country moved in to assist local Red Cross workers. A total of 130 Red Cross staff members were on the job as of Monday, assisted by 5,232 volunteers. At the height of the disaster, Red Cross had eight shelters open to house the homeless in Texas and Oklahoma. Over 42,000 disaster victims and emergency workers have been fed or sheltered by the Red Cross

store of the victim's choosing. As with all Red Cross aid, these disbursing orders are provided with no expectation of repayment.

Disaster victims who need funds for clothing, rent, transportation, medical care and health needs, occupational supplies, selected furnishings and temporary minor repairs so that their homes can be lived in again, are urged to contact the Red Cross.

In addition to providing this immediate assistance, the Red Cross is working in cooperation with the government and other private agencies to assure that more extensive disaster-caused needs will also be met.

Such long-term assistance is being provided by the Red Cross from its center at Midwestern State University and three Federal Disaster Assistance Administration (FDAA) one-stop centers located at 4-H Barn, 1626 Midwestern Parkway, Wichita Falls; Notre Dame High School, 2821 Lansing, Wichita Falls; and Wilbarger Auditorium, Vernon, All of these service centers will remain open until all disaster victims have been serviced, said Jan Beall, Wichita County Chapter manager. Other highlights of Red

More than 8,000 inquires from out-of-town relatives of local disaster victims have been received by the Wichita County Red Cross. While many of the inquires have been responded to, residents of the tornado stricken area are encouraged to contact relatives of their own if they have not already done so.
