# Tick Populations Increasing With Warm Weather

COLLEGE STATION—Tick populations increase dramatically with warm weather, causing inconvenience and health hazards for homeowners and pets. Ticks are biting, blood-

sucking parasites, and their bites may become inflamed and infected due to toxic secretions, points out Dr. Cliff Hoelscher of Stephenville, area entomologist with the Texas Agricultural

Extension Service. Tick paralysis, tularemia and Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever may be transmitted through tick bites.

According to the entomologist, brown dog ticks and American dog ticks are the most common in Texas home landscapes.

Brown dog ticks are reddish-brown while American dog ticks are yellowish-brown when unfed and slate gray when engorged. The brown dog tick rarely occurs in rural areas; instead, it hides in crevices around buildings. American dog ticks are most often found along roads and

trails. A female tick may lay several thousand eggs, beginning a two-to-four-month life cycle. Remaining stages—six legged larva (seed tick) and eight-legged nymph and adult—generally develop on separate host animals. After each feeding, the tick drops off the host and temporarily hides until the next developmental stage.

Regardless of the species, control is basically the same for all ticks, says Hoelscher. Heavy infestations in the home may require treatment by professionals. Household sprays containing 0.5 percent diazinon or ronnel will control light infestations.

Outside the home where vegetation is thin, use 5 percent carbaryl (Sevin) dust at 20-25 pounds per acre. Increase the rate as vegetation thickens, advises Hoelscher. If using a spray, mix five tablespoons of 25 percent diazinon emulsifiable concentrate (EC) in one gallon of water. Apply one gallon of spray per 1,000 square feet. Carbaryl gives the best residual control. When spraying, pay particular attention to roadsides, animal trails and paths.

Most species of ticks can't survive in cleared areas where they are exposed to excessive sunlight and predators, points out the entomologist. Keeping areas clear of debris is important in tick control.

Hikers and campers may want to use repellent materials on their jacket cuffs or the bottoms of their trousers. Also, Hoelscher recommends tucking trousers into the tops of socks or boots. Sleeves buttoned tight will also aid in protection.

The entomologist advises pet owners to examine their animals frequently. Light infestations can be controlled

by rubbing carbaryl dust into the pet's hair. Also, treat the animal's sleeping quarters every week.

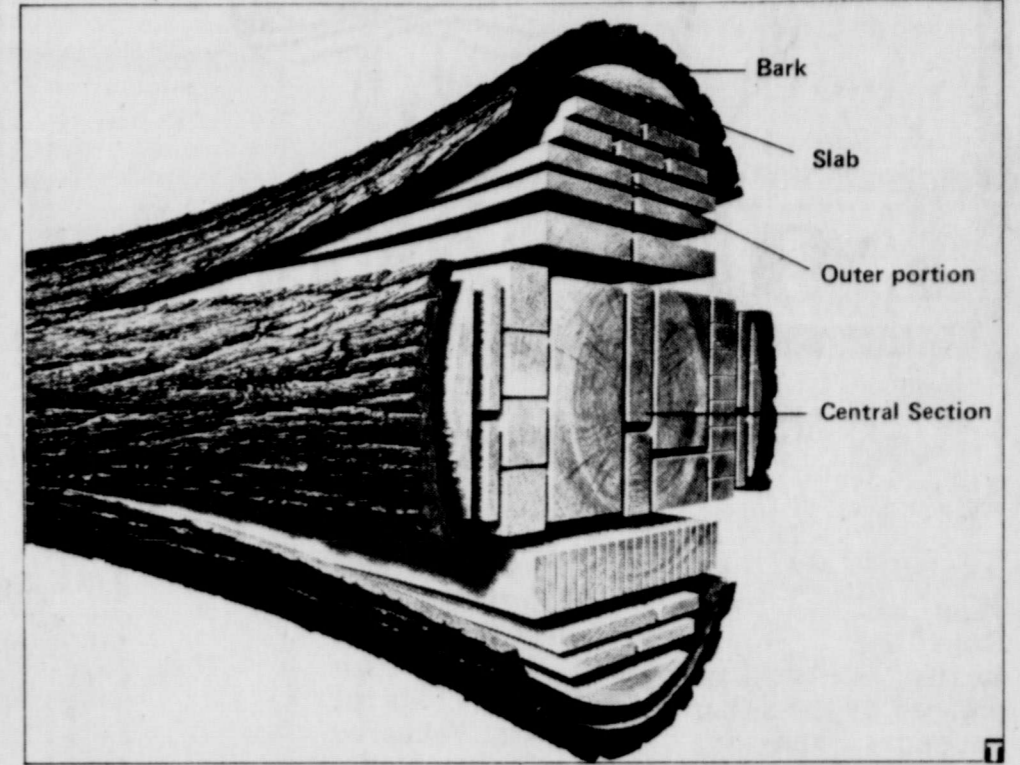
If a tick becomes attached to the skin, remove it with a slow, steady pull. Be careful not to break off its mouthparts. A drop of chloroform, isopropyl alcohol, ether, acetone or fingernail polish rubbed over the tick may

help remove it. It can be removed a half-hour later with less damage to the skin because its oxygen supply is cut off, says Hoelscher. Always apply an antiseptic to tick bites, adds the entomologist. If your hands touched the tick, wash them thoroughly with soap and water to reduce the risk of spreading disease.

## The Secret Life Of The Forest

Forests Meet The Challenge



ONE REASON AMERICA WON'T RUN OUT OF FORESTS is that we are making every log work harder.

America's demand for lumber and paper will double by the year 2020. Helping the forests meet this challenge is good forest management. We grow a continuous supply of the forest crop and get more than in the past from the logs we use.

At one time, up to 50 percent of some logs went unused. Today, these "waste" pieces are routinely converted into chips for pulp and paper mills. With millions of tons of chips so used each year, hundreds of thousands of acres of forest land need not be prematurely harvested.

### How Logs Are Used

Debarking is essential to the log's full utilization, because the bark cannot be used either as lumber or for paper making. But it can be used for fuel and soil mulch.

The rounded sides of the log, the "slabs," are the first pieces sent to the chipper as the log goes through the sawmill. The idealized picture above shows the entire log being used for lumber, except for the slabs. Actually, as cutting continues, other pieces go to the chipper, including edgings, trim ends and other parts of the log not usable as lumber.

The outer portions of the log have the fewest knots. This "clear" lumber is usually made into boards or planks varying in thickness from one to three inches.

Towards the center of the log, knots increase, and the wood is less suitable for boards. Heavier planks and square or rectangular beams are normally sawed from this section. The center of the log is used primarily for structural beams strong enough so that they are not

weakened by knots. Knots are most frequent here because this is the oldest section of the tree. Branches that were removed during the early years of the tree's life left knots that were covered over as the tree grew outward.

Plywood is, in effect, a sandwich of thin wooden veneers. Veneer is made by "peeling"—that is, holding a long blade against a rotating log. The wood is continuously peeled off, down to an eighth-inch core. The core can then be made into lumber, while the rounded portions go into the chipper.

**TORNADO WATCH:** tornados may develop

**TORNADO WARNING:** tornado detected; take shelter

When a tornado approaches, your immediate action can save your life!

- In homes, open some windows (but stay away from them); take shelter in the basement or under heavy furniture in the center area of the house.
- In schools, move quickly (following advance plans) to shelter areas or to an interior hallway on the lowest floor.
- In office buildings, go to an interior hallway on the lowest floor or a designated shelter area.
- In factories, move quickly (following advance plans) to shelter areas. Post a look-out, if this can be done safely.
- In shopping centers, go to a designated shelter area (not to your parked car).
- Mobile homes are particularly vulnerable to overturning during strong winds and should be evacuated when strong winds are forecast. Damage can be minimized by securing trailers with cables anchored in concrete footing. If there is no shelter nearby, leave the trailer park for low, protected ground!
- In open country, move away from the tornado's path at a right angle. If there is no time, lie flat in the nearest depression with your hands shielding your head. Be alert for flash floods.

## STATE CAPITAL HIGHLIGHTS

AUSTIN—Top oil industry executives came to the State Capitol this week to deliver what amounted to somber predictions about this country's ability in the future to get reasonably priced fuel needed to power the nation's economy.

Oil company executives spoke at the Texas Railroad Commission's annual state-of-the-industry report. And, from the outset, it must be said that the "state" of the industry appears good. Government figures show that oil company profits jumped almost 30 percent in the first quarter of this year.

Overall, corporate profits increased more than 26 percent in the same period.

And, the 1978 federal de-

control act is expected to mean \$1 to \$3 billion in additional revenues this year for oil and gas companies. But it wasn't skyrocketing profits that oil executives came to talk about this week. It's the forecasted shortages of what they sell that has them worried.

Executive vice president James E. Barnes of Conoco Oil Co. said a serious gasoline shortage may grip the nation in two months unless the tap in Iran is turned back on and oil begins to flow to the U.S. again.

Barnes and John K. McKinley, president of Texaco, Inc., sounded what has become the oil industry's catch-all phrase to end all problems: "more decontrol."

Barnes, McKinley and colleagues claimed Texas alone has 100 billion barrels of known reserves not being sucked out of the ground with present technology because there is no profit in such undertakings and present regulations are prohibitive.

But U.S. Congressman Bob Eckhardt of Texas said in a press conference in Washington this week that more decontrol would not produce a surge in exploration.

Eckhardt pointed out that U.S. oil producers plan to drill 49,379 wells this year. That's the highest number of planned drillings since 1959. But on the other side of those numbers, is the simple fact that for more than 100 years the U.S. was the world's largest producer of oil. No longer.

Today, the United States is by far the world's biggest consumer of oil. And as a nation we have slipped to third behind Russia and Saudi Arabia in the production of crude oil. While our appetite for oil has gone up, our ability to find it and get it out of the ground has gone down.

Meanwhile, predictions are that gasoline will soon climb to \$1 a gallon. The rising price of fuel already is one of the biggest contributing factors to a 10-12 percent annual inflation rate. But even more importantly, the primary reason for our worldwide economic power—cheap fuel—may be long gone. For years, Europeans and the rest of the world have paid heavily for gasoline and other crude oil products.

Spot shortages of gasoline already exist in the U.S. One spokesman for a farm supply cooperative in the Texas Panhandle claims some tractors are standing idle because of no diesel fuel.

Sunday closings at gas stations are for the most part the rule now not the exception. And those who remember the oil crunch of 1973, say what may be around the corner is something we didn't see during the Arab oil embargo—gas rationing.

"We are in the most precarious international situation since World War II," said Railroad Commissioner Mack Wallace almost two months ago. His statement seems even more correct now.

### Prices Soar

Unfortunately, energy isn't the only subject that leads almost inevitably to bad news. The U.S. Labor Department announced this week that consumer prices jumped 15.4 percent in February. Telling consumers what they probably already know, the Labor Department said the price of food went up, the cost of paying off a home loan went up, and, as might be expected, the price of gasoline jumped too.

Higher home loan interest rates contributed heavily to the February jump in prices. Mortgage interest costs rose 3.1 percent last month due almost primarily to the fact that New York and California lifted state usury law ceilings.

Bills still pending in the Texas Legislature would raise the ceiling in this state, but, so far, legislators have been waiting to see what interest rates will do on their own before taking any action. Some surveys indicate that for the average house buyer, mortgage money in the state is drying up.

Texas is now one of only 12 states with a 10 percent or lower usury limit.

### Short Snorts

Some heavyweights—Sen. Grant Jones of Abilene, Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, Lt. Gov. Bill Hobby and even Gov. Bill Clements—have been kicking around the idea of a one-year state budget because of the unpredictability of state revenues.

But Speaker of the House Bill Clayton says the Legislature has had experience with one-year spending drafts and everytime they have ended up "costing more money."

Sen. Babe Schwartz of Galveston said this week that next to the 55 mph

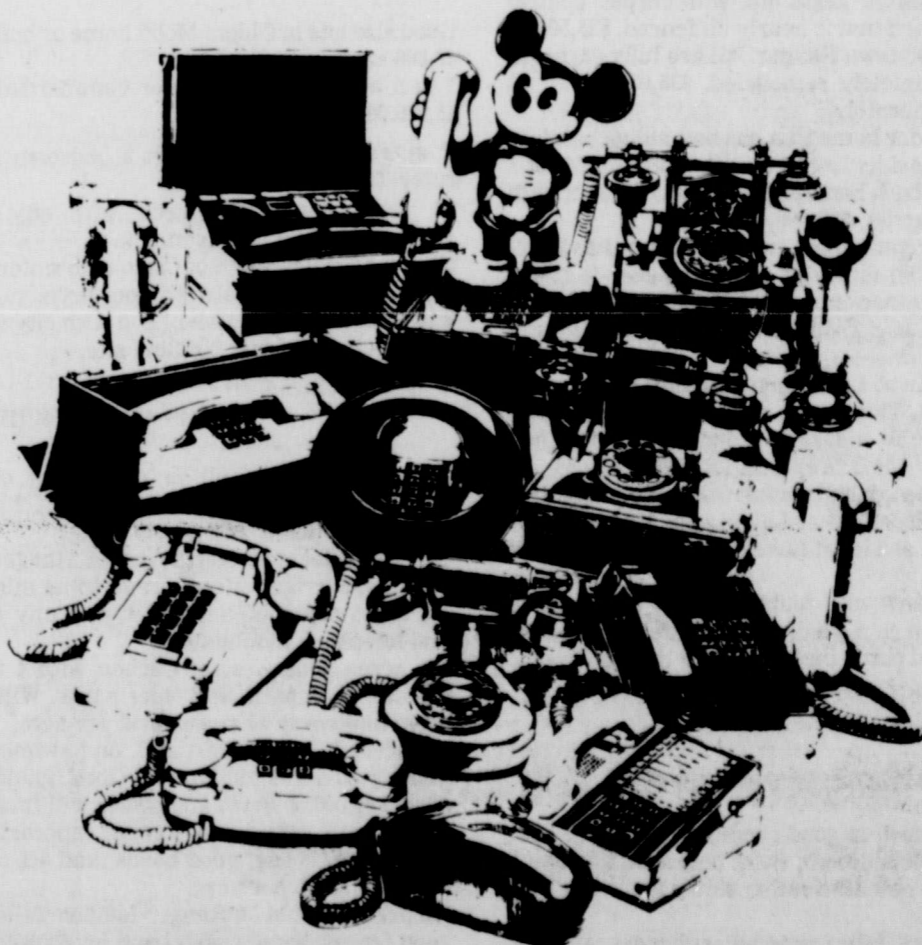

**FOR ALL OF US Moisture Causes Problems**

The first session of the Family Enrichment Seminar will be this Thursday evening, April 26 at 7 p.m. in the Texas Electric Service Co. Reddy Room in Eastland. This first session will emphasize "Focus on Young Families".

Keynote speaker will be Dorothy Taylor, Family Life Education Specialist, for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service of Texas University. She will speak on practical suggestions for living married successfully.

Damaging moisture under a home can cause serious structural problems, but homeowners can avoid that with a few simple "caution steps", says a housing and home furnishings specialist.

There are five corrective measures that can help reduce moisture in crawl spaces under homes built on pier and beam foundations. Jane Berry says.

Dr. Berry is with the Texas Agricultural Extension

Service. The Texas A&M University System.

First, check for moisture problems.

As much as 20 gallons of water ever 24 hours can evaporate into the air from a 1400 square-foot crawl space, Dr. Berry warns.

This moisture passes through the home's floor in the form of vapor, and it raises the relative humidity of air inside the home, resulting in very serious condensation problems, she explains.

Four clues will signal excessive moisture under a home: Musty odors inside the home

Mold or mildew on the foundation wall, floor joists or soil surface in the crawl space

Standing water under the house, and Excessive condensation, especially on windows inside the home

Drain Water Away

One "caution step" is draining water away from the house-at the ground level.

This is especially important for homes located in seepy areas.

Install a drain tile around the footing of the house to carry seep water away from it.

Also, to prevent water from standing against the foundation are higher than the yard.

Provide a minimum slope of six inches for every 10 feet of distance out away from the home on all sides.

To do that, grade soil against the foundation wall or lower the elevation of the yard-or do both-to accomplish effective drainage.

Install Gutters Downspouts

Another "caution step", to keep rainstorm waters away from the house in the first place, involves gutters and downspouts.

Install them so that water will hit splash blocks, or use horizontal extensions to discharge water far enough away from the house to protect the crawl space from flooding.

Stop Evaporation

If soil in the crawl space is generally moist, cover the crawl space ground with a polyethylene (plastic) vapor barrier

this can prevent nearly all evaporation

Use a 6- or 8-mil thickness plastic sheeting. Lap the sheets four inches, and extend them four inches up on the side of the foundation wall.

Use bricks to keep lapped edges together on the ground and to force outer edges against the foundation wall.

Vent Foundation Walls

Make sure foundation walls have adequate venting to decrease moisture problems in crawl space.

Usual recommendations are: 8 x 16 inch screened vent in each of the four foundation walls for homes with up to 1400 square feet of crawl space.

Add one more vent for each extra 350 square feet of crawl space.

Insulate Floors

Floor insulation with a moisture-vapor barrier will keep moisture out of the home and cut energy waste.

Install a batt-type insulation that has a moisture-vapor barrier. Be sure the moisture-vapor barrier is next to the underside of the floor-toward the house, not toward the crawl-space ground. Install

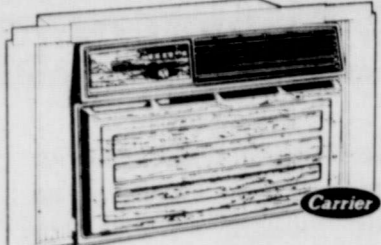
the insulation between the floor joists. Finally, across the insulation, use a one inch poultry mesh tacked in place for support and protection.

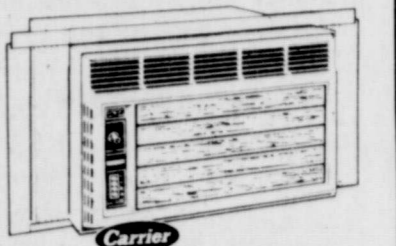

Eastland County Commissioners agreed Monday to open bids May 10 for construction of a new jail in Eastland.

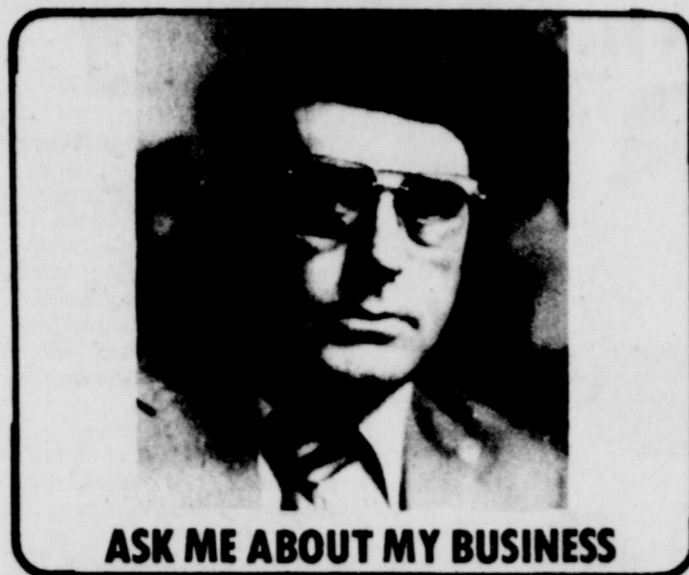

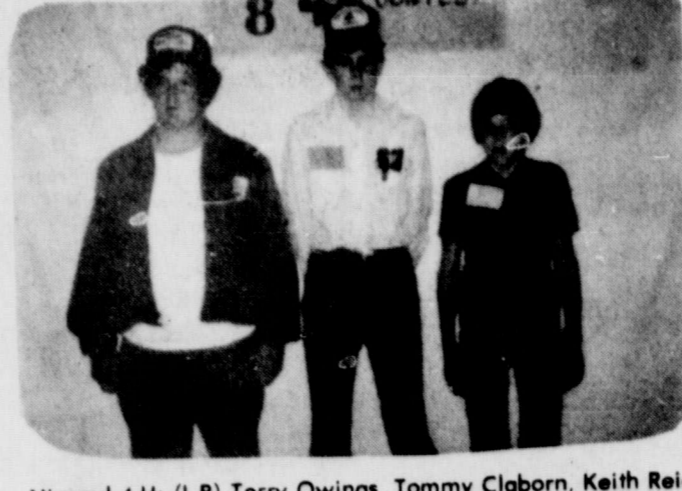

Then there was the energy saving of burning their lights rather than mine and what it takes to run the TV, wear and tear on the easy chair plus other delicate calculations. It was nearly even 'till a re-run which disgusted me the first time I saw it required the energy of turning it off.

Right then I decided in favor of education. I know TV is educational as any week you can learn twenty ways to kill someone but after while you know about all those you will ever need. So I was off to school and the unexpected bonus of free coffee.
