A female tick may lay several thousand eggs, beginning a two-to fourmonth life cycle. Remaining stages--six legged larva (seed tick) and eight-legged nympth and adult--generally develop on separate host animals. After each feeding, the tick drops off the host and temporarily hides

until the next developmental stage. Regardless of the species. control is basically the same for all ticks, says Hoelscher. Heavy infestations in the home may require treatment by professionals. Household sprays containing 0.5 percent diazinon or ronnel will control light infestations.

Outside the home where vegetation is thin, use 5 percent carbaryl (Sevin) dust at 20-25 pounds per acre. Increase the rate as vegetation thickens, advises Hoelscher. If using a spray. mix five tablespoons of 25 percent diazinon emulsifiable concentrate (EC) in one gallon of water. Apply one gallon of spray per 1,000 square feet. Carbaryl gives the best residual control. When spraying, pay particular attention to roadsides, animal trails and paths.

Most species of ticks can't survive in cleared areas where they are exposed to excessive sunlight and predators, points out the entomologist. Keeping areas clear of debris is important in tick control.

Hikers and campers may want to use repellent materials on their jacket cuffs or the bottoms of their trousers. Also, Hoelscher recommends trousers into the tops of socks or boots. Sleeves buttoned tight will also aid in protection.

The entomologist advises pet owners to examine their animals frequently. Light infestations can be controlled

STATE CAPITAL HIGHLIGHTS

By Lyndell Williams TEXAS PRESS ASSOCIATION

AUSTIN-Top oil industry executives came to the State Capitol this week to deliver what amounted to somber predictions about this country's ability in the future to get reasonably priced fuel needed to power the nation's economy

Oil company executives spoke at the Texas Railroad Commission's annual stateof-the-industry report. And, from the outset, it must be said that the "state" of the industry appears good. Government figures show that oil company profits jumped almost 30 percent in the first quarter of this year.

Overall, corporate profits increased more than 26 percent in the same period. And, the 1978 federal de-

control act is expected to mean \$1 to \$3 billion in additional revenues this year for oil and gas companies. But it wasn't skyrocketing profits that oil executives came to talk about this week. It's the forecasted

shortages of what they sell that has them worried. Executive vice president James E. Barnes of Conoco Oil Co. said a serious gasoline shortage may grip the nation in two months unless the tap in Iran is turned back on and oil begins to

Prices Soar

Unfortunately, energy isn't the only subject that leads almost inevitably to bad news. The U.S. Labor Department announced this week that consumer prices jumped 15.4 percent in February. Telling consumers what they probably already know, the Labor Department said the price of food went up, the cost of paying off a home loan went up. and, as might be expected. the price of gasoline jumped

Higher home loan interest rates contributed heavily to the February jump in prices. Mortgage interest costs rose 3.1 percent last month due almost primarily to the fact that New York and California lifted state usury law ceilings.

Bills still pending in the Texas Legislature would raise the ceiling in this state. but, so far, legislators have been waiting to see what interest rates will do on their own before taking any action. Some surveys indicate that for the average house buyer, mortgage money in the state is drying up.





Moisture Causes Problems

Damaging moisture under a home can cause serioud structural problems. but homeowners can avoid that with a few simple "caution steps", says a housing and home furnishings specialist.

There are five corrective measures that can help reduce moisture in crawl spaces under homes built on pier and beam foundations. Jane Berry says.

problems. As much as 20 gallons of water ever 24 hours can evaporate into the air from a square-foot crawl space, Dr. Berry warns.

moisture passes through the home's floor in the form of vapor, and it raises the relative humidity of air inside the home. resulting in very serious condensation problems, she

Four clues will signal excessive moisture under a home:

Musty odors inside the home

Mold or mildew on the foundation wall, floor joists or soil surface in the crawl

Standing water under the house, and

Excessive condensation, especially on windows inside the home

Drain Water Away

One "caution step" draining water away from the house--at the ground level. This is especially important for homes located in seepy

Install a drain tile around the footing of the house to carry seep water away from

Also, to prevent water from standing against the foundation are higher than the yard. Provide a minimum slope of six inches for every 10 feet of distance out away from the home on all sides.

To do that, grade soil again st the foundation wall or lower the elevation of the both-to accomplish effective drainage.

Stop Evaporation

Use bricks to keep lapped edges together on the ground and to force outer edges Vent Foundation Walls

are: 8 x 16 inch screened vent in each of the four foundation walls for homes with up to 1400 square feet of crawl

Add one more vent for each extra 350 square feet of crawl

Insulate Floors

Floor insulation with moisture-vapor barrier will keep moisture out of the home and cut energy waste. Install a batt-type insulation that has a moisture-vapor barrier. Be sure the moisture -vapor barrier is next to the underside of the floor-toward the house, not toward the crawl-space ground. Install *********






