Moore told the council he was notified by the Department of Public Safety about some 1984 Ford LTD cars that are for sale. He said the company would paint the cars to match the ones Cisco has and put on new tires.

Moore told the council that Cisco Chief of Police Billy Rains and City Mechanic Reggie Pittman will drive to Austin to look at the cars. Moore said if the two men should find another car that would be an exceptional buy, then Rains and Pittman can put it on hold. Moore said if they place a car on hold he will bring the matter before the council to see about revising the budget to buy

told the council during the city manager's report, that one of the major projects in the City of Cisco is the continuing development of the new landfill. Moore said they need to put in the fences now.

Another project is the development of 14th Street. Moore said that hopefully the finances of the city will allow the street to have a seal coating put on it. He said at one point on the street, sixteen inches of filler had to be placed in the middle of the street.

During the financial report, manager Mike Moore told council members that the tax collection for overdue taxes is extremely disappointing. He said thirty five percent of the past due taxes for the City of Cisco are from people who have never been delinquent before. Moore added that this must signify something. Only 76 percent of the total taxes that are due have been paid. Moore added that tax collection is the biggest source of income for the City of Cisco

Moore said he will meet with tax lawyers next week.







programs where none exist. Mrs. Clements has challenged every Texan to join this educational crusade. "Volunteers with or without prior teaching experience are needed," she said. "The statewide adult literacy project undertaken by TCTA is a well-directed step toward abolition of this

skills handicap. Teachers are experts in the instruction of reading and writing and, therefore, their input is of utmost importance in the endeavor.

Texas, like virtually every other state in the nation, has an unacceptably high illiteracy rate. According to the 1986 Governor's Task Force on Literacy, one out of five adult Texans cannot read, write or compute well enough to be successful in

The Governor's report also said that 36 percent of Texas's adults did not complete high school and 18 percent did not complete the eighth grade. Eighty-five percent of the Texas Department of Corrections inmates, 63 percent of heads of households who receive Aid to Families with Dependent Children, and 60 percent of adults with incomes below poverty level

are high school dropouts. The high illiteracy and

dropout rates are shortcomings that threaten the state's economic revitalization. Gov. Clements has said. "A skilled and educated work force is essential if Texas is to achieve its goal of economic diversification."

Mrs. Clements said if the state is to be able to recruit new business, it is necessary to equip citizens with skill that will be in demand. "Our efforts to increase state employment will be selfdefeating if we do not meet the needs and expectations of businesses. We want new business in Texas because we want new jobs for Texans.

She feels the 70th Legislature took some steps in the right direction when it established the Texas Literacy Council to study literacy training programs available to adults and outof-school youth in our state.

"Project TEACH is 'th keeping with our association's overall goal to provide educational opportunities for to fully develop this state's human and economic potential," TCTA President Wendell Whittenburg said.

Whittenburg added, "Developing this state's full potential should be the priority of every individual involved in education. We encourage and urge others to assist us in this extremely important effort."

Whittenburg said, "TCTA decided to develop Project TEACH in response to the need and desire to give something back to the com-

munities where we live and work. Too many times our efforts are seen as selfserving by the public. This is a way we can get involved and let people understand what teachers and their skills really mean to a com-





Presidential Candidate's Son Visits

The presidential campaign was brought to Eastland County by the son of the leading Democratic contender, Governor Michael Dukakis. Son, John Dukakis shook hands and fielded some tough questions with local citizens office holders in the Courthouse Tuesday morning before continuing on an old-fashioned campaign stumping tour into

West Texas. Enthusiastic due to the two recent visitors in New Hampshire and Minnesota and strong showings in Iowa and South Dakota young Dukakis, a veteran actor, said, "My father is building a national campaign to bring the issues to the American people. Texas is an important part of that national campaign. The once unfamiliar name, Dukakis, is now seen at the top of polls both in the state as well as nationally.

John Dukakis is the Southern Campaign Coordinator for the Presidential campaign. He and his wife are both actively involved in the campaign effort. Less than a year married, she took an assignment in fundraising and they moved to Atlanta, GA. in order to be "at home" at the time of the Democratic National Convention in July. The vote in Texas and 19 other states on March 8th, Super Tuesday, will control 37% delegates to that convention.

"This country needs the kind of leadership and dedication in the White House that my father has demonstrated as Governor. Jobs and renewed opportunities for all the people. Respect for the ideals and the laws that have made our country great, those are the themes of my father's campaign" Dukakis said.

Jan Sanders and Trini Garza of Dallas accompanied Dukakis as hands were shook and campaign issues were discussed. The campaign tour moves west to Abilene and finally to a Democratic candidates forum in San Angelo by evening.

Among the some 100 attending the whistle-stop visit at the Commissioners Courtroom were Mrs. Cletus Rattan and her Eastland High School Journalism Class who were busy taking notes.

Young Dukakis opened his remarks by commenting on the similiarity between his home state of Massachusetts and Texas in that so many Speakers of the House have come from one or the other state. "Americans today are looking for a president," he said, "and not a zip code."

Encouraging Democratic victory, he said that the next president will certainly inherit the "baggage" of the present administration, but will also have a golden opportunity for improvement.

In response to a question by Mrs. Rattan on his father's foreign policy position, he stated that certainly we're going to have to coexist with the Soviet Union, but we now have a gigantic opportunity, because that nation is reeling on its heels economically.

'My father is an internationaist," he said, "and his links to the powers in Washington are great.'

'Project Graduation' is a chemical-free celebration concept developed by and for high school students in the state of Maine. The project began at one high school in 1980 after having lost seven seniors in alcohol-related fatal crashes the preceeding year. As of the end of 1984 school year, 103 of 130 high schools in Maine held Project Graduation activities. The fact that there were no alcohol related fatal crashes involving students at these schools during the months of May and June for the past three years is testimony enough of the worth of such a

The concept has subsequently spread to other states during the past several years, and as a result of a national conference in Springfield, Ill., in March, 1984, introduced a few representatives from the State of Texas. Even though the time remaining to graduation was short, two high schools initiated projects at the end of the school year. Both were highly successful and received statewide attention

The projects are organized by students, and parents with the support of churches, and the local community. Although the project graduation taking place are designed primarily for the graduating class, the development, organization and participation is not necessarily exclusive of other school students or parents. It would be to the advantage of any underclassman and his parent to help with establishing Project Graduation. After all, the underclassman will eventually become a graduating

Although graduation is yet months away, the parents involved in the organization of Project Graduation feel that a well organized activity takes much planning. Smart parents, they feel, do indeed

think ahead. Because of the great undertaking of Project Graduation and its expense, the project must indeed have the support of the community.
