

Put Together A Good **Christmas Party**

By taking some practical steps you can put together a holiday party that won't leave your friends regretting what they ate and drank the night before, says a Texas A&M University Extension nutritionist.

People often try to eat light and avoid the obvious hazards of drinking and driving, but don't want to make an issue of it at a party," says Dr. Alice Hunt.

'Having an appropriate assortment of party foods and beverages allows guests to avoid the hangover or bad feelings about overeating that may follow the next

Hunt, who is a specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, offers these suggestions to party-

·Offer plenty of high protein and carbohydrate foods like cheese, meats, raw vegetables and crackers. These foods stay in the stomach longer, which slows the rate at which the body

absorbs alcohol. ·Be more concerned about

keeping the plates filled than the glasses. When guests nibble on food, it tends to slow the amount of alcohol they

·For friends who are dieting, offer plenty of attractive lower-calorie foods, such as vegetable sticks and dip, fresh fruit cubes and lean meats. Guests who eat little or nothing and drink alcohol are more likely to become intoxicated.

·Serve a variety of appealing non-alcoholic beverages if you also serve alcohol Don't draw attention to nonalcoholic drinkers by, for example, serving wine and mixed drinks in glasses. while serving soft drinks in

·Use a jigger or a selfmeasuring one-ounce bottle spout at the bar to mix drinks. You're not doing your guests any favor by mixing doubles, since the average person can only process about on ounce of alcohol per hour.

·If you're serving alcoholic punch, use a noncarbonated base such as fruit juice. When carbonated beverages are used as a base, the alcohol is absorbed faster.

·Close the bar and bring out dessert about two hours before the party is over. Serving coffee is a good idea, but remember that it doesn't de anything to clear alcohol from the body; only time can do that.

. "If a guest is not sober by the end of the party, make sure he or she is driven home by someone who is, or arrange for the person to spend the night," advises Hunt.





Randy Fite, Finds Bass In

Cold Weather old weather and bassin has never made the best combination of items. But with the correct approach it can actually be quiet rewarding. Following are some tips Randy Fite offers to help put some cold-water bass in your live-well.

Randy Fite, 34, resides in Montgomery, Texas. Randy began his bassin career at the age of five and now fishes 200 days per year. With six appearances in the World Series of fishing, The Bassmaster Classic, more than warrants a listen to Randy's helpful suggestions

Wintertime is usually the period of the year when most fishermen have laid down their rods and reels electing to either hunt, warm up by the fire or prepare for spring bass fishing.

But the smart fisherman won't follow this pattern. In the wintertime, lakes are void of traffic and the avid angler can enjoy his surrounding more. It's during this time of year that finding and catching bass in cold weather can be some of the most challenging as well productive fishing time a fisherman

can spend. But remember, bass are more sluggish in the

winter, their metabolism slows down and they don't feed as much. I usually try to locate these fish suspended and holding in creek channels that run into the main river or sunken structure within the channel, such as timber, roadbeds and brush piles.

Depth sounders, in cold water conditions, play an increasingly important role as fish may go deeper and school tighter together than any other time of the

By paying closer attention to their depth sounding equipment, an angler greatly enhances his chances of a good catch. An excellent combination of Humminbird equipment which I have personally found to work best includes an LCR 4ID up front and a LCR 8000 and Humminbird In-Dash at the con-

Locating creek channels within a main river is very easy to do with a map and a depth sounder. Once you have read and studied your map and acquired a general knowledge of the areas with channels, locating your target-creek-channelscan be easily achieved by using your sonar equipment

Cold weather bass feed sparingly, are not aggressive and therefore you have got to be able to put your bait, via a vertical

presentation in front of the bass for a longer period of time, in order to entice a strike.

I use a jigging spoon to attract these bass. The jigging spoon is a perfect imitation of a bass' main forage in the winter - a dying bait fish fluttering. I also use a jig and eel or a slowly retrieved, deepdiving crankbait with a large, slow wobble for good success. Winter is the one time of the year that bait fish go extremely deep. With a depth sounder they are easy to find and these bait fish are usually suspended within the same creek.

that when deep bait fish are present, the predator fish won't be far away. The colder the weather becomes the more vertical your presentation must become. This is due to the cold water influence and the effects of major weather changes that oc-

earlier. It's also a sure bet

cur, such as cold fronts, more so during the winter than in the summer when the barometric pressure is more stable Overnight weather

changes are frequent in the winter, but this is also most advantageous to the fisherman. The fish do group tighter and deeper and they don't make as much movement or migration as they do in the warmer months, when fish often scatter down miles of

Actually through the channel theory, when researching for concentration of fish, you can easily limit the amount of area

which you have to cover to locate fish as opposed to during warmer temperatures. Thus,

fishing is much easier! Finally, remember safety. The second or third day after a cold front is usually more pleasant than the first day after. These fronts are normally accompanied by strong wind and, on open water, can spell trouble. The wind usually lightens on the second and third days

So don't hang up your fishing gear just because the temperature drops. Tie on a jiggin' spoon, watch your Humminbird closely and vertically fish your way to success

Public Utility Commission Grants Brazos Electric Rate Reduction

Public Utility Commission has approved an interim order granting Brazos Electric Power Cooperative a \$10 million temporary rate reduction. Final approval will be considered by the Commission Jan. 20, 1988.

Brazos' wholesale customers will begin receiving the benefits of this reduction with bills for December usage. Consumers generally should see a reduction of about \$7.50 for each 1000 kilowatt hours used during the four-month period. The decreased rates will be in effect through March 1988.

"Passing our savings to our consumers is an important part of the mission of electric cooperatives," stated Richard E. Mc-Caskill, executive vice president and general manager of Brazos. "In fact, we enjoy doing it," he said. In 1977, the cooperative returned more than \$1 million to its consumers through a temporary rate reduction.

Homemaking Hints

CHILD CARE PROVIDERS HOME STUDY COURSE OFFERED:

The home economics program of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service invites Registered Family Day Home Care Providers and Child Care Center staffs to participate in a home study training program. The Family Home Care Providers Program was developed by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service in cooperation with and through grants provided by the Texas Department of Human Resources and the Corporate Child Development Fund of Texas.

By enrolling in this home study course, child care providers will learn more about (1) Child Development and Guidance, (2) Nutrition, (3) Health and Safety, and (4) Business Management. Research based educational information is provided in a 350 page home study manual that providers keep for future reference, and through loaned video tapes. Pre-registration is required by January 5. The manual costs \$20.00 and should be ordered prior to January 5.

Registration forms are available from the Eastland County Extension Service office or contacting Mrs. Janet Thomas, County Extension Agent, P.O. Box 189, Eastland, Texas 76448; or by

calling 629-2222. According to Mrs. Thomas, participants need to make a "time committment" of five (5) weeks and between 30-40 hours of study time, and attend an orientation meeting on Saturday, January 9th at 9:30 a.m. in the Texas Electric Reddy

Room in Eastland. Participants who score 70 on a post exam may apply for three (3) Continuing Education Units (CEU's) from Texas A & M Universi-

The content areas of the course are appropriate for all child care providers but are written to target the family day home care provider. Child care center providers should check with the Texas Department of Human Services for clearance in using the program to apply toward professional improvement ac-

According to Mrs. Thomas, an estimated 469,000 Texas families rely on child care outside the home. In addition to Day Care Center, there are almost 19,000 people registered with the Texas Department of Human Services as providers of child care in their own homes.

Quality child care has emerged as a critical issue for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service's statewide educational plan for the 1990's.





Avoid'Endless-Chain'

The Criminal District Attorney's Office in Eastland has received information that there may be some citizens of Eastland County who are the victims of what appears to be an illegal "get rich scheme"

Also, by participating in such ventures, the citizen may be unknowingly committing a criminal act by participating in an "Endless Chain Scheme", most commonly called a "pyramid"

Under the criminal laws of Texas it is unlawful to contrive, prepare, set up, propose, operate, promote, or even participate in an endless chain.

An "endless chain" is any scheme for the distribution of money or any other property whereby a participant gives or pays money or any other valuable consideration for the chance to receive compensation for introducing additional persons and their participating in the get rich scheme.

The State law prohibiting this activity has been in effect since 1974 and it was passed in order to protect the majority of participants, who by the nature of any such scheme, would never receive any financial return.

Therefore, if a citizen is or has been approached to participate in any such "get rich opportunities", or has been cheated by participating, please contact your local law enforcement agency so that steps can be taken to apprehend the responsible promoter or promoters and prevent further bilking of the citizens by unscrupulous promoters and causing the citizens who participate from losing their money and unknowingly violating the

District Attorney Emory Walton urges that the citizens when approached to participate in any such schemes to not become involved because they most likely will lose their money to a rip-off promoter who will be long gone when the citizen finally realizes he or she has

Walton warns that there is no such thing as a "get rich quickly, "pie-in-the sky", "limited or privileged opportunity", or "exclusive or confidential investment" in any of these types

ANSWER: No. Custodial care is exactly that! It is very basic care and does not provide skilled procedures. Skilled nursing homes provide health care that would be similiar to that you would receive in a hospital. Custodial care, or commonly called intermediate nursing care, does not provide the level that could be acceptable to the payment of medicare. Many people feel their medicare pays for the nursing home care. This is true only if the care is in a certified skilled nursing home. Even then the level of care and the procedures are closely monitored.


QUESTION: Mr. Cartee, would you explain the supplement insurance policy that helps in payment where medicare does not?


