## A rendition is a report to the appraisal district that lists all the

 taxable property you own or control on January 1, 1987. You may also give your opinion of the property's value, if you wish.You must file a rendition if you own tangible personal property used to produce income-such as the machiner and equipment used by a usiness.
The appraisal district may require any laxpayer to fie a written notice and a rendition form.
You may want to file a reqaition, even to file, to preserve some
requin of your rights as a taxpayer: - You put your correct mailin address on record so your tax bills will go to the right address. If our bill is mailed to the wron address, the law still holds you responsible for paying your taxes on time or paying extra charges or late payments.
