hat when refrigerated meat handled properly it can become e con-
taminated by bacteria, but many people don't know how to tell a safe from a risky practice in preparing meat
at home," says Mary Kinney Sweeten, a nutritionist with the Texas A\&M University
Agricultural Extension SerAgricultural Extension Ser-
vice.
Sweeten gives the following answers to some com-
mon questions that conmon questions that con-
sumers ask about meat safeCan I use raw ground beef that turned brown after a
day or two in the day or two in the
refrigerator?
The color of meat is determined by the amount of oxygen with which it has come
into contact. So brown hamnto contact. So brown ham
burger may be as safe as
pink hamburger. However pink hamburger. However, it's a good idea to keep raw
ground beef in the refrigerator no longer than
two days. Don't use the meat if it has an off odor or was time.
Since Since has has already been preserved by smoking and
salting, can I thaw a frozen ham on the counter? As with any type of meat,
the safest way to thaw ham the safest way to thaw ham
is in the refrigerator. The
