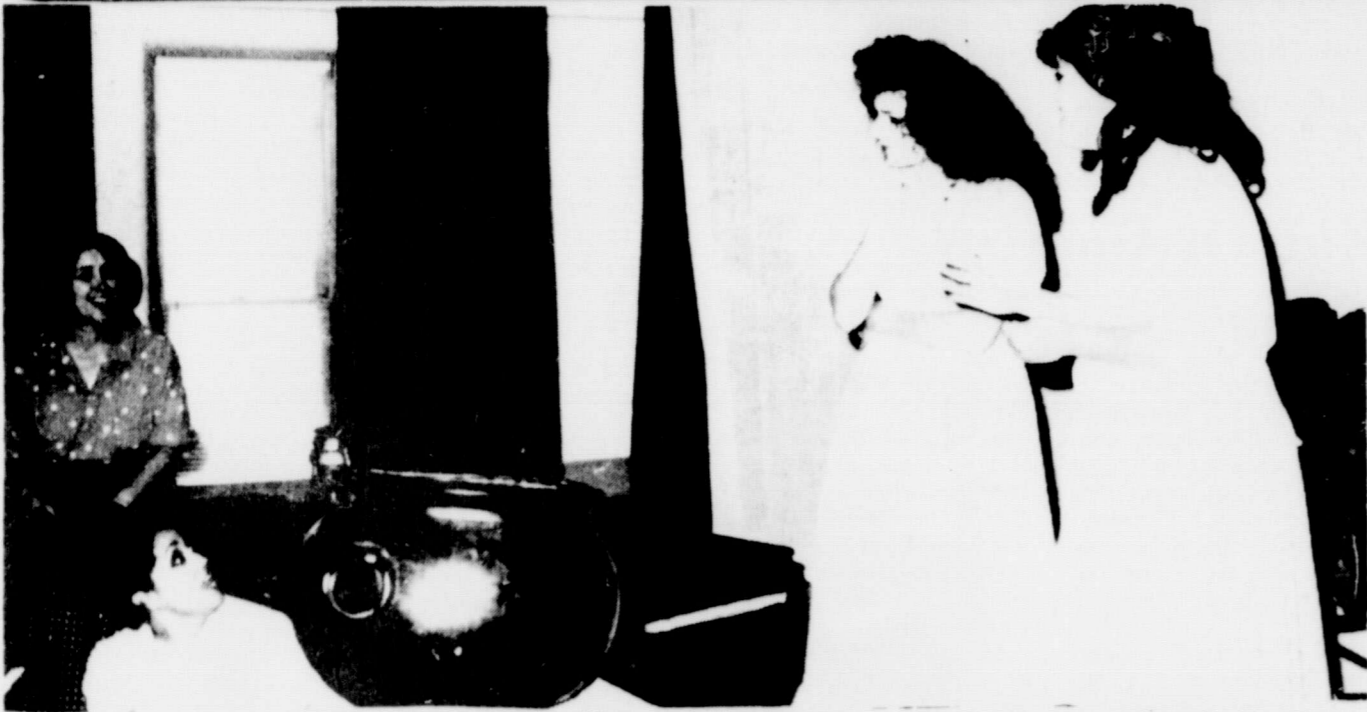

"A woman who would tell her age, will tell anything. That bit of knowledge will never pass my lips," is what Maw Wheeler tells Etta when asked her age, in the Cisco Junior College play, "Going To See The Elephant."

The play opens with Maw Wheeler, played by Jana Spangler, visiting at the homestead of her daughter-in-law, Sara, played by Sandra Mazel, in Eastern Kansas during 1870. Sara is expecting a child and Maw is there to help Sara with the chores.

Maw is a very special woman who dreams of far away places and wants to go

see the elephant, or as she explains to Sarah, go see the other side of the world. She reads about these places in her geography book. Maw also has the healing touch. A young couple, Helene and Frederick Nicols are staying at the Wheeler's place, while Frederick is convalescing from a "sore gut."

Frederick, played by Lonnie Betts, is heard in the play, but never seen. Helene, played by Stefanie Tankersley, is a beautiful young woman, who is ready to get away from the hard and cruel life in the Kansas prairies. Miss Tankersley plays her part extremely well in the play. She can give comical and serious perfor-

mances in the play and make them believable. The part in the play, where Helene is clutching her child's jacket to her bosom and talking, will put a lump in your throat. She also has a hard time getting Maw to call her Mrs. Nichols, and not Mrs. Nicholson.

Etta, played by Cecelia Aragon, is a young girl who is back home after being rescued from the Indians by the Calvary. When she sees Mrs. Nichols for the first time, Etta just stares at her. Helene is different than anyone else Etta has ever seen. Miss Aragon received an excellent acting award for her performance as Etta in "Going To See The Elephant" at the Texas Junior College Theatre Association Festival. When you see the play, you will agree that she deserves this award.

Sara, played by Sandra Mazel, was also the recipient of an excellent acting award for her performance in

"Going To See The Elephant" at the Texas Junior College Theatre Association festival in March. She was also chosen to compete in the Irene Ryan Scholarship Competition in Lubbock in February. Sara plays the part of a woman who hasn't had a new dress in five years, but who has accepted her kind of life.

anything in town, and its too dangerous to burn anything in the rural area because it is too dry.

Connell said the Cisco Volunteer Fire Department

answered 51 calls last month, most of the fires resulting from the dry weather conditions. It is getting dryer around here, he said. He is worried that this

area maybe facing drought conditions this summer. He said the dryer it becomes the more danger there is of grass fires. He said just because the grass is turning green doesn't mean it won't burn. Connell said he would like to stress the point to everyone, not to burn anything.

Connell said the old rural fire truck will not be able to hold up under these dry conditions if the fire department has to keep answering this many calls every month. Connell said the Cisco Volunteer Fire Department is still assisting fire calls for Rising Star. The Rising Star



## County Commissioners Approve Purchase

After considerable discussion Monday the Eastland County Commissioners voted to purchase the Apollo Computer System in the Courthouse for \$27,643.

This System was leased and installed more than three years ago. Harley Gwynn, formerly with Apollo, has been hired by the County for the Software and maintenance of the Computers.

All the Commissioners were present for the meeting: Richard Robinson, Pct. 1, Norman Christian, Pct. 2, L.T. Owen, Pct. 3, and Billy Bacon, Pct. 4. County Judge Scott Bailey presided.

Various other citizens were in the Courtroom, including a representative from Apollo of Odessa and representatives from two other Computer Companies.

Another company sent information on its Systems, offering to work with the county on plans to purchase rather than lease equipment.

It appeared that companies other than Apollo did not give specific bids or firm up details on what their machines could do.

## Kids Of America Competition To Be Held

The Ranger Chamber of Commerce has announced the date of Saturday, April 23, for the upcoming Ranger Kids of America competition to be held at the Ranger Recreation Building (old gym) on the corner of Marston and Main in Ranger.

Babies, ages 0-35 months, may compete in four different areas of competition. Beautiful Baby competition is judged on personality, grooming and alertness. Baby Glamour/Baby Handsome competition is judged on facial appearance only. Playwear competition is judged solely on the garment selection. Photogenic competition is judged from the photograph submitted to the Dallas headquarters and is judged by print and media people.

The Baby Division is divided into three age categories: 0-11 months, 12-35 months, 24-35 months and there is one winner per competition in each age division. Each child is presented on stage by a chaperone of your choosing and will be presented in front of a professional panel of judges.

Beautiful Baby winners will go on to represent this preliminary pageant in the National Finals to take place in Dallas in the summer of '88.

Talent is another phase of

competition that is open to boys and girls between the ages of 3-17 years. Each talent presentation may not be more than three minutes. A top five finalist will be selected from each age category and the winner will advance to the National Finals.

A Beauty competition will be offered for girls only. Beauty is judged on interview (group), casual wear and party wear (short dresses 3-12 years, evening gowns 13-17 years). A top five finalist will be selected from each age category and the winner will advance to the National Finals.

Glamour/Handsome will also be offered and is judged on facial features and overall projection. There will be one winner per age division for glamour and handsome.

The Photogenic competition is for individuals that would like to submit a photograph of their choosing to be judged by major agencies in the print and media area. Age divisions are divided into groups of 3-6 years, 7-9 years, 10-17 years.

advised against the purchase of the Apollo System.

"The decision is up to you, but we have problems," he told the Commissioners. "The Apollo System hasn't worked for my office up to date. The System may be already loaded."

Judge Bailey indicated that his office had also experienced trouble with the present System. Several of the Commissioners also expressed some reservations.

County Clerk JoAnn Johnson, however, reported that the Apollo System was working very well for her, especially since Harley Gwynn had been putting in extensive time on it. Personnel from the County Auditor's office also said that the System was working well for them.

The decision centered around which Computer System would best tie in with State office Systems, and which should cost the least in the long run.

## Cisco Looks Great For 1988

"Cisco, Looking Great For '88" is the theme of the Cisco Chamber of Commerce for 1988, and Don Shepard, CoFC manager, has urged citizens to help make Cisco look great for '88.

The Cisco Folklife Festival, with its many out of town visitors, will be held later this month, and Mr. Shepard urged residents and local businessmen to clean up and fix up. "We want the downtown area to stand out during this time. We encourage businesses downtown to decorate windows or have decorative paintings on windows for the festival."

Shepard said, "The City of Cisco just completed the annual Spring Clean-Up campaign and we are pleased with the cooperation received from the citizens. Now we must clean sidewalks, streets and alleys downtown to prepare for the parade and Folklife Festival."

Cisco, Looking Great For '88!

There was a suggestion that the Commissioners table the decision until they could give the various Systems some study with experts, and think over "What we anticipate doing, what we have and what we want."

They decided, however, that the Apollo System would be less trouble and more economical. The County already owns considerable software that is compatible with this System.

Deciding on maintenance for the 22 County typewriters and business machines proved to be easier than the Computer decision. Two bids were received on this work, and Kirbo Office Machinery and Typewriter Sales Co. was awarded the annual contract. Kirbo's bid was \$2259. Typewriters will be checked as needed, and all the machines will be cleaned, oiled and adjusted each year.

On other matters, Commissioner Billy Bacon reported that 25 inmates were currently in the County Jail, but several were going out today. Eleven of these prisoners were brought in last Friday, Bacon said. The charges included several DWI's.

The Commissioners reported that all load limit signs on certain County bridges were up, with the last State Highway inspection (in Pct. 3) due Monday afternoon. Judge Bailey was requested to draft a letter to the Highway Department informing them that Eastland County was in compliance with their requirements.

The Commissioners requested that some knowledgeable official, hopefully Mr. Carmichael of the U.S. Dept. of Labor, Wage and Hour Division, be asked to meet with them and discuss the use of compensatory time to comply with Federal Wage and Hour laws. Carmichael is an investigator and Compliance officer with an office in Abilene.

The Commissioners meeting ended with an Executive Session. This was called by Attorney Bill Hart, who wished to address the Court on legal matters.

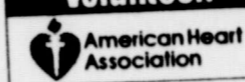

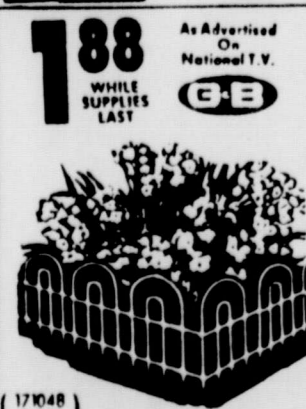

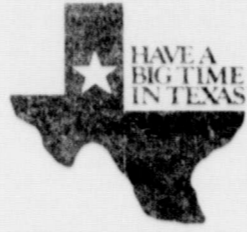

## 87th Infantry Division of WWI And WWII Reunion In Maryland

On September 28 - October 2, 1988, the 87th (Golden Acorn), Infantry Division of World War I and II will hold its 39th annual Reunion in Baltimore, Maryland at the Omni International Hotel.

The 87th Infantry Division was activated and trained as a combat Infantry Division in both World Wars. In 1917, the Division joined General Pershing's A.E.F. in France and as it was being assigned to the Western Front, the Armistice was signed. In World War II, the Division went into action at Metz, France. During 154 days of almost continual combat,

the "Golden Acorn" fought in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, and Germany. It advanced more than 345 miles in European Theater, taking 63,338 prisoners and liberating hundreds of towns. Veterans of the famous "Battle of the Bulge", crossing of the Moselle and Rhine rivers, and the "lightening streak" in pursuit of the Nazis across the heart of Germany, fighting many bitter battles from the once impregnable Siegfried Line to the Czechoslovakia Border.

The combat ability of the 87th Division was held in high regard by General George S. Patton. Com-

## Pond Fish Producing To Be Discussed

Eastland County boasts an abundance of farm ponds but most are producing fish far below their potential. That assessment comes from Crystal Wilbanks, County Extension Agent, with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

"Texas has about one-half million acres of small farm ponds. Stocked with channel or blue catfish, these ponds can produce up to a thousand pounds of fish per acre annually if managed properly," points out Don Steinbach, Fisheries Specialist, Texas Agricultural Extension Service, College Station.

"On the other hand, annual fish production may be only 50 to 75 pounds per acre for unmanaged ponds with fish species such as small sunfish."

Just what does it take to have a productive farm fish pond? "A lot of things come under consideration," says Steinbach. "Anyone putting in a farm fish pond must then be serious about managing it. A good fish producing pond doesn't just happen." Fisheries Specialist Don Steinbach will use electro fishing gear to sample a pond to determine the kind of fish present and what level of management is required to create a good fishery.

A meeting has been scheduled by County Agent

Wilbanks for Thurs., April 21 at Judge Conner's tank, north of Eastland.

The specialist will discuss the following factors in establishing and managing

farm ponds: (1) locating and preparing the pond; (2) stocking the pond; (3) fertilizing the pond; (4) feeding the fish; (5) clearing ponds of rough fish and weeds; (6) fishing and fish shelters.

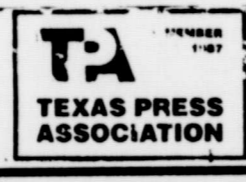

## Range Management Critical After Wildfire

COLLEGE STATION--Ranchers that have seen much of their rangeland engulfed by wildfires in recent weeks need to give particular attention to certain range management practices in the days ahead.

Wildfires have run rampant over an estimated 400,000 acres of western Texas, destroying buildings, pens, equipment and hundreds of animals.

With these losses comes the rebuilding of fences and related properties, and special attention to range management, points out Dr.

Jake Landers, a range specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, who is located at San Angelo.

"The most critical thing is not to put livestock on the burned area too early," says Landers. "The worst damage from a fire comes from too heavy grazing too early."

"How fast burned ranges recover will depend greatly on weather conditions," he notes, "and that will dictate how soon they can be restocked. Grass must be allowed to recover, though,

and a rule of thumb to follow in this regard is 60 to 90 days. However, in a dry year, recovery will take much longer."

Landers points out that range grasses are adapted to fire and will resprout when moisture and temperatures are adequate.

In addition to paying particular attention to grass regrowth, the specialist recommends balancing animal numbers with the amount of pasture burned. If half the pasture is burned, restock when the burned portion has recovered, using only the number of animals that the burned portion can handle. This would be about half the usual amount stock-

ed on the particular pasture. Another option, says Landers, is to fence off the burned portion and to treat the burned and unburned pastures separately.

The specialist also advises ranchers to follow through with a good brush control program. That means controlling prickly pear and tasajillo with picloram, since these normally resprout after a range fire.

"Apply a small amount of picloram in April or May to wipe out prickly pear and tasajillo," recommends Landers. "In studies involving prescribed burns in February, an aerial application of picloram in late April

at 1/8 to 1/4-pound per acre gave a 98 percent control of these two brush species."

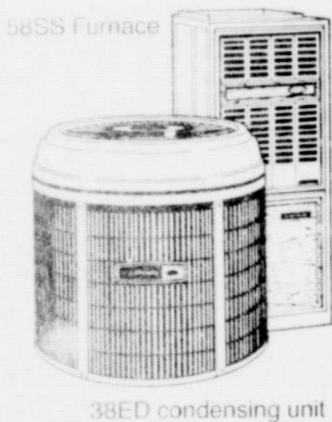

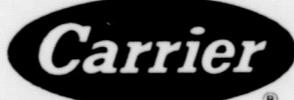

rifle, and a .22 silhouette rifle.

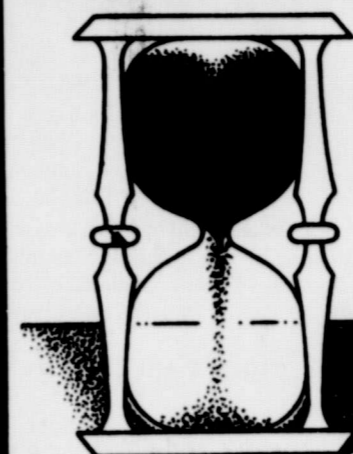
The entry fee for club members will be \$1.00 per match, with the match winner taking all (minus the club's 10 percent of the winnings from each event).
