## School competition not reserved for athletics

| Editor's note: The following anticle is based on excerpts of a speech given by former UIL dinector Dr. Rhea Williams. The speech was presented ro delegutes attending the National Federation of State H ith School Associations convention. $\qquad$ II ssate activities ascociations philosophically, if not in principle, are based on educational competition and the values inherent in sctivities offered to the students in their respective schools. Edvcationai competition, wish couid aiso be called eductional rivalry, is as old as life itself. Rivalry and compecition have been used from the very beginning of society as a family unit, as a tribe, as a satate and as a nation. <br> There are many historical references to educational competition with the first records coming fimm China where the educationa system was based completely on competition and controlled by the state. These early competitive situations were not always the state. These early competitive situations were not always sound educationally as they wert administered under unsufferably hard conditions with very litile consideration for individual welfare. The Greeks ushered the world into true educational competition with the Homeric philosophy that a good program of education trains a person "to be able to speak when speech is fit and to to do when deeds are done." The methods to develop these skills were taught on the athletic field and in the open amphitheater set aside for public speech and discussion. It is worthy to note that practically all high school plants in this nation include stadiums and auditoriums to fulfill the Homeric principle of education. Plato, Socrates, Confucius and most of our early philosophers were advocates of controlled education competition. Later on, the |

 Our resident fishing expert at the International Wildlife Park in Grand Prairie says the artificial reefs may not work at first. Treessecrete a resin which actually repels fish," explains Ray Sutton, wildlife manager of the tourist attraction. "However, it (the resin) dissipates after a couple of weeks." Also, if your favorite fishing hole happens to be a public reservoir, do not make your 'fish attractor' until you speak with the controlling
water authority. They take boating traffic into consideration and may stipulate guidelines for you to follow.
Small farm tanks and ponds on private property are ideal spots for Christmas tree reefs because many are barren, watery wastelands. shelter for many different species of fish. If Mother Nature smiles on you with a five-pound bass, then your creative recycling efforts will be doubly rewarded. Happy
